AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LONG BEACH AMENDING THE LONG BEACH MUNICIPAL CODE BY ADDING SECTION 16.52.2200 RELATING TO THE NOMINATION OF THE ALAMITOS NEIGHBORHOOD LIBRARY LOCATED AT 1836 EAST THIRD STREET AS A HISTORIC LANDMARK; AND ADOPTING IN SECTIONS 2 AND 3 HEREOF UNCODIFIED FINDINGS AND DETERMINATIONS RELATING TO SAID LANDMARK

The City Council of the City of Long Beach ordains as follows:

Section 1. Section 16.52.2200 is added to the Long Beach Municipal Code to read as follows:

16.52,2200 Alamitos Neighborhood Library.

- Α. Pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 2.63 of the Long Beach Municipal Code and with the recommendation of the Cultural Heritage Commission, the City Council designates the following building as a historic landmark in the City: Alamitos Neighborhood Library, located at 1836 East Third Street.
- B. The complete location, description and reasons for historic landmark designation are more fully contained in uncodified Section 2 of ORD-16-0005 Ordinance No.

(Uncodified) Designation as a Historic Landmark. Section 2. Pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 2.63 of the Long Beach Municipal

Code and upon the recommendation of the Cultural Heritage Commission, the City Council of the City of Long Beach hereby designates the Alamitos Neighborhood Library as a historic landmark based on satisfying significance criteria A and C, as defined in the City's Cultural Heritage Commission Ordinance (Long Beach Municipal Code, Section 2.63.050).

## Α. Location, description and reasons for designation.

The Alamitos Neighborhood Library is located at 1836 East Third Street, in the City of Long Beach, California, and is identified as Los Angeles County Assessor's Parcel Number (APN) 7275-019-900.

The Alamitos Neighborhood Library is a two-story Spanish Colonial Revival style building constructed in 1928. It is the oldest building remaining in the City's library system and illustrates the growth of municipal government and its associated services as Long Beach developed. The Alamitos Neighborhood Library is an excellent example of Spanish Colonial Revival style applied to an institutional building. The building is also significant because it retains its historic purpose as a library building and for its unique neighborhood scale. The Spanish Colonial Revival style is directly tied to the architecture's attempt to embrace and promote the California environment and lifestyle during the 1920s. As remarkable examples of the Spanish Colonial Revival style, notable features of the building include wrought iron railings and window grates, courtyard with tile fountain, and terra cotta tile. Character-defining features of the building include the asymmetrical primary elevation, smooth stucco exterior walls, gabled roof, exposed rafter tails, decorative wrought iron window grates and brackets beneath the eaves, wood paneled main entrance doors with wide surround. terra cotta tile, multi-light fixed and casement metal windows (some with decorative surrounds), wrought iron balconette railing and decorative detailing, punched concrete vents, blade sign with wrought iron decoration,

tile fountain, and courtyard wall with arched doorway and paneled door.

#### B. Rationale for historic landmark designation.

The City Council finds that relative to the designation of the Alamitos Neighborhood Library as a historic landmark, the following criteria are manifested as set forth in the Long Beach Municipal Code Section 2.63.050 based upon the following:

- Α. It is associated with events that have made a significant contribution to the broad patterns of the City's history.
- C. It embodies the distinctive characteristics of a type. period or method of construction, or it represents the work of a master, or it possesses high artistic values.

### C. General guidelines and standards for any changes.

Any maintenance, repair, stabilization, rehabilitation, restoration, preservation, conservation, or reconstruction work proposed for the building shall be conducted in a manner consistent with the "Secretary of the Interior's Standards for the Treatment of Historic Properties with Guidelines for Preserving, Rehabilitating, Restoring, and Reconstructing Historic Buildings" (1995), by Weeks and Grimmer, as amended, as well as the "Procedures for Certificate of Appropriateness" (the "Standards") found in Section 2.63.080 of the Long Beach Municipal Code.

The Standards are incorporated herein by this reference and shall be used as the authoritative guidelines for reviewing and approving any proposed exterior work on the building.

The provisions of this ordinance shall regulate the building's exterior walls and other external features. There shall be no restrictions on the building's interior.

Original historic fabric on the exterior of the building shall be executed in a manner that does not materially impair in an adverse manner

No exterior changes to the building shall be allowed unless an approved Certificate of Appropriateness has been applied for by an applicant and is issued by the City authorizing such environmental change.

Section 3. (Uncodified) The City Clerk shall cause this ordinance to be recorded in accordance with the provisions of Section 5029 of the California Public Resources Code and Section 27288.2 of the California Government Code.

Section 4. The City Clerk shall certify to the passage of this ordinance by the City Council and cause it to be posted in three (3) conspicuous places in the City of Long Beach, and it shall take effect on the thirty-first (31st) day after it is approved by the Mayor.
