RECOMMENDATION:

Adopt the attached resolution authorizing the City Manager or his designee to apply for a CalRecycle grant from the Department of Resources, Recycling and Recovery in the amount of \$250,000, for the use of Rubberized Asphalt Concrete. (Citywide)

DISCUSSION

The Department of Resources, Recycling and Recovery (CalRecycle), offers the Rubberized Asphalt Concrete Grant Program to promote the use of rubberized pavement products derived from recycled California generated waste tires. Under the grant program, cities are eligible for reimbursement of the cost differential between conventional asphalt and asphalt made with recycled rubber tires. Maximum grant amount is \$250,000 and would apply to eligible repaving projects initiated after grant notification (estimated to be May 2011), and completed by April 2013. The City already uses rubberized asphalt on most of its street resurfacing projects, and this grant program will offer an opportunity for reimbursement for a portion of the project costs on these projects. The grant application requires the adoption of the attached resolution, which must be submitted to CalRecycle by March 18, 2011.

This matter was reviewed by Deputy City Attorney Linda Trang on February 18, 2011 and by Budget Management Officer Victoria Bell on February 23, 2011.

SUSTAINABILITY

Using rubberized asphalt on street resurfacing projects diverts from landfills up to three tires per ton of asphalt used. With typical projects placing hundreds of tons of asphalt, the number of tires that get diverted and re-used can be significant.

TIMING CONSIDERATIONS

City Council action on this matter is requested on March 15, 2011 to insure that the City meets the grant application deadline of March 18th.


FISCAL IMPACT

Should the grant application be successful, the City could be reimbursed up to \$250,000 in costs associated with the use of rubberized asphalt pavement on its resurfacing projects. The grant application does not have any local job impacts.

4 CITY OF LONG BEACH AUTHORIZING THE CITY
5 MANAGER OR HIS DESIGNEE TO SUBMIT AN
6 APPLICATION TO CALRECYCLE (FORMERLY, "THE
7 CALIFORNIA INTEGRATED WASTE MANAGEMENT
8 BOARD") FOR A RUBBERIZED ASPHALT CONCRETE
9 GRANT AND TO EXECUTE ALL DOCUMENTS
10 NECESSARY TO ACCEPT FUNDS AND IMPLEMENT THE
11 PROGRAM

13 WHEREAS, Public Resources Code sections 40000 et seq. authorize the
14 Department of Resources, Recycling and Recovery ("CalRecycle"), formerly known as
15 the California Integrated Waste Management Board, to administer various grant
16 programs ("Grants") in furtherance of the State of California's ("State") efforts to reduce,
17 recycle and reuse solid waste generated in the State thereby preserving landfill capacity
18 and protecting public health and safety and the environment; and

19 WHEREAS, CalRecycle offers the Rubberized Asphalt Concrete Grant
20 Program to promote the use of rubberized pavement products derived from recycled
21 California generated waste tires; and

22 WHEREAS, the City of Long Beach desires to participate in said Program
23 by applying for any grant for which it is eligible, to supplement its existing waste cleanup
24 efforts; and

25 WHEREAS, in furtherance of this authority CalRecycle is required to
26 establish procedures governing the application, awarding and management of the
27 Grants; and

28 WHEREAS, CalRecycle grant application procedures require, among other

1 things, an applicant's governing body to declare by resolution certain authorizations
2 related to the administration of CalRecycle grants;

3 NOW, THEREFORE, the City Council of the City of Long Beach resolves as
4 follows:

5 Section 1. That the City Manager of the City of Long Beach or his
6 designee is hereby authorized to submit application(s) to CalRecycle for all available
7 grants for which the City of Long Beach is eligible.

8 Section 2. The City Manager or his designee is further authorized to
9 execute all grant documents, including but not limited to, applications, agreements,
10 amendments, requests for payment, and other documents which may be necessary to
11 secure grant funds and implement the approved grant project.

12 Section 3. These authorizations are effective for five (5) years from the
13 date of adoption of this Resolution.

14 Section 4. This Resolution shall take effect immediately on its adoption
15 by the City Council, and the City Clerk shall certify the vote adopting this Resolution.
