

- Whereas, he successfully ran for the 4th District Council seat in 2000 and during the past four years he served his community by being involved in the effort to save Long Beach Community Hospital and successfully brought a Business Licensing Amnesty Program to the City Council and he helped to launch Operation Clean Streets in the 4th District, bringing together a multi-tiered assault on crime, building and health code violations; and
