SUBJECT: Traffic Signal Maintenance Agreement With the City of Hawaiian Gardens

### **DISCUSSION**

In March 1999, City Council authorized the City Manager to provide traffic signal maintenance services to the City of Hawaiian Gardens on an emergency interim basis when the contractor providing those services to Hawaiian Gardens went out of business (see attached). This relationship still continues, but now the City of Long Beach and the City of Hawaiian Gardens would like to enter into a formal agreement for these services. The intersections covered by the agreement are as follows:

Under the agreement, the City shall perform routine and extraordinary maintenance on traffic signals and safety lighting at the locations listed above. The City will perform these services in accordance with the same standards and practices the City uses to maintain its own traffic signals and safety lighting. Upon request, the City may also

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provide additional traffic engineering services at an amount that would be determined and agreed upon if the services are requested.

The agreement is beneficial to the City of Long Beach by giving the City greater control over a very congested transportation corridor (Carson Street) through the City of Long Beach. Long Beach's high level of service to Hawaiian Gardens ensures optimum traffic flow along this corridor.

This letter was reviewed by Senior Deputy City Attorney Donna F. Gwin on November 18, 2004 and Budget Management Officer David Wodynski on November 19, 2004.

### TIMING CONSIDERATIONS

City Council action on this matter is not time critical.

## FISCAL IMPACT

Based on past history, this contracting-in opportunity will generate revenue to the City of approximately \$10,000 per year and is budgeted in the General Fund (GP) in the Department of Public Works (PW). Given that the cost of services provided will be reimbursed on a time and materials basis, revenue may exceed current projections.

#### IT IS RECOMMENDED THAT THE CITY COUNCIL:

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Authorize the City Manager to execute an agreement with the City of Hawaiian Gardens for the City of Long Beach to provide traffic signal maintenance services to the City of Hawaiian Gardens for a period of three years, with an option to extend the agreement for an additional three years.
