3 A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE  
4 CITY OF LONG BEACH RECOMMENDING TO THE  
5 INTERMODAL CONTAINER TRANSFER FACILITY JOINT  
6 POWERS AUTHORITY THAT IT INCLUDE A ZERO  
7 EMISSIONS GOODS MOVEMENT SYSTEM OPTION IN  
8 THE ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT REPORT FOR THE  
9 PROPOSED ICTF MODERNIZATION AND EXPANSION  
10 PROJECT

12 WHEREAS, the Cities of Long Beach and Los Angeles, acting by and  
13 through their respective Harbor Department Boards of Harbor Commissioners, created  
14 the Intermodal Container Transfer Facility Joint Powers Authority (ICTF JPA) to acquire,  
15 construct, reconstruct, rehabilitate and maintain an intermodal container transfer facility  
16 (ICTF); and

17 WHEREAS, the Union Pacific Railroad Company currently operates the  
18 ICTF and has submitted an application to the ICTF JPA for the ICTF Modernization and  
19 Expansion Project; and

20 WHEREAS, the ICTF JPA determined that an environmental impact report  
21 (EIR) is required in connection with the ICTF Modernization and Expansion Project; and

22 WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Long Beach believes that the  
23 proximity of the ICTF to residences and schools in the City of Long Beach negatively  
24 impacts the quality of life in West Long Beach; and

25 WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Long Beach seeks to encourage  
26 "green growth" which would allow the efficient movement of goods through the City of  
27 Long Beach without adversely affecting the health and well-being of Long Beach

1 WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Long Beach believes that a zero  
2 emission goods movement system should be studied as an option in the EIR for the ICTF  
3 Modernization and Expansion Project as a way to reduce negative impacts on Long  
4 Beach and Long Beach residents from ICTF operations;

5 NOW, THEREFORE, the City Council of the City of Long Beach resolves as  
6 follows:

7 Section 1. The above recitals are true and correct.

8 Section 2. The City Council of the City of Long Beach hereby recommends  
9 to the ICTF JPA that it include a zero emissions goods movement system option in the  
10 environmental impact report for the ICTF Modernization and Expansion Project.

11 Section 3. This resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption by  
12 the City Council, and the City Clerk shall certify to the vote adopting this resolution.
