### FIRST AMENDMENT TO CONTRACT NO. 31831

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THIS FIRST AMENDMENT TO CONTRACT NO. 31831 is made and entered, in duplicate, as of July 28, 2011 for reference purposes only, pursuant to a minute order adopted by the City Council of the City of Long Beach at its meeting held on May 5, 2009, by and between BEYOND SHELTER, a nonprofit California corporation ("Organization"), with offices located at 1200 Wilshire Boulevard, #600, Los Angeles, California 90017, and the CITY OF LONG BEACH, a municipal corporation (the "City").

WHEREAS, the City has received a grant from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development ("HUD") from the Homelessness Prevention Fund, hereafter referred to as the Homelessness Prevention and Rapid Re-Housing Program ("HPRP"), under Title XII of the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009, to provide financial assistance and services to either prevent individuals and families from becoming homeless or help those who are experiencing homeless to be quickly rehoused and stabilized; and

WHEREAS, as part of Grant Agreement No. S09-MY-06-0522 between HUD and the City (the "HUD Agreement") the City is required to enter into subcontracts with organizations that provide homelessness prevention assistance to households who would otherwise become homeless, many due to the economic crisis, and to provide assistance to rapidly re-house persons who are homeless, and the City has selected Organization as a sub-recipient of grant funds; and

WHEREAS, the parties entered Contract No. 31831 whereby Organization agreed to provide this assistance; and

WHEREAS, the parties desire to extend the term and specify the funding amount for the extended term;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual terms and conditions in the Contract and in this First Amendment, the parties agree as follows:

1. Section 3 of Contract No. 31831 is hereby amended to read as

follows:

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"Section 3. The term of this Contract shall commence at midnight on October 1, 2010 and, unless sooner terminated as provided herein, shall terminate on October 31, 2012. The term of this Contract may be extended by mutual written agreement between the City and Organization. City may reclaim any unused balance of funds for reallocation to other City approved projects."

- 2. Section 4.A. of Contract No. 31831 is hereby amended to read as follows:
- "A. Total disbursements made to Organization under this Contract by the City shall not exceed Eight Hundred Fifteen Thousand Four Hundred Four Dollars (\$815,404) for eligible costs and activities over the term of this Contract. Upon execution of this Contract, the City shall disburse the funds payable hereunder in due course of payments following receipt from Organization of billing statements in a form approved by the City showing expenditures and costs identified in Attachment "B-1"."
- 3. Organization shall provide rapid re-housing assistance to homeless in the City in accordance with the HUD Agreement and Attachment "A-1" attached hereto, entitled "Statement of Work".
- Attachment "A-1" (Scope of Work) and Attachment "B-1" (Budget) 4. attached to this First Amendment are hereby added to the Contract and incorporated herein by reference.
- Except as expressly amended in this First Amendment, all terms and 5. conditions in Contract No. 31831 are ratified and confirmed and shall remain in full force and effect.

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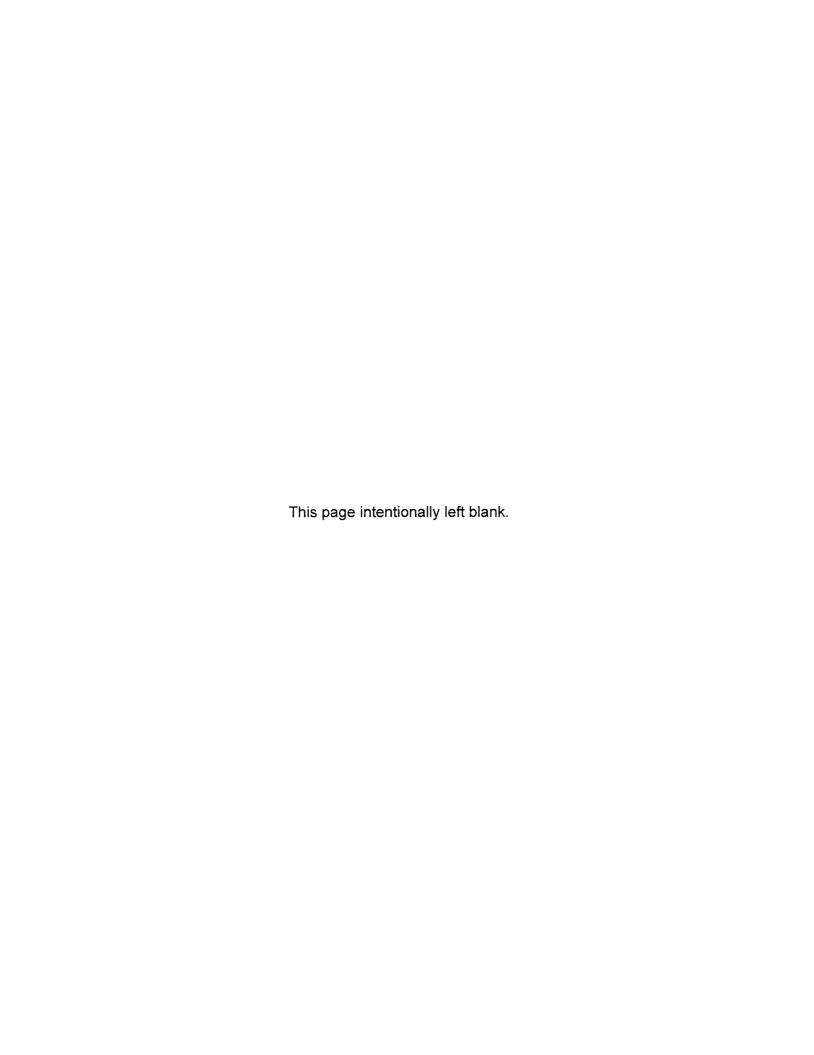

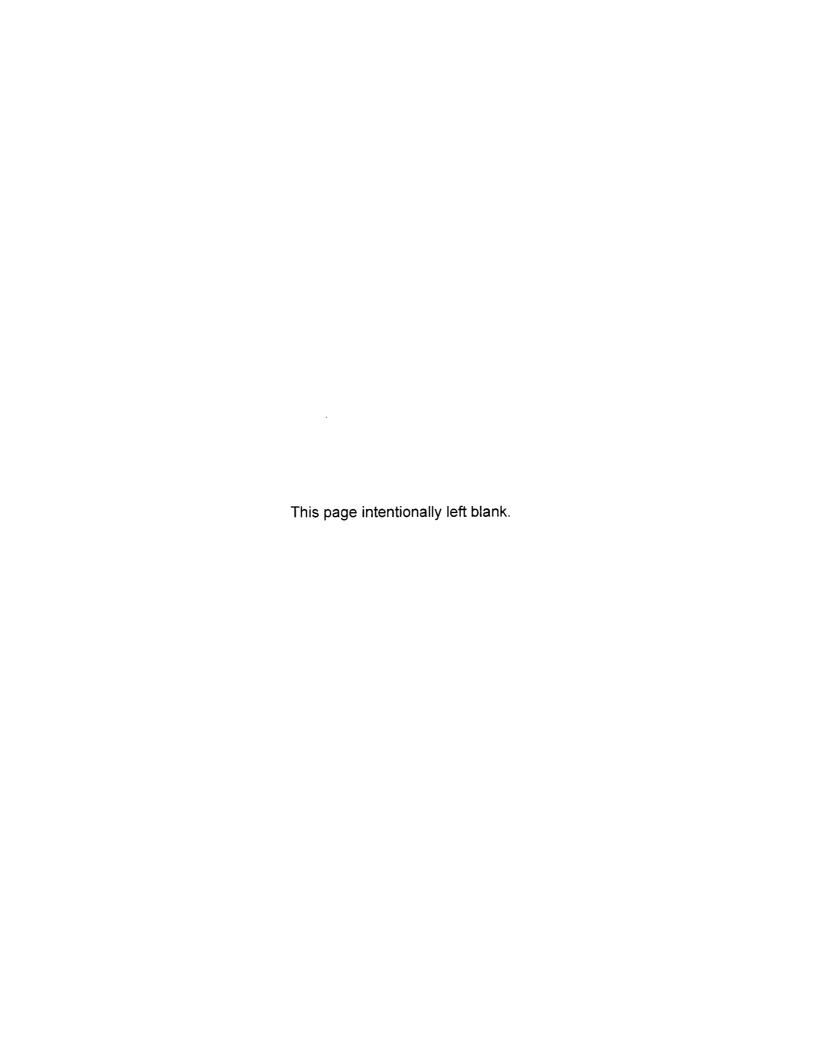
