HONORABLE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL City of Long Beach California

RECOMMENDATION:

Authorize the City Manager to execute a contract and all necessary amendments, including term extensions, with the County of Los Angeles to receive and expend Department of Homeland Security grant funding for the 2011 Homeland Security Grant Program, and increase appropriations by \$287,610 in the General Grants Fund (SR 120) in the Fire Department (FD). (Citywide)

DISCUSSION

The Los Angeles County Chief Executive Office recently advised the City of Long Beach that the 2011 Homeland Security Grant Program funds have been awarded. This grant is appropriated by the U.S. Department of Homeland Security and managed through the State of California Office of Homeland Security and Los Angeles County Chief Executive Office. Under this grant program, the Long Beach Fire Department will receive a total of \$267,610 to continue implementation of the Metropolitan Medical Response System (MMRS) and the State Homeland Security Grant Program (SHSGP). City Council authorization is required to execute a contract and necessary amendments, accept the grant funds and increase appropriations in the General Grants Fund in the Fire Department.

The MMRS and SHSGP grants began in 2001 as part of the Department of Homeland Security's goal to better prepare local governments to respond to any CBRNE (Chemical, Biological, Radiological, Nuclear, Explosive) event. The funds have been used to secure emergency medicines for responders and the public, and to increase the capabilities of the Long Beach Fire Department and the Long Beach Department of Health and Human Services. The MMRS 2011 grant award of \$267,610 will be utilized for personnel to assess and update the plans and protocol manual for the Long Beach MMRS. The SHSGP 2011 grant award of \$20,000 will be utilized for CBRNE equipment procurement.

This letter was reviewed by Deputy City Attorney Gary J. Anderson on June 28, 2012 and Budget Officer Victoria Bell on July 5, 2012.

TIMING CONSIDERATIONS

City Council approval is requested on July 24, 2012, to ensure timely acceptance of these grant dollars.

FISCAL IMPACT

As these grants are currently unbudgeted, an appropriation increase of \$287,610 is included in the recommendation. The expense appropriations will be fully offset by grant revenues and this grant does not require matching funds. There is no local job impact associated with this recommendation.
