AGENDA ITEM: Zone Change in PD-25 Amendment for a Crematorium

#### **DISCUSSION**

The Atlantic Avenue Planned Development District (PD-25) is located adjacent to Atlantic Avenue from Pacific Coast Highway on the South to Willow Street on the North. Mortuaries and accessory uses, such as crematoriums, are prohibited within the boundaries of PD-25, although one mortuary currently does exist with PD-25 as a "legal non-conforming use".

It is requested that the Planning Commission undertake a study to determine whether it would be appropriate to amend the current Zoning Regulations in order to permit or conditionally permit crematoriums as accessory uses within the PD-25 Zoning District.

#### RECOMMENDATION

Recommendation: To request the Planning Commission to undertake a study relating to a potential Zone Change in PD-25 (Atlantic Avenue Planned Development District) in order to facilitate the establishment of crematoriums as a permitted, conditional, or accessory use in that Zone.

Faith Chapel Mortuary 1870 Atlantic Ave. Long Beach CA 90806

Scope of Work proposed: Add a furnace for the purpose of human cremations at the existing Faith Chapel Mortuary. Furnace is to be housed in an new 23-25 x 24'-4" space at the rear of the existing building.

#### **FURNACE**

Model SQC-300 Cremator

- -22'-10" high stack
- -5'- 4" wide x 13'- 2" long x 6'-7" high
- -No odor—machine runs at 1600 degrees there is no odor at 700 degrees. Odor is incinerated.
- -Noise level-40 decibels, street noise 45 decibels. Freeway noise is 60-65 decibels. Street 50 decibels
- -No visible smoke—you see heat waves. Opacity- 3min. of 10% for every hour.
- -There will be a camera mounted to exterior of new addition to monitor the stack.
- -New Design, high efficiency model. It's been certified by 10 labs as 99% efficient. 2 have been installed in southern CA—2 in Pico Rivera.
