Pension Reform

In 2008 Orange County (OCERS) passed Measure J, which modified the Charter to require voter approval for increases in retirement benefits for County employees and officials. Additionally, prior to placement on the ballot of a proposed benefit increase, the retirement system must prepare an actuarial study on the cost of the proposed retirement benefit change.

The City of San Diego (SDCERS) passed Prop B in 2006, which requires an actuarial study before placement on the ballot and a majority vote of the people for any benefit increases.

In the City and County of San Francisco (SFERS) a system was implemented in the mid '90s in which benefit increases must be approved by a majority vote.

Accordingly, in response to the City of Long Beach's current unsustainable pension system, it is imperative to give the citizens of Long Beach more control over any proposed future pension changes. Additionally, an effort should be made to minimize "pension spiking". Following are two recommendations:

- 1. Any future increases in Pension Benefits require a vote of the people.
- 2. Pensions will be based on an average of the last 3 years of employment

Attached is a list of retirees currently receiving over \$100,000 annually in pension benefits. As you can see, 154 employees generate a cost of over \$18,000,000 annually.
