Subject:

Authorize the General Manager to execute an Agreement with Los Angeles Department of Water and Power (LADWP) to evaluate the feasibility of accommodating process waste water from LADWP's Haynes Generating Station in Long Beach into local and/or county sewer facilities and Long Beach Water Department's (LBWD) ability to provide Haynes Generating Station with future required water demand, in the amount not-to-exceed \$250,000 for the full term of the Agreement.

Executive Summary:


On September 12, 2019, a letter from LADWP was received by LBWD, detailing their requirements for sending industrial process waste water from Haynes Generating Station to public facilities in alignment with new regulations from the Mayor of City of Los Angeles and the State Water Resources Control Board, and their need for additional water to meet an increased demand. LADWP requested LBWD to conduct a feasibility study to assess the options for additional sources of potable and/or recycled water for their increased demand, and new discharge points for future process waste water flows. For this project, LBWD will enter into an Agreement with LADWP to hire an engineering consultant to evaluate possible improvements to LBWD's potable water, recycled water, and sanitary sewer systems.

The not-to-exceed fee total for these services is \$250,000 for the full term of the Agreement, where the full term will be effective through 2024, and will include the option to amend the amount of this Agreement for additional funds upon Board approval.


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Fiscal Impact: None, LADWP will pay for this feasibility study.
