A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE
CITY OF LONG BEACH RELATING TO THE REVIEW AND
CONSIDERATION OF THE EIR ADDENDUM AND RELATED
DOCUMENTS, AND APPROVING PLANS AND
SPECIFICATIONS FOR THE CHITTICK FIELD PROJECT IN
ACCORDANCE WITH THE PROVISIONS OF THE
CALIFORNIA ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY ACT (CEQA)
AND STATE AND LOCAL GUIDELINES AND MAKING
CERTAIN DETERMINATIONS RELATIVE THERETO

RESOLUTION NO. RES-12-0076

The City Council of the City of Long Beach does hereby find, determine and resolve:

15 The City of Long Beach has submitted a development Section 1. 16 application for the Chittick Field Project which consists of the construction of certain 17 outdoor recreation facilities and is proposed to include two youth soccer fields, one adult 18 soccer field, one regulation football field surrounded by a 400 meter all-weather track and 19 accommodations for javelin, pole vault, shot put, discus, hammer, long jump, and triple 20 jump training and competitions. As part of the proposed Chittick Field Project, the athletic 21 fields would be constructed with natural turf and associated irrigation would be installed. 22 In addition, existing field pole lighting would be removed and replaced with new 23 permanent lights to provide improved nighttime lighting of the proposed athletic fields. 24 The existing chain link fence surrounding the Project Site also would be replaced with a 25 new eight-foot high vinyl coated chain link fence. Additionally, a surface parking lot would 26 be provided along Walnut Avenue to accommodate 128 vehicles plus eight handicap 27 spaces. A 400-square foot restroom facility would also be provided. In addition, a bike 28 path extending from Alamitos Avenue would be provided to connect the bike trail in the

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adjacent Pacific Electric right-of-way with Cherry Avenue. The portion of the bike path
that would cross the Project Site along its northern boundary would be located within the
Project Site, inside the new fence. Access to the Project Site would be provided via a
driveway along Walnut Avenue, which would provide direct access to the proposed
surface parking lots. A more complete Project description is set forth in the Addendum
prepared for the Chittick Field Project which is incorporated herein by this reference as
though set forth herein word for word.

8 Section 2. A Draft Environmental Impact Report (DEIR) for the Kroc
9 Community Center was completed on June 4, 2009, and circulated between March 26,
10 2009 and May 9, 2009. The final Environmental Impact Report was certified by the
11 Planning Commission of the City of Long Beach on June 18, 2009 (EIR #31-07).

12 Section 3. At the time the Planning Commission approved, certified and 13 adopted the Kroc Community Center EIR on June 18, 2009, the Planning Commission 14 made certain Findings and Determinations in accordance with the provisions of the 15 California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), adopted a Statement of Overriding 16 Considerations for each environmental impact identified in the EIR as "significant and unavoidable" and adopted a Mitigation Monitoring and Reporting Program (MMRP). The 17 18 content of said Findings, Statement of Overriding Considerations, and MMRP are hereby 19 incorporated herein by this reference as though set forth herein word for word.

Section 4. The Addendum prepared in connection with the Chittick Field Project represents and discusses certain modifications to the approved Kroc Community Center Project EIR and is considered in addition to the previous project environmental review documentation for the Kroc Community Center. A copy of the Kroc Community Center EIR, as well as the proposed Addendum thereto, relevant technical appendices, and other supporting documentation have been provided to the City Council for its review and consideration.

Section 5. Pursuant to Section 15164 of the CEQA Guidelines, and
based on the evidence and oral and written testimony presented at all previous public

 (incorporated herein by reference) on the Project, including the EIR for the Kroc
 Community Center Project (EIR #31-07) and the Addendum to the EIR for the modified
 Chittick Field Project, the Planning Commission of the City of Long Beach found at a duly
 noticed public hearing on August 16, 2012, that:

6 1. The EIR Addendum had been completed in compliance with7 CEQA.

8 2. The EIR Addendum reflected the Planning Commission's
9 independent judgment and analysis with respect to the Chittick Field Project.

103.None of the conditions described in CEQA Guidelines Section1115162, which call for the preparation of a subsequent EIR, had occurred.

12 4. The EIR Addendum was appropriate in as much as the Chittick Field Project would not result in any additional significant impacts associated with 13 14 the Kroc Community Center Project, nor would it increase the severity of previously anticipated impacts associated with said Project. Rather, all of the impacts associated 15 with the Chittick Field Project were and are within the envelope of impacts addressed in 16 the certified EIR for the Kroc Community Center Project and/or do not constitute a new or 17 greater significant impact. Thus, a supplemental or subsequent EIR was not required 18 pursuant to Public Resources Code Section 21166, or California Code of Regulations, 19 Title 14, Section 15162 or 15163, because none of the conditions described in Section 20 15162 calling for the preparation of a subsequent or supplemental EIR had occurred. 21

Section 6. At the August 16, 2012, Planning Commission public hearing, the Planning Commission made and adopted certain Facts, Findings and a Statement of Overriding Considerations ("Findings") which had been prepared in connection with the approval of the Chittick Field Project Addendum. Said CEQA Findings were and are based on the information and evidence set forth in the EIR for the Kroc Community Center and the EIR Addendum, and upon such other substantial evidence (both oral and written) which had been presented to the Planning Commission in the record of the

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proceeding, including, but not limited to, that information received by the Planning 1 Commission at the public hearing conducted on August 16, 2012, including the Staff 2 3 Report presented to the Planning Commission on that date. Likewise, on August 16, 2012, the Planning Commission adopted and imposed, as a condition of project approval, 4 the Mitigation Monitoring and Reporting Program as was set forth in the certified EIR, and 5 as was further modified by the Addendum to reflect the lesser intensity of use resulting 6 7 from the implementation of the Chittick Field Project, and found that in response to each 8 significant impact identified in the Addendum, changes, alterations or mitigation 9 measures have been or will be required or incorporated into the Project as part of the Mitigation Monitoring and Reporting Program which would avoid or substantially reduce 10 to a level of insignificance the significant environmental impacts identified. Each such 11 change, alteration or mitigation measure was made a condition of approval of the Chittick 12 13 Field Project.

Section 7. Decision.

The City Council hereby certifies that it has reviewed and considered all relevant environmental documents including the EIR and Addendum thereto that have been more fully described herein, and based upon such review and consideration hereby approves the Chittick Field Project as is more fully described herein and in the City Council Staff Report that accompanies this Resolution.

Section 8. The City Council further imposes, as a condition of project approval, the Mitigation Monitoring and Reporting Program as was set forth in the certified EIR, and as is further modified by the Addendum to reflect the lesser intensity of use resulting from the implementation of the Chittick Field Project. Each such change, alteration or mitigation measure is made a condition of approval of the Chittick Field Project.

26 Section 9. This resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption by 27 the City Council, and the City Clerk shall certify the vote adopting this resolution.
