The November 14,2011 Staff Report to Cultural Heritage Commission references prior approvals for the Re Build Plan.

What the Staff failed to tell the Commission was the referenced approvals were underlined, overlined, encompassed with deceit and deception -- ie they were presented to: Planning Commission, City Council. Coastal BEFORE THEY WERE RIPE.

More to the point. The components of the re build plan which drives mitigation was not brought before the Cultural Heritage Commission.

TO WIT:

Diligent Commission members will turn to the EXHIBIT section of this appeal and read the series of local media articles chronicling the run up to the re build plan.

Said articles detail the well reasoned opposition-particularly the safety issues. PAY PARTICULAR ATTENTION TO THE March 13,09; ARTICLE GREAT WATERWAY DEBATE CONTINUES by Press Telegram's eminent sports writer Doug Krikorian!!!!!

At that duly constituted, duly noticed well attended Public Hearing at LBYC-Mr. Sandoval asked the Marina Advisory Commission to green light his re build plan>

When the issue came up; Mr. Sandoval presented his case to Commission. When Mr. Sandoval finished his presentation. The then Chair, Bradley White-folded his hands and said:

"NO!!!!!! We are not going to approve the plan!!!!"

"We have been discussing this in committee and have decided we need more public input.

We need to have more public meetings.

At that point, one MAC member made a motion to have one more meeting.Chair.

Chair responded " NO--I think we should have at least two more

specifpublic meetings.Right now we can not find any member of the public who supports the plan!!!!!!!

Commission then, with public in attendance--discussed/debated on the number. The Commission voted to have TWO(2) more special meetings.

After the vote to have two more special meetings--he stated that he felt that at least one of the meetings should be in the downtown area--one possibly at night. He stated that the public would be notified as soon as schedule and venue locations.

The above meeting was in March 2009. Rest of March went by no meeting... April went by no meeting May went by no meeting June went by no meeting July went by no meeting August went by no meeting September went by no meeting October went by no meeting. Finally -9 months go by---Mr. Sandoval, proving his skills at managing land base events are as poor as his grasp on aquatic/maritime matters--Schedules the FIRST of the special meetings---ONLY TO HAVE TO CANCEL---after noticed went out===because he failed to check if the waters were cleared(venue was not available----was a Wilson--which had event already scheduled. Finally the FIRST----and what would turn out to be the ONLY SPECIAL COMMISSION MANDATED MEETING---was held.

(In the minds of many-the delay was not un planned.Knowing the MAC Chair who wanted two more meetings-had signaled his intent to move north;applicnt waited until the departure--and a a member of the Crew of the SS Minnow--near void of any serious understading maritime issues--would be MAC Chair--just long enough to get the title/and helmsmen boat wheel!!then off the Commission!!

What transpired at that meeting will be dealt with in another aspect of this filing.

ENTER NOW INTO THE PICTURE THE DECEIT AND DECEPTION--FOLLOWED LATER BY CRIMINAL CONDUCT--going to fact the plan placed before Planning; CouncilCoastal---BEFORE IT WAS RIPE.

At its next regular meeting circa three weeks after that FIRST AND ONLY SPECIAL MEETING MAC APPROVED THE PLAN.

When Appellant rose to point of Order that there was but one special meeting===Mr. Sandoval claimed there were two special meetings!!!!!!!

1 AGREEMENT. 2 8 THIS AGREEMENT, made this 11th day of July, 1931, by and δ BETWEEN CITY OF LONG BEACH, a municipal corporation, organized and existing under and 0 by virtue of the laws of the State of California, and situated in the County 7 of Los Angeles, therein, TONG BEACH PUBLIC LIBERTS 8 TOT PASIFIC ASSISTA FIRST PARTY, LONG BEACH, CALIF. 90002 9 The RECREATION COMMISSION, a duly constituted Board of said City, LB. COLE 10 SECOND PARTY, 11 AND XTH OLYMPIADE COMMITTEE OF THE GAMES OF 12 LOS ANGELES U.S.A. 1932, LTD., A corporetion, 13 THIRD PARTY. 14 WITNESSETH: 15 16 WHEREAS, the Third Party is a corporation duly organized and existing 17 under and by virtue of the laws of the State of California, and is the 18 Olympiad Corporation provided for by the California Tenth Olympiad Bond Act of 1927, and as such is engaged in organizing, promoting, and preparing for 10 20 the Games of the Tenth Olympiad to be held in California, in the summer of 21 1932; and

WHEREAS, rowing contests constitute a feature of said games, and it is necessary that facilities be provided therefor; and

WHEREAS, the First Party owns, and the Second Party has jurisdiction over, that certain water-way and adjacent lands in the southeastern part of said city, known as the Long Beach Marine Stadium, as shown upon a map thereof, attached hereto, entitled "Proposed Two Thousand Meter Olympic Rowing and Sculling Course", compiled and drawn by C. G. Van Hock, September, 1930; and

WHEREAS, the improvement of said Long Beach Marine Stadium as a permanent rowing and sculling course for the continuous enjoyment and recreation of the people of the community will be of great public benefit, and the First and Second Parties, accordingly, desire and intend to make said im-

whereas, it will be of great public benefit to hold said rowing contests in connection with said Olympic Games in said City of Long Beach, in that the same will attract visitors in great numbers to said city; will create widespread interest in said city, and will provide entertainment and recreation for the community; and said First and Second Parties, accordingly, desire that said rowing contests be held in said city, at said Long Beach

WHEREAS, the Third Party is willing to award, and will award, and shall conduct and hold said rowing contest, in connection with said Olympic Games, to the said City of Long Beach, upon the terms and conditions hereinafter expressed;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the premises and in accordance with and pursuant to the terms, conditions and covenants herein contained, it is hereby agreed as follows:

On or before January 1, 1932, the First and Second Parties will do and/or cause to be done and completed the following:

The rowing course shall be dredged and otherwise completed, in accordance with the attached map, so that the outside borders of the course, for the entire length thereof, as well as the interior of the course, shall have a minimum of five (5) feet of water at low tide, and so that the buoys to be anchored as markers on the outside borders of the course will be floating at all times in not less than five (5) feet of water; said course to be two thousand (2,000) meters long, and two hundred twenty-five (225) feet wide, minimum width from side line to side line of floating buoys, with approximately two hundred (200) feet of water behind the starting line, and approximately six hundred (600) feet of water beyond the finish line, as shown on said map. Roads shall be constructed the full length of the course on the east side, including the building and construction of a bridge across the lagoon at the place marked "Bridge" upon said map, and on the west side from Colorado Street to the lagoon leading to Alamitos Bay, as shown on said attached map.

A fence shall be erected surrounding the entire course, at approximately the outer boundaries of the city owned properties, as shown upon said map. A sufficient number of comfort stations shall be erected inside of said fence. The ground areas of the city owned land between Colorado Street and both of the stands for spectators, as shown on the attached map, and surrounding said stands, shall be suitably smoothed up and hardened.

The Recreation Commission will issue to the said Third Party all permits necessary for its use within the contemplation of the parties hereto.

It is understood and agreed that commencing on the first day of July, 1932, and ending on the 16th day of August, 1932, the Third Party shall have the exclusive possession and use of said rowing and sculling course, completed as aforesaid, including the area within said fence, as shown on the attached map, and all buildings, equipment, installations, appurtenances and facilities appurtenant to, or connected with, said rowing course, within said fenced area, also all light, heat, power and water, and including the portable bleachers, public address or loudspeaker equipment, and other apparatus and facilities in the possession of the First and Second Parties. at said premises, all without charge to the Third Party, for the purpose of preparing for, conducting, and holding the aforesaid rowing contests in connection with said Olympic Games; with the right to the Third Party to charge the public for admission to said events or exhibitions, and to receive, for its own account, the gross proceeds of said admission charges for said exhibitions, and concessions, licenses and privileges granted by the Third Party within said fenced area. During the aforesaid period from July 1, 1932, to August 16, 1932, inclusive, the operation, control, possession and management of the premises and appurtenances hereinbefore referred to, and the operation, control, management, and administration of the contests and games to be held at said premises shall be exclusively in the Third Party. The third Party shall, at all times hereafter, and prior to July 1, 1932, have access to the aforesaid premises for the purpose of preparing for said rowing contests, and effecting the necessary constructions and installations therefor. The Third Party shall have the right to erect on the premises, at the places

to be determined by itself, stands for the seating of spectators, and it shall have the right to demolish or otherwise remove the same at the conclusion of the Olympic rowing events; it shall either demolish or otherwise remove said stand or stands on or before August 31, 1932; the erection of said stand or stands, the maintenance thereof during said period time, and the demolition of and/or removal thereof, shall be at the expense of the Third Party, including all labor and/or materials.

It is expressly understood and agreed that the Third Party will, at its own expense and upon its own responsibility, construct, on said premises, all of the Olympic rowing installations, such as starting piers, floating and anchored buoy markers for the side lines of the prescribed course, the platform at the finish line for officials, a boat house to hold sculls and shells of competitors, with all necessary facilities, all of said Olympic rowing installations to be in accord with specifications furnished by the International Federation of Rowing Societies, to the Third Party; and none of said Olympic installations shall be removed by the Third Party, but shall be left in place by the Third Party at the conclusion of the Olympic rowing events, as the property of the First Party.

All buildings, piers, boat houses, stands and/or other structures erected by the Third Party on said area shall also conform to the Building Code, Ordinances of the City of Long Beach, and any other laws pertaining thereto.

It is further expressly understood and agreed that the Third Party will fully pay for all materials joined or affixed to said premises at its instance or request, and to pay in full all persons that perform labor upon said premises at its instance or request, and it will not permit or suffer any mechanic's lien or liens, or material lien or liens, of any kind or nature, to be enforced against said premises for any work done or materials furnished thereon at its instance or request.

It is also further expressly understood and agreed that the Third Party assumes full responsibility for the safety of its employees, property and equipment placed by it upon said premises, and for any damage or injury

done by or to them from any source or cause. And said Third Party shall take out and at all times keep in full force and effect sufficient workmen's compensation insurance required by the laws of the State of California and/or the United States of America.

It is also further expressly understood, stipulated and agreed that the First Party and/or Second Party shall not be liable for any injuries to the Third Party, or to any employees of the Third Party, or for loss or destruction of or damage to any properties of the Third Party, or to the property brought, stored, placed or used upon said premises, or injuries to any person upon said property from any cause whatsoever while under the use and/or control of the Third Party, as herein contemplated, and/or during the construction of any building, pier, boat house, stands or other structures erected thereon by the Third Party, and the Third Party hereby agrees to indemnify and save harmless the said First Party and/or Second Party from and against any and all claim, liability, demand or cause of action resulting directly or indirectly from any injury to persons or loss or destruction of or damage to property, and from and against any and all claim, liability, demand or cause of action arising directly or indirectly from the use of said premises by the Third Party, and from and against any claim, liability, cause of action or damage which any insurer may at any time assert or undertake to assert against the First and/or Second Party.

The Third Party shall execute a good and sufficient bond to the City of Long Beach in the penal sum of Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00), conditioned upon the faithful performance of this contract.

The terms, agreements and conditions of this contract shall cease to bind any of the parties hereto if the Games of the Xth Olympiad shall not be held in California in 1932.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the First Party has caused this Instrument to be executed by its City Manager thereunto duly authorized; the Second Party has caused this Instrument to be executed by the Director of Playgrounds and Public Recreation, thereunto duly authorized, and the Third Party has caused this Instrument to be executed under its corporate seal by its Vice

The Great Waterway Debate continues

Article Text:In the latest chapter of the Long Beach Rowers vs. Mark Sandoval in what has become known as the Great Alamitos Bay Waterway Debate, well, nothing of note can be reported except I found out that one member of the Marine Advisory Commission belongs to the Long Beach Yacht Club. "You're wasting your time coming here today," Sandoval told me before Thursday's 2:30 meeting got underway at the LBYC's second-story banquet room in which the Marine Advisory Commission was supposed to announce its non-binding recommendations about Sandoval's controversial \$88 million (!!!) dream known stirringly as the Alamitos Bay Rebuild Project..."Why?" I wanted to know."I believe the Marine Advisory Commission is going to have a couple of more public meetings before it makes a decision," he said. And presto, Mark Sandoval turned out to be on target. The Marine Advisory Commission's chairman, a Mr. Bradley Whyte, announced that his august albeit pruned down body - it has only six members because the brilliant Long Beach mayor, Bob (Bananas) Foster, for some unfathomable reason has failed to fill three vacancies - would render a verdict after listening "to other stakeholders with views slightly different than that of the rowers." The other stakeholders, of course, are the big boaters like, well, Mr. Bradley Whyte, who has resided with his wife in a 42-foot yacht at the Shoreline Marina for the past 14 years. "Oh, i know where you stand on this issue," I kidded Mr. Whyte, an affable gentleman with a sense of humor befitting that of a salesman, which he is. "Oh no, I have a totally open mind on this issue," he asserted. "I'm a rower myself. You come to my boat, and you'll see a scull on it." Being a true investigative reporter, I do plan to take Mr. Whyte up on his offer, but I'll be sneaky and won't tell him when I'll show up just to make sure there really is a scull aboard his vessel. Mr. Whyte does admit, though, he would like a more fair and balanced turnout at the next public gatherings that haven't been scheduled, meaning he would like to hear from a lot of people who aren't angry about Sandoval's proposal to narrow the waterway between the Second Street Davies Bridge and the LBYC up to 35 feet, according to Sandoval's

calculations, or 90 feet, according to the rowers' calculations. "But if narrowing the waterway and sticking a new dock besides the LBYC like Sandoval proposes eliminates rowers' lanes and poses serious safety issues, why narrow the waterway?" I asked Mr. Whyte. "I want to find out myself what impact it will have on the waterway," he replied. Good. I do, too, and just can't wait to attend the next two meetings of this thickening drama that was pretty tame Thursday compared to the tense atmosphere that pervaded in the first showdown staged last week at the Peter Archer Rowing Center. In that one, one person after another got up and informed Mark Sandoval in no uncertain terms that he was committing a heinous meritime disaster. This one was quite docile, as Mark Sandoval even showed he is quite an environmentalist, as he displayed a box overflowing with letters to his office that I'm sure weren't exactly braising his work. "Please, don't waste paper ... save the trees," he pleaded. "If you want to protest, do it through e-mail." 
