A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LONG BEACH SUPPORTING THE CONVENTION ON THE ELIMINATION OF ALL FORMS OF DISCRIMINATION AGAINST WOMEN (CEDAW)

WHEREAS, the Convention on the Elimination of All Forms of
Discrimination Against Women ("CEDAW"), a human rights treaty promoting gender
equity, was adopted by the United Nations General Assembly in 1979; and

WHEREAS, CEDAW defines what constitutes discrimination against women and sets up an agenda for national action to end such discrimination; and

WHEREAS, CEDAW requires member parties to undertake to eliminate discrimination against women in all its forms, including but not limited to the areas of economic development, health and safety, and education; and

WHEREAS, 187 countries out of 193 United Nation member states have ratified CEDAW, including Canada, Australia, Bangladesh, Mexico, China, and the United Kingdom; and

WHEREAS, the United States Foreign Relations Committee voted in July 2002 to recommend ratification of CEDAW, but it has never come before the full Senate for a vote; and

WHEREAS, the United States Census indicates a persistent wage gap between men and women, and a perpetual difference not only between the wages women are paid compared to those of men, but also the wages that women of different races are paid compared to their male counterparts; and

WHEREAS, a number of cities in the United States have adopted local legislation reflecting CEDAW principals to better inform local policy and empower
