WHEREAS, the number of uninsured Californians has now reached 6.5 million residents, with most of the newly uninsured coming from solidly middle-class families; and

WHEREAS, health insurance premiums have increased 87 percent since 2000, with the average employee contributing 143 percent more to their company-sponsored health insurance; and
