A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LONG BEACH IN SUPPORT OF HEALTHY SCHOOL ZONES IN THE CITY OF LONG BEACH

WHEREAS, in the fall of 2009, student leaders and staff with Californians for Justice in Long Beach formed a campaign committee to develop a new campaign focused on healthy school issues; and

WHEREAS, close to 200 detailed surveys from fellow students and community members were used to determine issues for the campaign; and

WHEREAS, in May of 2010 the "Food for Thought" campaign was launched and focuses on three fundamental health-related issues in Long Beach public schools in order to ensure that all students can thrive, attend school healthy and ready to learn, and graduate prepared for college, careers, and community participation:

- Healthy Bodies: including access to healthy and nutritious foods in Long Beach schools and low income neighborhoods.
- 2. Healthy, Green Environments: including access to good air quality and clean and safe places for learning and recreation in Long Beach schools and low income neighborhoods.
- Healthy Minds: including positive race relations, self-identity, diversity awareness, and emotional and social supports in Long Beach schools and communities; and

WHEREAS, the City of Long Beach City Council supports and encourages healthy living and lifestyles in the community though programs such as: the Bicycle Master Plan, Tobacco Free Long Beach, Childhood Obesity Prevention and the Healthy Neighborhood Market Conversion Program;

NOW, THEREFORE, the City Council of the City of Long Beach resolves as

The City of Long Beach will continue to work with student leaders, residents, and community groups to support the creation of community gardens The City of Long Beach will work with student leaders. residents and community groups to promote "Healthy School Zones" by encouraging businesses located within five blocks of schools to participate in the Neighborhood Market Conversion Program and to provide healthy, high-nutrient food and beverage This resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption by the City Council, and the City Clerk shall certify the vote adopting this resolution.
