**RE: LAHSA SPA 8 Winter Shelter Report Narrative**

The LAHSA SPA 8 Winter Shelter Program, operated by the Long Beach Rescue Mission from December 1, 2008 came to a successful completion on the morning of March 16, 2009.

We are proud to say that this operating year ran seamlessly and without serious incidents. This is due, in part, to having a very strong team of staff and administrators, and their commitment to mitigate concerns.

In collaboration with local social service agencies and community partners, hygiene items and donated clothing were frequently made available to clients. Mental health workers from The Village program were on-site nightly to speak with clients and provide information and mental health referrals. A representative from the VA program was also on-site several times a week to work with veterans, and was able to get several clients into transitional housing and other programs.

By all accounts, the community at large was pleased with the overall management of the shelter. LBRM applied due diligence in the upkeep of the neighborhood and a "good neighbor" policy. The shelter surroundings were kept clean and orderly, with no complaints from the neighbors sharing our building. Training was provided to staff in order to reduce calls for emergency services, thus reducing cost to the city and local healthcare agencies.

Case management services were provided both at the shelter in the evenings, as well as at the Multi-Service Center during the day, where clients were also able to shower and take advantage of other services such as mail, phones, and information and referrals. The Multi-Service Center also provided a space for Winter Shelter case managers to provide services to families experiencing homelessness. I will take this opportunity to put in a plug for the city's continued funding of these critical services, as well as the LBPD Quality of Life Team.

A total of 960 unduplicated individuals were served at the Lemon Avenue site, and 21 bed/nights at the Long Beach Rescue Mission were used for overflow, which was offered to all clients when an overflow condition existed; which was about 20 of the 95 nights.



Vouchering to City Center, Colonial, and Aqua Venture Motels and Americana Restaurant (who provided fantastic service to our clients), was provided to 106 families, representing 201 children, and 6 special needs individuals.

148 households were served, and 31 families and 46 individuals were able to be placed within some form of housing or transitional programs, which exceeded LAHSA's target percentage for our program for the third year in a row. We acquired last known zip code information from most clients through January 15<sup>th</sup> and families vouchers through March. As you will see on the maps, clients came from the SPA 8 Area and other county locations. The shelter was included in county 211 service requests, thereby increasing the number of clients and area served. That does not negate the fact that our clientele comes from every part of our city.


In the last weeks of the Winter Shelter program, the case managers worked especially hard to find housing placements for clients. Many clients were placed in transitional housing programs and worked with other service providers to find employment and links to other services.

We also operated a Rainy Day Shelter for the Coalition for the Homeless of Long Beach, which was open 16 days and served 837 persons (duplicated #).

We had a staff get-together at the end of the shelter which many staff attended. They were able to share their experiences of working at the shelter and how it had also changed their lives.

In all, the Winter Shelter was a positive and smooth experience this season, kept many people off the street and in a warm and safe environment, and provided an opportunity for many to take advantage of available services and programs.

A number of individuals at the shelter had also been arranging their own housing without the help of a case manager before the winter shelter program ended. Those individuals are not included in the numbers reported above. Our placements for families continued to be somewhat disappointing, as 8 of the 11 families vouchered this month did not follow through with services and it is unknown where they went after receiving a voucher. For those that followed through, two went to transitional housing programs and one to an emergency shelter program. Overall, the program went very well.</u></p>

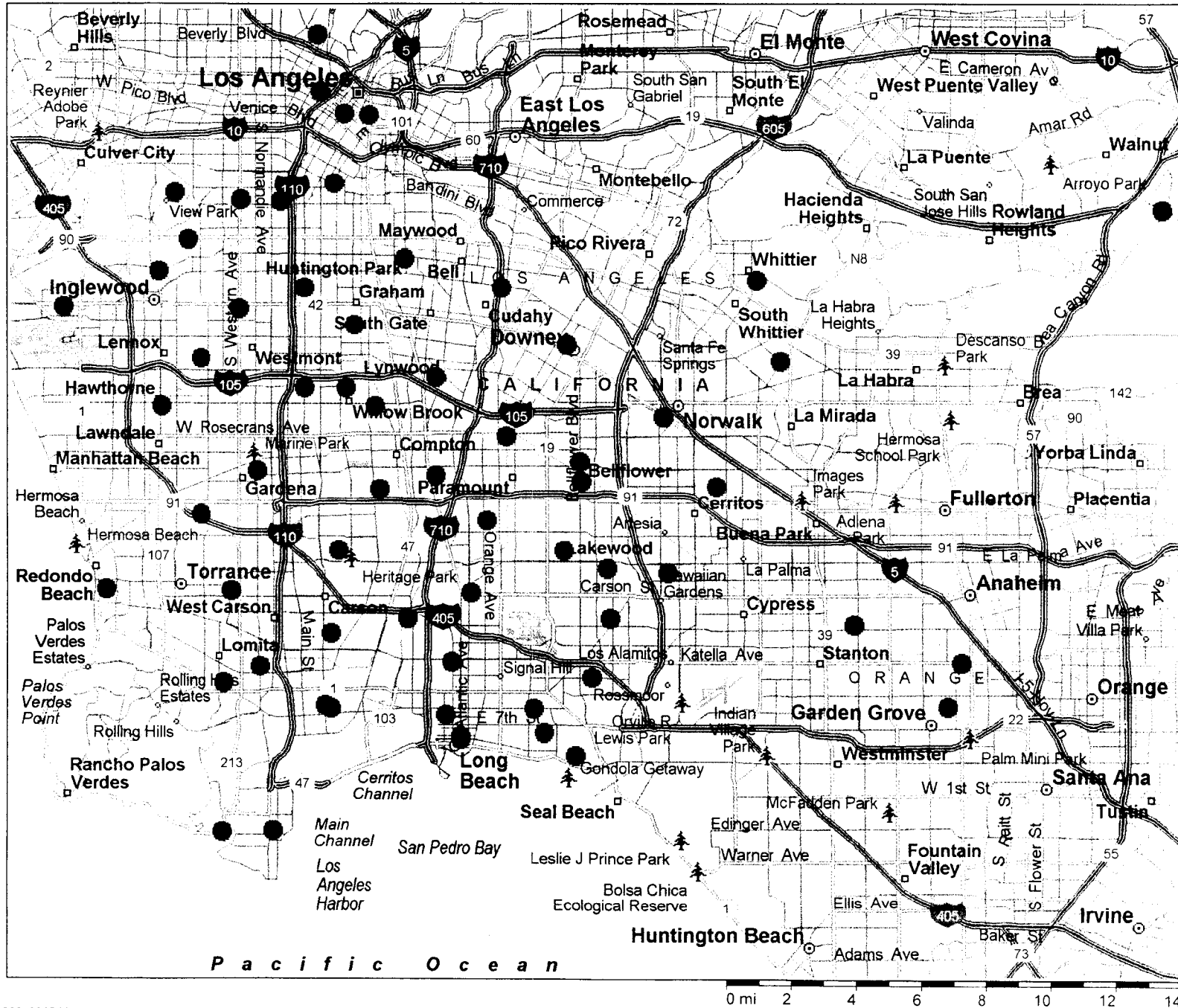

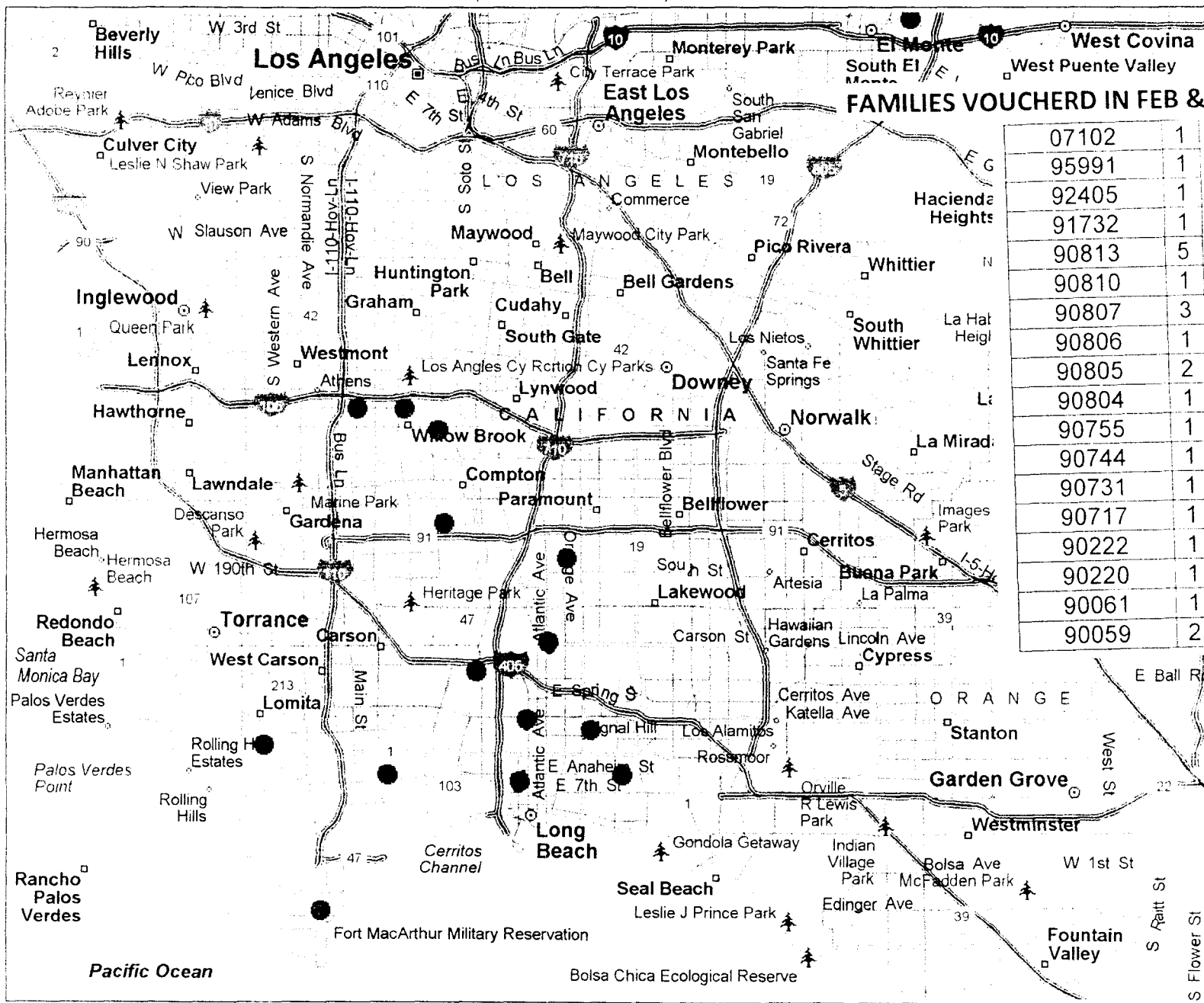
