## Be S.A.F.E. Program Activates Parks With Safe Family Fun



Residents are enjoying spending time with family and friends at Long Beach Parks, Recreation and Marine's (LBPRM) Be SAFE (Summer Activities in a Friendly Environment) program.

The 10-week program began on June 19 and will run until August 25. Residents can come out Monday through Friday from 5-8 p.m. to Admiral Kidd, Bixby, Drake, Houghton, M.L. King Jr., Orizaba, Pan American, Ramona, Scherer, Seaside or Silverado Parks.

LBPRM staff have great activities planned like Family Nights with carnivals, karaoke, bingo and craft bonanzas; talent shows, dance team performances, cooking and flower arranging classes, volleyball, handball and pickleball tournaments; soccer skills workshops, science activities, and swimming. Free movies are sponsored by the

Port of Long Beach and the Long Beach Public Library is bringing out its Mobile Studio with workshops in computer coding, illustration, 3D design and printing, and robotics.



The program started in 2013 with LBPRM extending recreation programming hours at three parks to better serve the needs of surrounding neighborhoods. The program has decreased crime by activating parks with recreation programs that detract from less wholesome activities.

The success of Be SAFE is seen in LBPRM's commitment to growing the program. A total of seven sites were opened in 2016 and in 2017 there are a total of eleven sites. Attendance grew 14 percent in 2016 and even bigger attendance is estimated for 2017.

Be SAFE was recently named a 2017 "Award of Excellence" winner in the category of Neighborhood Building in the annual California Park & Recreation Society's Awards program.

On June 19, ten weeks of Summer Tennis Camps began at Billie Jean King (BJK) and El Dorado Park Tennis Centers (ELDO). Half and full day camps are offered weekly through August 25. The camps are designed by United States Professional Tennis Association (USPTA) certified tennis pros to be fun and challenging, introducing the game of tennis and good sportsmanship to each child from the novice to more advanced players.

El Dorado Park Tennis Center Coaches Mitch Bridge and Peter Smith are inspired by the success of the camps. ELDO has several options for Summer Camp: High Performance Academy offers a Half-Day Day Camp from 11 a.m. - 2 p.m. or 2 - 6 p.m.; Extended Day Camp from 11 a.m. - 6 p.m. and, the Developmental & DEV All Stars for ages 5-14 runs from 9 a.m. - noon.

USPTA certified tennis pro Valter Paiva manages the Summer Camp at BJK, which includes Full and Half Day camps during June, July and August. The Half Day Camps run Monday – Friday from 9 a.m. – 12 p.m. and 2 - 5 p.m. The Full Day Camp runs Monday – Friday from 9 a.m. – 5 p.m. The Summer Tennis Camp Programs offers training sessions for the beginner to the college level player’s ages 5-18 years old.

BJK Tennis Pros Aba Villena and Scheraq Hassim launched the Next Level Summer Junior Development program for high school tennis players who need to work on conditioning, footwork, strategy and tactics. The program runs Monday - Friday from 11 a.m. –1 p.m.

At BJK & ELDO, June marked the start of the summer season for Recreational World Team Tennis, Junior World Team Tennis, and the USTA League. All the teams are off to a great start and players are enjoying the competition and meeting new players from around the southland.

The USTA 2017 Spring Junior Team Tennis Section Championships was held at ELDO the weekend of June 2-4. More than 550 players and 70 teams from Ventura to San Diego in nine divisions within the 10, 14 & 18 & under age groups competed to represent their league in the 35<sup>th</sup> Annual Gar Glenney Cup Junior Team Tennis Championships in northern California in August.

On June 17, Tennis Hall-of-Famer Michael Chang and coach of 9<sup>th</sup> ranked player in the world, Kei Nishikori visited El Dorado Park Tennis Center for a clinic and court-side conversation and autograph session. Michael shared his thoughts of tennis and life. That same weekend El Dorado Park Tennis Center was selected as one of the seven host sites for the 115th Annual Southern California Junior Sectional Championships. This event is the largest annual junior tennis tournament in the United States. The tournament ran from the June 17- 26 and had over 1,000 competitors age 10-18, from all over Southern California.

# Summer Food Program Supports Healthy Kids



Since 1980, Long Beach Parks, Recreation and Marine (LBPRM) has played a vital role in ensuring the health of children who rely on free lunch programs during the school year, by coordinating the Summer Food Service Program that is sponsored through a grant from the California Department of Education. Free lunches are provided to low-income children, ages 18 years of age and under, who, in the absence of the program, would not receive their normal lunches during summer vacation. LBPRM partners with Long Beach Unified School District to prepare and deliver the daily meals. The lunches are provided at 24 parks and two libraries in the City. In addition LBPRM has agreements with five non-profit agencies in Long Beach and two sites in the City of Signal Hill to provide the program. The program runs from June 19 through August 18, 2017.

# Long Beach Golf Hall of Fame Selects New Members

The Long Beach Golf Hall of Fame, created in 1996 to recognize individuals who “left their mark on Golf in Long Beach, will welcome two new members in 2017, Larry Grant and Mike McMonegal. Their induction will raise the Long Beach Golf Hall of Fame membership to 83.

“The City of Long Beach has a rich tradition of good golf, good golfers, and great tournaments,” said Long Beach Superintendent of Golf Operations Bob Livingstone. “We want to acknowledge those who have played the game well, like Larry Grant, and those who serve the game and make it better or more enjoyable for everyone, like Mike McMonegal. These inductees represent what is good about golf in general and golf in Long Beach in particular.”



**Larry Grant** – Larry was born in Long Beach and introduced to golf at age 12. To afford lessons, he caddied at Virginia Country Club. A long-time member of Recreation Park and El Dorado Men’s Clubs, he won the Club Championship at Rec Park six times and their Senior Club Championship twice. He lives in Westminster, CA and is a member of Meadowlark Men’s Club where he has won the Club Championship 15 times.

He has shot his age or better 184 times and has ten holes-in-one, including one on a par 4. He won the Long Beach Men’s City Championship in 1979 and the Long Beach Men’s Senior Championship in 1998 and 2000, and won the Los Angeles County Senior Championship in 2001, 2005 and 2012. He won the Southern California Golf Association’s Senior Tournament of Club Champions in 2011 and the National Left-Handed Championship in 1995. In 2007 he qualified for the US Senior Amateur Championship at Flint Hills National Golf Club in Kansas and won two matches, advancing to the round of 16.



**Mike McMonegal** – Mike began playing at age 7 at Skylinks GC. Since his dad was a fireman at adjoining Station 19, the course was a natural playground. Through his job as Assistant Golf Director for the County of Los Angeles Department of Parks and Recreation, he created and manages the LA County Junior Golf program, which

has provided instruction and playing opportunities to over 40,000 juniors. Through this program, he mentored many recognized golfers like USGA Championship winners James Oh and Briana Do and local teaching professional Jennifer Birmingham, as well as employing many local players who became golf professionals. The County’s Junior Program won the So Cal PGA’s Bill Bryant Award in 2013 for its contributions to Junior Golf, including the vision for creating and growing the hugely popular Knabe Cup for high school golf. He convinced the County to create a Championship Series with six events for men, women, seniors and teams conducted annually on courses throughout their golf operation. His prior job was working for LB Golf Hall of Fame member Len Kennett at Lakewood CC and despite moving to Eagle Rock for his County job, he has been very active with the Lakewood Men’s Club for over 30 years as a member, a Lifetime Member since 2001 and is serves as the Club’s President. Mike is involved with charitable events including as a volunteer instructor at the LA Foundation for the Blind, the Tiger Woods Learning Center and for Wounded Warriors.

The Long Beach Golf Hall of Fame Induction Ceremony will follow the conclusion of the \$165,000 Long Beach Open professional golf tournament at El Dorado Park GC on Sunday, July 30, 2017, at approximately 2:30 p.m.

# New Animal Care Services Mobile Adoption Van Rolls Out

Long Beach Animal Care Services (ACS) continues to find new ways to find shelter cats and dogs forever homes. ACS's new mobile adoption van is regularly coming out to community events to showcase available animals that are ready for adoption.

The van is a 26-foot Ford E450 that has been fitted with 10 kennels, that can be divided to create 10 or 20 spaces. Eight of the kennels are open to the outside, so that the public can easily see potential new four-legged family members. Other features include LED lighting in the cages, a retractable awning for shade, air conditioning, a small refrigerator, sink, and storage compartments. A meet-and-greet room for cats is a space for adopters to bond and a play with cats.

The vehicle is the generous gift to the shelter from an anonymous donor. The external design was created by Jessica Gonzales, Marketing and Outreach Coordinator for ACS.

The Mobile Adoption Vehicle rolled out for the first time at the June 20 City Council meeting where a Facebook Live broadcast showcased ACS staff and many great adoptable animals. # Know Your Long Beach Parks: Marine Stadium



Marine Stadium is located in Alamitos Bay southeast from Loynes Drive at Marina Vista Park. The site was acquired by the City of Long Beach in 1923 in a purchase that included Recreation Park and Colorado Lagoon. The original Alamitos Bay estuary land was dredged to create Marine Stadium in 1925 and extended in 1932 to host the 1932 Olympic rowing events.



Marine Stadium became a California State Historic Site in April 1996. It was the first manmade rowing course in the United States. Its width allowed four teams to race abreast, eliminating additional heats and allowing oarsmen to enter the finals at the peak of their form. Marine Stadium was also the venue for the 1968 and 1976 United States men's Olympic rowing trials and the 1984 United States women's Olympic rowing trials. Today the facility is a training and competitive site for rowers of all levels including National and Olympic teams.

The 106.4-acre facility is one of the world's premier water skiing facilities. The Southern California Speedboat Club has held professional power boat races at Marine Stadium since 1946 including the "Long Beach Sprint Nationals" held annually in August featuring flat bottom and tunnel boats. One of the largest dragon boat competitions



in California is held every summer at Marine Stadium. The two-day event features Chinese traditional art demonstrations, Chinese Acrobats, traditional dance, hip hop, music and martial arts performances.

The Marine Stadium Reserve is an area that is reestablishing some of the wetlands habitat that formerly existed in Alamitos Bay. These areas are important as nurseries for many fish species including game fish, and feeding areas for local and migratory birds.



The Marine Stadium Local Harvest Farmers' Market is held every Wednesday and offers Certified California grown fruits and vegetables, fresh cooked fare vendors, gourmet specialty foods, and arts, crafts and jewelry from local area vendors.

Marine Stadium is a popular location for company picnics and private parties. The amenities include a sandy beach (no swimming), restrooms, picnic areas, boat launch ramps and ample parking. For more information, call 562.570.3236.
