# **HUD-CPD Federal Funding Programs**

#### **CDBG**

 The CDBG program supports the development of viable urban communities by encouraging a suitable living environment, and expanding economic opportunities, principally for lower-income households.

#### HOME

• The HOME program provides financial assistance to help increase the supply of affordable housing for low-income households.

#### **ESG**

 The ESG program provides matching grants to help pay for shelter operating expenses and for other essential services to the homeless.

# 2018 - 2023 City Council and HUD-Approved Five-Year Consolidated Plan (CP)

- The Consolidated Plan is the official application for CPD grants required by HUD.
- Five-Year Plan that includes the following components:
  - 1. An assessment of housing and community development needs and market conditions;
  - 2. A strategy that establishes priorities for addressing the identified needs;
  - 3. Creates a five year strategy for the use of federal funds to address identified needs

# City Council Recommended Action
