- (*Whereas*, February has been declared Black History Month and is a time to reflect on and celebrate the contributions of African Americans in every field, from science and the arts to politics and religion; and
- **Whereas**, Black History Month not only offers black Americans an occasion to explore their heritage, but it also offers all Americans an occasion and opportunity to gain a fuller perspective of the contributions of black Americans to our nation; and
