Our Parks, Recreation, Marine, and Animal Care Services team is bracing itself for the onset of summer. Everything citywide picks up

the pace of activity as school is out and our parks and beaches become 'heavily loved" by residents and visitors alike. Our website showcases the schedules of movies and concerts in the parks that most assuredly will attract lots of people to these quality events. June provides many other great community events across Long Beach as we celebrate Pride Month, Father's Day, Juneteenth, the ribbon cutting of our new Jr. Lifeguard Station and summer camp fun galore!

This month our Department launched the Park Ambassador program to enhance the cleanliness of park facilities and improve the visitor experience at City parks. A supervised team of ten Ambassadors will support over 35 parks that have a total of 55 free standing

restrooms, as well as several mini parks that have gates that need to be locked at the 10 p.m. park closing time. The added staffing will allow

restroom cleaning frequencies of up to six times a day and ensure that they are being used for their intended purpose. Additionally, staff will support the Community Center floor care program, power washing, and miscellaneous maintenance needs. From addressing vandalism to providing a reassuring presence in the parks, this new staffing model will greatly enhance the park visitor experience.



The Long Beach City Council approved a resolution to support the Rivers and Mountains Conservancy's proposed Lower San Gabriel River Recreation and Park District. Similar to the City's supportive resolution to join in the formation of the Lower Los Angeles River Recreation and Park District last year, the recent action by City Council will position Long Beach in an important leadership role and collaborative partnership with upriver cities to better plan, design, develop and maintain these critical river corridors as valuable regional assets with tremendous recreational potential.

Hoops After Dark concluded a very successful Spring League Season this month that culminated with the popular All Star & Championship games. A special thanks to Leonard Adams and his Hoops After Dark coaching and mentorship team for a fantastic six-week run of great games and beneficial workshops for over 50 area young adults.

Big news at Long Beach Animal Care Services this month. Congratulations to our current Long Beach Animal Care Services Bureau Manager, Staycee Dains, on her recent appointment by the City of Los Angeles as their new Animal Services General Manager. It is always with mixed emotions that I share news of this significance, as Staycee has had a tremendous impact upon LBACS since February of 2019 when she took on the important LBACS Bureau Manager leadership position. So many great advancements and improvements are to Staycee's credit during her years of service to the Long Beach community. Staycee led the development of the Long Beach Animal Care Services "Compassion Saves" operating model along with the LBAC's first ever Strategic Plan. She also revitalized community engagement through off site adoption events and other educational programs. In 2022, LBACS reached its highest adoption rate ever, placing nearly 2,000 pets into homes while raising the live release rate to 89% from the previous 70% levels in 2018. Staycee's last day with the City of Long Beach will be June 30, 2023. I want to also share with you that Melanie Wagner, PhD, Superintendent of Animal Care Services, who has over 20 years of experience caring for the welfare of animals, will serve as Interim Bureau Manager, while the City looks to permanently fill the position. I want to wish Staycee and Melanie great professional and personal success and enjoyment in their exciting futures.

We hope to see the month of June bring increased activation and beautification of our parks and beaches! Parks Make Long Beach...Parks Make Life Better!

GRANT FUNDED COMMUNITY PROJECT WRIGLEY GREENBELT OPENS TO THE PUBLIC



The new Wrigley Greenbelt located at De Forest Avenue between 26th Way and 34th Street was opened in a ribbon

cutting ceremony on Friday, May 19. This grant-funded community project provides restoration and preservation of green space in Long Beach's Wrigley Neighborhood along the I-710 freeway.

The Wrigley Greenbelt includes new improvements such as a one-mile walking trail, new picnic tables, and a sustainable design with new landscaping of drought resistant native plants, a new irrigation system, and dry stream beds to improve stormwater runoff. These enhancements will elevate visitor experience and provide the community

a place for recreation, exercise and more. New native trees have been planted providing a green buffer to improve air quality, while benefiting wildlife and the local ecosystem.

The Wrigley Greenbelt project is a \$3.82 million project with funding support totaling \$1.62 million from Los Angeles County Regional Park and Open Space District; \$1 million from Park Impact fees, and \$1.2 million from Construction & Demolition Recycling Program funds. Cal Fire grants were also secured by project partners the Conservation Corps of Long Beach. State Senator Lena Gonzalez has earmarked \$1.2 million to continue restoration efforts and maintenance for the greenbelt.
