Speed a factor in fatal crash

The woman blamed for a wrong-way crash that killed eight people on a Westchester County highway last summer was going 85 mph when she slammed her van into an SUV, state police said.

The SUV also was speeding, at 74 mph they said. The speed limit was 55 mph.

The July 26 crash on the Taconic Parkway north of New York City killed Diane Schuler, who was driving the van; her daughter; three nieces; and three men in the other vehicle. Schuler's 5-year-old son survived.

An autopsy found that Schuler, 36, of West Babylon, was drunk and **high on marijuana**.

Her husband, Daniel Schuler, refused to accept the autopsy conclusion and funded more studies of her remains in hopes of proving she was not intoxicated. The results have not been made public.

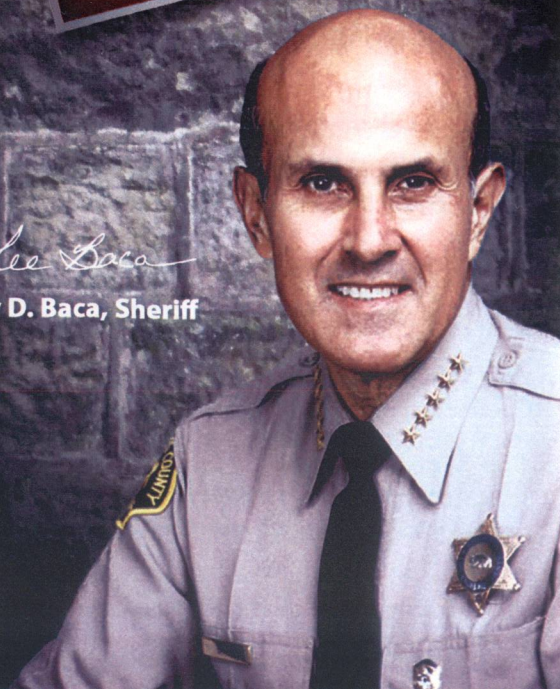

- *Taxation would return buyers to the black market.*

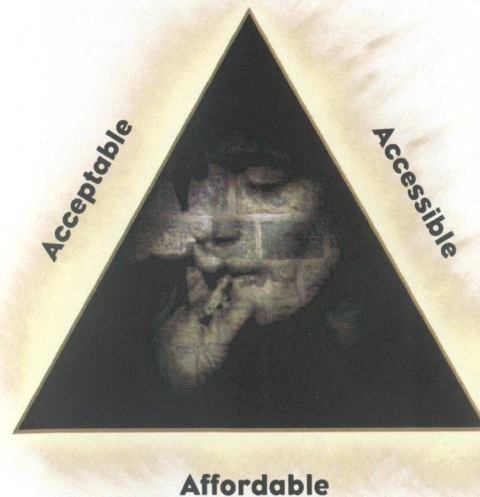
Let's Use Common Sense
