At your request, we have applied certain agreed-upon procedures to records relating to the City's estimated cost of providing security guard services at Health and Human Services' and Community Development's facilities as detailed in Bid Specification PA-02805. The City currently contracts with Contact Security Inc., for the above services under contract number 27524, which expires on November 30, 2005.

The purpose of applying the agreed-upon procedures was to verify the City's estimated cost of providing the service and compare it to the cost of having a private contractor perform the work in accordance with City Charter Section 1806 – Contracts for Work Usually Performed By City Employees. Section 1806 requires a finding that the work or services contracted for can be performed by a private contractor at an estimated lower cost to the City than if said work or services were performed by City employees.

#### Agreed-upon procedures included:

- Reading the bid specifications for security guard services;
- Obtaining and analyzing the Departments' cost estimates for providing security guard services;
- Determining and evaluating the basis of estimated City costs through discussion with Department staff;
- Tracing and agreeing costs to source budget reports and documents and;
- Adjusting the Departments' cost estimates to eliminate unavoidable costs.

Based on the procedures performed, the City's estimated annual cost of providing security guard services is \$1,279,324. The cost for a private contractor based on the terms of the contract would be \$518,366. Therefore, the City's net

annual cost savings from using a private contractor would be \$760,960 approximately 59% of City cost summarized as follows:

Unavoidable costs are excluded from City costs for purpose of estimating any potential savings from contracting out City services.

- (2) Estimated fleet operating costs. City Fleet Services Bureau supplied vehicle operating costs based on an average annual cost for two police solid sedans. Costs include fuel, repairs and maintenance, and budgeted Fleet Services capital recovery charges for the eventual replacement of vehicles once they have reached their useful life.
- (3) Materials & Supplies. This category includes the estimated cost of uniforms, radios, materials and supplies at \$1,472 per employee.
- (4) Materials & Supplies (Armed Guards). This category includes the estimated cost of armed security guards gun, holster, ammunition, vest, uniforms, radios, materials and supplies at \$2,601 per employee.
- (5) Supervisory Security Officer. Security officer supervision is provided by the contractor. City supervision costs are allocated to each group based on the percentage of FTEs required at each group to total FTEs required.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LONG BEACH MAKING FINDINGS REGARDING A CONTRACT FOR WORK USUALLY PERFORMED BY CITY EMPLOYEES AND AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO EXECUTE THE CONTRACT WITH CONTACT SECURITY, INC. FOR SECURITY GUARDS AT VARIOUS LOCATIONS

WHEREAS, the City of Long Beach owns and operates several buildings and facilities within the City including ones used by the Departments of Public Works, Health and Human Services and Community Development ("City Sites") which require security guards; and

WHEREAS, to obtain cost savings, the City desires to contract of the services of security guards if those services can be performed by a private contractor as efficiently, effectively and at an estimated lower cost to the City than if the services were performed by City employees; and

WHEREAS, the City Manager advertised for bids, and bids were received and analyzed and Contact Security, Inc. is the lowest responsible bidder for these services with a bid of \$869,125.00; and

WHEREAS, the City Auditor has calculated the annual cost of the services using City employees, the annual cost if the services are performed by Contact Security, Inc., and the annual cost savings; and

WHEREAS, based on this procedure and analysis, the City Council desires to make findings regarding a contract with Contact Security, Inc. and desires to authorize a contract with that bidder:

	cause it to be posted in three conspicuous places in the City of Long Beach, and it shall
	take effect on the thirty-first day after it is approved by the Mayor.
