AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LONG BEACH AMENDING THE LONG BEACH MUNICIPAL CODE BY AMENDING SECTION 2.33.020 RELATING TO THE CITIZENS' ADVISORY COMMISSION ON DISABILITIES

The City Council of the City of Long Beach ordains as follows:

Section 1. Section 2.33.020 of the Long Beach Municipal Code is amended to read as follows:

2.33.020 Members.

The Citizens' Advisory Commission on Disabilities shall consist of nine (9) members. Six (6) of the members shall be citizens from the City, and the remaining three (3) members shall be representatives from public and private agencies which provide services to disabled citizens in the City. As used in this Chapter, the term disabled person means a person having a physical or mental impairment which substantially limits such person from functioning in one major life activity or more, or a person who has a record of such impairment or who is regarded as having such an impairment. As used in this Chapter, major life activity means any mental or physical function or activity which, if impaired, creates a substantial barrier to employment, housing, recreation, transportation, health service, or other life activity as identified by the Commission.

Section 2. The City Clerk shall certify to the passage of this ordinance by the City Council and cause it to be posted in three (3) conspicuous places in the City of

Long Beach, and it shall take effect on the thirty-first (31st) day after it is approved by the Mayor. Nine-Six (6) of the members shall be citizens from the City, and the remaining six—three (3) members shall be representatives from public and private agencies which provide services to disabled citizens in the City. As used in this Chapter, the term disabled person means a person having a physical or mental impairment which substantially limits such person from functioning in one major life activity or more, or a person who has a record of such impairment or who is regarded as having such an impairment. As used in this Chapter, major life activity means any mental or physical function or activity which, if impaired, creates a substantial barrier to employment, housing, recreation, transportation, health service, or other life activity as identified by the Commission.
