RECOMMENDATION:

Adopt the attached resolution making certain findings regarding the construction of certain public improvements with Central Long Beach Redevelopment Project Area Funds;

Adopt the attached resolution making certain findings regarding the construction of certain public improvements with Downtown Long Beach Redevelopment Project Area Funds; and

Adopt the attached resolution making certain findings regarding the construction of certain public improvements with North Long Beach Redevelopment Project Area Funds. (Districts 1, 2, 4, 6, and 8)

DISCUSSION

Improving and enhancing public infrastructure has always been an important goal of the Long Beach Redevelopment Agency (Agency), particularly when those public improvements support private economic investment, result in increased job generation, or support the aesthetic enhancement of a specific area. On November 2, 2009, the Agency adopted resolutions making findings regarding the construction of various public improvements in all the redevelopment project areas, including park expansion, streetscape improvements, and public art. To continue these enhancements, the Agency has identified the following important public projects planned in the Central, Downtown, and North Long Beach Redevelopment Project Areas:

Central Long Beach Redevelopment Project Area

- Ocean Boulevard Median Lighting.
- Pine Avenue Streetscape Improvement.
- The Design District Streetscape Improvements.
- Sunrise Historic District Improvements.
- 7th and Alamitos Improvements.
- Alamitos Avenue.

Downtown Long Beach Redevelopment Project Area

- Ocean Boulevard Median Lighting.
- Pine Avenue Streetscape Improvement.
- CityPlace Parking Garage Improvements and Upgrades.
- American Hotel Sidewalk Repairs.

North Long Beach Redevelopment Project Area

- South Waterfront Bike Path.
- Orange Twist Landscaping.
- Del Amo Railroad Embankment.

These improvements will further serve to support neighborhood and economic revitalization by eliminating blight, supporting private economic investment, enhancing the pedestrian environment, linking existing commercial corridors, and closing a vital gap in the City of Long Beach's bikeway system.

California Redevelopment Law provides that a Redevelopment Agency may, with the consent of the City Council, pay for public improvements, which are publicly owned either within or outside of a Redevelopment Project Area, if the City Council determines all of the following:

- That the construction of such public improvements is of benefit to the redevelopment project area or the immediate neighborhood in which the public improvement project is located.
- That no other reasonable means of financing the public improvements are available to the community.
- That the payment of Redevelopment Agency funds for the construction of the public improvements will assist in the elimination of one or more blighting conditions within the project area.

Resolutions making the necessary findings regarding the construction of these public improvements with redevelopment funds from the Central, Downtown, and North Long Beach Redevelopment Project Areas are attached.

This letter was reviewed by Chief Assistant City Attorney Heather A. Mahood on October 20, 2009 and by Budget and Performance Management Bureau Manager David Wodynski on October 22, 2009.

TIMING CONSIDERATIONS

City Council action is requested on November 10, 2009 in order to facilitate the design and construction of improvements.


FISCAL IMPACT

3 A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE
4 CITY OF LONG BEACH MAKING CERTAIN FINDINGS
5 REGARDING THE CONSTRUCTION OF CERTAIN PUBLIC
6 IMPROVEMENTS WITH NORTH REDEVELOPMENT
7 FUNDS (NORTH IMPROVEMENTS)

9 WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Long Beach adopted and
10 approved a certain Redevelopment Plan (the "Redevelopment Plan") for the North Long
11 Beach Redevelopment Project Area (the "Project"); and

12 WHEREAS, in furtherance of the Project and the immediate neighborhood
13 in which the Project is located, the Redevelopment Agency of the City of Long Beach,
14 California (the "Agency"), has recognized the need for certain public improvements,
15 which improvements will be located within or adjacent to the boundaries of the Project,
16 and proposes to use redevelopment funds to finance the improvements; and

17 WHEREAS, Section 33445 of the California Community Redevelopment
18 Law (Health and Safety Code Section 33000 et seq.) requires the Agency to make
19 certain findings prior to the acquisition of land and construction of public improvements or
20 facilities thereon; and

21 WHEREAS, Section 33678 of the Community Redevelopment Law provides
22 that under certain conditions tax increment funds shall not be subject to the
23 appropriations limitation of Article XIII B of the California Constitution;

24 NOW, THEREFORE, the City Council of the City of Long Beach resolves as
25 follows:

26 Section 1. The City Council determines that the construction of public
27 improvements, more particularly described in Exhibit "A", are of benefit to the Project and
28 the immediate neighborhood in which the Project is located. This finding is supported by

1 the following facts:

2 The proposed improvements will facilitate the removal of blight by
3 improving pedestrian and bicycle access to the Project Area, and promoting
4 business development by enhancing landscaping, lighting and public art.

5 Section 2. The City Council determines that no other reasonable means
6 of financing the above-described improvements are available to the community. This
7 finding is supported by the following facts:

8 Before the passage of Proposition 13, most of the City's general
9 operating and capital improvements were funded through property taxes.
10 However, the initiative placed severe constraints on the City's ability to
11 use property tax revenues to offset increases in operating and capital
12 costs. It has also been difficult for the City, by itself, to provide sufficient
13 funds to support the construction of major public improvements. In fiscal
14 year 2009-2010, the limited resources of the City's General Fund are
15 committed to previously incurred obligations and planned projects.

16 Section 3. The City Council further determines that the payment of funds
17 for the construction of the public improvements will assist in the elimination of one or
18 more blighting conditions within the Project, and is consistent with the implementation
19 plan adopted pursuant to Health and Safety Code Section 33490.

20 Section 4. This resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption
21 by the City Council, and the City Clerk shall certify to the vote adopting this resolution.

EXHIBIT "A"

DESCRIPTION OF THE PUBLIC IMPROVEMENTS

South Waterfront Bicycle Path

Construction of a Class I bicycle path segment, including mid-block crossings and wayfinding signs. The improvements commence at the north end of Queensway Bridge at the existing terminus of the Class I bicycle path. The improvements will follow Queensway Drive to the Special Events Park existing Class I bicycle path.

Orange Twist Landscaping Improvements

Improvement of medians on Atlantic Avenue between East 45th Street and Del Amo Boulevard, including landscaping, lighting and similar improvements.

Del Amo Railroad Embankment Improvement

Improvements to railroad embankment adjacent to Del Amo Boulevard and Atlantic Avenue including landscaping and similar improvements.
