Greetings Honorable Council and Fireworks Committee,

Last year, many people in the "Long Beach Against Illegal Fireworks" Facebook Group posted articles about Pasadena's penalties for fireworks violations. We were, and are, extremely hopeful that Long Beach will finally take the same tough stance and build the same "no tolerance" reputation for fireworks that Pasadena has.

We have a ways to go, as we still need to hear our City Officials come out strongly against the mind-boggling explosions that rock our homes, shorten our pets' lives and terrify our Veterans and children.

If we take nothing else from Pasadena's ordinance, we should at least be impounding the perpetrator's vehicle. It is extremely important. Members of our group suggested impounding vehicles last year, during Zoom-style meetings with Council people and Police personnel. Many of the fireworks exploding across our city have been tossed from car windows. If the perpetrators do not have a car, they can't toss explosives from the car window and speed recklessly from the scene, leaving unattended explosions to cause chaos.

Please consider following Pasadena's lead. Please enforce our existing laws. As I am writing this, a huge boom just set off car alarms. There is no peace, there is no safety in our own homes. In the area I live, "Fireworks Season" is year round.

This worksheet will help all Block Party Applicants/Coordinators ensure a safe and fun block party event for this upcoming 4th of July holiday.

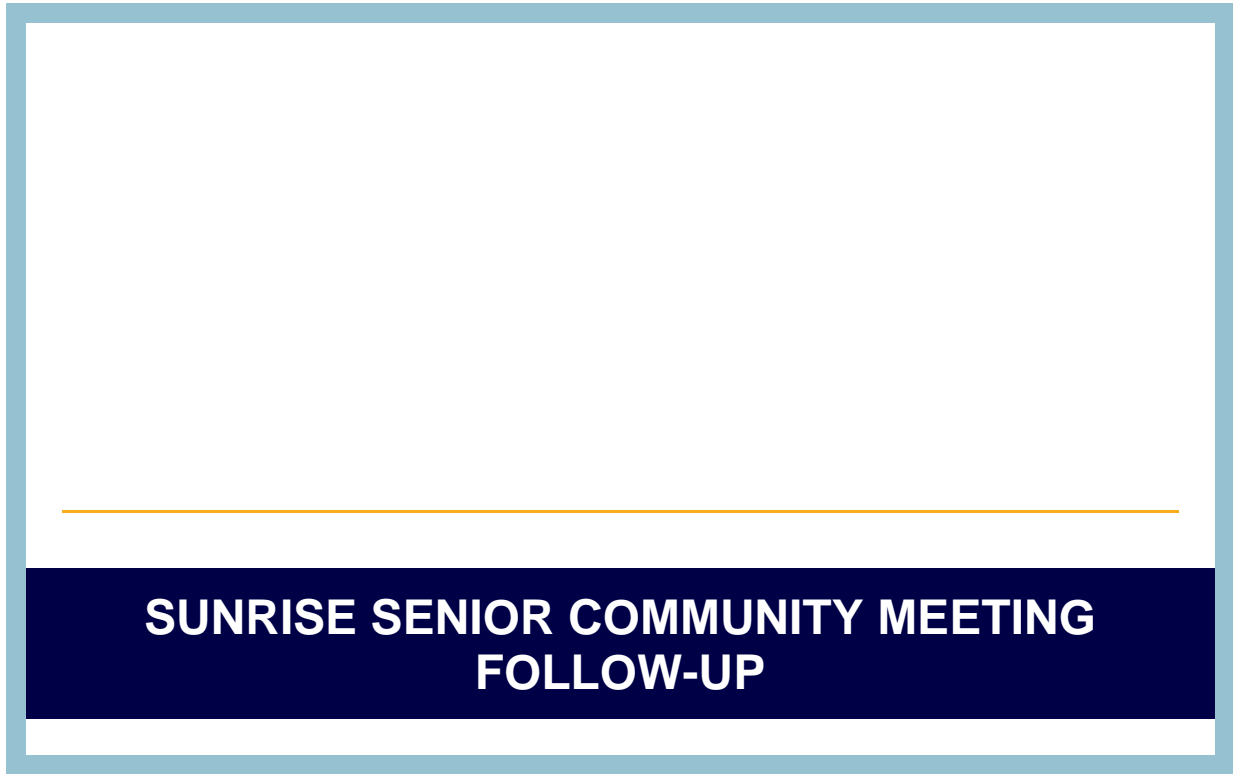
Additionally, much of the community feedback received for this item involved resident concerns that there wasn't enough being done on the enforcement end to deter illegal fireworks use. I completely agree; the amount paid for violations or fines is minimal compared to what violators are willing to pay for these explosive devices. Many of these larger violators firework displays can cost thousands of dollars with the potential to cause millions of dollars in property damage/loss.

More can be done, which is why I'm glad that our Fireworks Committee has worked with our City Attorney's office to present an ordinance at tomorrow's Council Meeting that addresses just that. The emergency ordinance, if passed, will allow our City to hold any real-property holder or individual hosting an illegal fireworks display liable for the cost of all emergency service response by any fire department, law enforcement, and/or code enforcement personnel. 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**PREPARE YOUR PET FOR EMERGENCIES**

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**June is Pet Preparedness Month** and the [Department of Disaster Preparedness and Emergency Communications](#) is encouraging all pet owners to include their furry friends when planning for emergencies!

**How to prepare our pets for an emergency:**

- Keep any and all veterinarian information and vaccination records in a safe place
- Make sure all pets wear collars and tags with up-to-date information
- Microchip pets as a more permanent form of identification
- Bring pets indoors at the first sign or warning of a storm or disaster. Pets can often become disoriented and wander away from home in a crisis

**What to include in your pets' emergency kit:**

- At least seven days of food and water
- Medicines and medical records
- A photo in case of separation
- Any paperwork with registration information or ID numbers
- Sanitation materials
- Pet toys, treats and/or bedding to help reduce stress
- A collar with an ID tag
- A crate or pet carrier
- Store this emergency kit plus leashes as close to an exit as possible and make sure those in the household know where it is

***\*\*\*Remember to replace old food as well as medication, and update photos and emergency contact information annually.\*\*\****

**TIPS ON PREVENTING MOSQUITO-BORNE DISEASE**

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Long Beach Health & Human Services (our [Health Department](#)) is asking residents to help control our mosquito population. Our City Health Officer advises residents to follow mosquito prevention guidelines listed below to help protect themselves and their families.

#### **How can you help?**

- Empty any containers filled with water in and around your home
- Clean and scrub bird baths and pet water bowls at least once a week
- Dump water from potted plant saucers
- Ensure that water-related play areas are properly maintained
- Clean and chlorinate swimming pools and drain water from pool covers
- Limit the watering of lawns and outdoor plants
- Install screens on doors and windows
- Use an EPA-registered insect repellents such as DEET to prevent bites! DEET is safe for children two months and older as well as pregnant and breastfeeding mothers (always use as directed).

  - Open Monday-Friday from 5:00-8:00 PM in [Parking Lot One](#) (corner of Orange & PCH).
  - Serves approximately 300 doses/day and will have Pfizer, Moderna, and Janssen available for first, second, or single dose needs.

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- Vaccines will be available via walk-up or [by appointment](#).

  1. Information on alternative mobile vaccination sites available or
  2. A future appointment.
