- Fill out and be sure to sign the library card application.
- Bring the application, the library card, and your child to your local public library.  
Be sure to check the list of library hours included in this packet, and note any new hours at your neighborhood library.
- Select the level of information access that is best for your child by talking to library staff.


The library will activate the card on their new computer system – and it's ready to use. It's that easy.

- Hablar con el personal de la biblioteca para poder elegir el acceso al nivel de información adecuado para su hijo.


La biblioteca activará el carnet en el nuevo sistema computarizado—y dicho carnet estará listo para usar. ¡Es así de fácil!




# EASY WAYS TO GET YOUR KIDS READING AND KEEP THEM READING

1. Get your child a Long Beach Public Library card and visit the Library often.
  2. Have your child join the Summer Reading Club and participate in other Library programs.
  3. Let your child choose which books to check out and read.
  4. Set a good example ~ let your child see you reading.
  5. Enjoy reading time together every day ~ either read to your child, have your child read to you, or just sit together and read or look at your own books.
  6. Keep books handy and read at home, read on the bus, read while waiting at the doctor's office, read everywhere.
  7. Read more than books with your child ~ read bus schedules, cereal boxes, recipes, magazines, newspapers, even signs.

**And remember: Reading is important!



Please telephone in advance to make an appointment. If your group cannot keep an appointment, please call and cancel. Time is reserved for your group. Classes and faculty are welcome to the library for an introductory visit or tour. Listen to stories can be tailored to specific needs. Classes may view films. Programs for visits can be requested to specific needs. Faculty may view films. Materials, receive library skill instruction, and/or check out library resources. Please telephone in advance to request orientation tours or presentations on library resources.

Allow plenty of time for a library visit.

Bring to the library any assignment sheet distributed by the teacher.

Check with the librarians when preparing assignments that will require the use of public library materials. Coordinate assignments with colleagues to stagger the demand for the same library materials by large numbers of students. Allow students flexibility in fulfilling assignments based upon the availability of staff members in fulfilling assignments that the school's planning meetings, or having a staff inviting the local librarian to the school's planning meetings, or having library resources.

## AN INVITATION TO THE COMMUNITY

**HOW TO GET A LIBRARY CARD**  
Library cards are free and easy to obtain. Adults (18 and over) fill out an application form and present personal identification showing their current address. Children and teens must have a youth application signed by a parent/guardian. Preschool children and teens must have a youth application signed by a parent/guardian. Preschool children and teens receive a special library card. Library patrons do not need to live in Long Beach to apply for a library card. The card is valid at all twelve library sites.


