

1 5.46.020 Pamphlet distribution hours.

2 No person shall distribute any pamphlets in or upon private property in the
3 City between 7:00 p.m. and 8:00 a.m.

4
5 5.46.030 Distribution on private property restricted.

6 No person shall distribute any pamphlets in or upon private property
7 when:

8 A. It is apparent that the property is unoccupied; or

9 B. It is apparent that a previous day's distribution of pamphlets,
10 regardless by whom distributed, has not been removed.

11
12 5.46.040 Manner of distribution.

13 Subject to the provisions of Section 5.46.030, no person shall distribute in
14 or upon any private property any pamphlets except in the following manner:

15 A. By placing the same in a receptacle, clip, or other device
16 designed or intended to receive pamphlets, when such receptacle, clip, or
17 other device has been conspicuously placed near the front door or front
18 entrance or near the mailbox of any private property; or

19 B. If no such receptacle, clip, or other device has been placed as
20 provided in this Section, then by handing the pamphlets to an occupant of
21 the property, or placing the same upon the porch or vestibule of a house
22 or building on the private property, provided that, in the latter case, the
23 pamphlet is wrapped, tied, folded, or otherwise so prepared or placed that
24 it will not be blown loose by the wind.

26 5.46.050 Business License required.

27 No person shall cause the distribution of any pamphlet without clearly
28 printing the business license number of the person or entity which caused the

1 pamphlet to be distributed, unless such person or entity is not otherwise required
2 to possess a business license under this Code.

3
4 5.46.060 Public distribution prohibited.

5 Except for the sale or distribution of newspapers, no person as principal,
6 agent, employee, or otherwise shall solicit, whether verbally, written or otherwise,
7 for any business, profession, trade, transportation line, excursion or any other
8 purpose, in person, or by personally selling, offering for sale, or distributing any
9 tickets, cards, handbills or other printed or written matter or merchandise in or
10 upon any public street, alley, sidewalk, way, pier, wharf or other public place, or
11 in or on any vehicle in any such place in the city, except as may be lawfully
12 permitted under Chapter 5.66 of this Title 5. No person shall post notices on
13 public property including street signs, lampposts, etc., without a permit from the
14 public works department.

15
16 5.46.070 False advertising prohibited.

17 No person shall sell, furnish, perform or in any way dispose of real or
18 personal property, services, professional or otherwise, or anything of any nature
19 whatsoever, directly or indirectly to the public, or induce the public in any manner
20 to enter into any obligation relating thereto, or acquire title thereto, or any interest
21 therein, by means of publishing, circulating, or causing to be made, published or
22 circulated before the public in the city, in any newspaper, magazine, book,
23 pamphlet, circular, letter, notice, handbill, poster, or other publication, or on any
24 billboard, sign, card, label, or other advertising medium, including any electric
25 sign, window sign, showcase, or window display, or any other advertising device,
26 or by public outcry, or proclamation, or in any other manner or means whatever,
27 which advertising contains any statement representation, or assertion concerning
28 such real or personal property, service, or anything so offered to the public, or

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1 concerning any circumstances or matter of fact connected in any way directly or
2 indirectly with the proposed sale, performance or disposition thereof, which
3 statement, representation or assertion is false or untrue in any respect, or which
4 is deceptive or misleading; provided, however, that this section shall not apply to
5 any publisher of a newspaper, magazine, or other publication who publishes said
6 advertisement in good faith without knowledge of its false, deceptive or
7 misleading character.

9 Sec. 2. The City Clerk shall certify to the passage of this Ordinance by
10 the City Council and cause it to be posted in three conspicuous places in the City of
11 Long Beach, and it shall take effect on the thirty-first day after it is approved by the
12 Mayor.


