

SENIOR FOOD DELIVERY PROGRAM

- LBCEI partnered with Organic Harvest Gardens to deliver free boxes of produce to residents' doorsteps, primarily in North, Central and West LB
- Over 1250 boxes of local, farm fresh produce and staples delivered to homebound seniors over an 8week period
- 318 seniors registered for the fresh food delivery, primarily from 90805, 90806 and 90813 zip codes

- 15 laptops and hotspots to nonprofits and small business owners
















SMALL BUSINESS NAVIGATION











 Outreached and supported hundreds of small businesses in North and Central Long Beach to provide info, resources, coaching and marketing support






 Kiva Trustee to provide \$20K in Kiva loans to underrepresented small businesses




PROJECT BUSINESS LIFT - NORTH LONG BEACH









- Over 100 businesses personally visited to build trust and support – "We are Open" banner campaign
- 3 restaurants awarded "Great Plates" contract from the City (out of 15!)







HOUSING SUPPORT SERVICES

- Setup a call center providing free 1-on-1 HUDcertified counseling for Long Beach residents
- English and Spanish
- Help with foreclosure issues, home ownership challenges, etc.

LBCEI WELL POSITIONED TO EXPAND PROGRAMMING

- Building on the initial seed grant from the City to help launch LBCEI, the organization has raised over \$900K in the last 15 months, more than 7x the original \$125K investment from the City.
- LBCEI directed resources and partnered with **more than 30 different community organizations** in North, Central and West Long Beach to help expand impact and build capacity to provide services to the community.
- Able to leverage CARES act funding and combine with other grant and private sponsorship to expand programming in the following areas:
 - Small business support
 - Food security
 - Digital inclusion
 - COVID / Vaccine Outreach




SMALL BUSINESS SUPPORT PROGRAMS



SMALL BUSINESS PROGRAMS

- Business Navigation partnered with Project Business Lift and UCC to provide ongoing support to more than 150 Long Beach businesses
- CEO Forum Small Business Resiliency partnered with LISC-LA and local business experts to providing coaching to low-income local business owners
- GO DIGITAL Small Business Program partnered with Long Beach Economic Partnership, Omniworks, UCC, SBDC and CSULB to provide digital training to 50+ local businesses
- Other Kiva Loans, Health Market Conversions, Procurement





LONG BEACH FOOD SUPPORT NETWORK



FOOD HUB - LONG BEACH FOOD SUPPORT NETWORK

- Partnerships with LA Regional Food Bank and Food Forward supporting more than
 20 local agencies and serving more than
 1,500 households each week in North,
 Central and West Long Beach
- □ 12,000 lbs of dry goods bi-weekly
- □ 10,000 lbs of fresh produce bi-weekly
- Purchased \$20K in Refrigerators and Freezers for food partners
- Directed more than \$100K in resources to Food Partners serving low-income families and residents









FOOD IS MEETING RESIDENTS WHERE THEY ARE

Opportunity to bring additional resources thru trusted partners to those in need:

- COVID resources
- 3,600 COVID resource packs distributed
- Financial Literacy
- Digital resources (laptops, hotspots)
- Community Care packages
- Black Mental Health resources
- Senior resources
- Vaccine resources









LBCEI LESSONS LEARNED

- Partnering with local organizations to support or expand the work they are already doing
- Directing resources to community members through trusted partners and networks
- Providing support networks where needed
- Advocating for increased resources to historically economically underserved communities
- Leading the charge to grow our economy through increasing inclusive economic opportunities for Long Beach
