Small Business Attraction & Retention



Mission Statement

 Build an economic ecosystem that supports business attraction, expansion, and retention to attract, start, and grow successful businesses – from small businesses to large corporations.



Objectives

- 1. Establish benchmarks and increase year-over-year numbers for businesses attraction, expansion, and retention in the City of Long Beach.
- 2. Increase number and percentage of business owners who report that City is business friendly (through small business monitor and other customer surveys).
- 3. Increase availability and access to high-speed internet for small businesses and workers in the City of Long Beach.
- 4. Expand public-private partnerships for small business technical assistance with a special focus on underserved and underrepresented communities.
- 5. Increase access to capital at all stages of growth in a business.
- 6. Increase environmentally sustainable business practices.



Recommendations

- 1. Continue to fund Small Business Monitor Survey through CSULB and create a business owner customer satisfaction survey for new and existing small businesses in the City.
- 2. Establish Business Resource Centers for small businesses that provide education/training programs, advisory services, workforce development services, access to capital, and access to City resources. Focus on underserved areas, centrally located to businesses; and, quality, user-friendly, and inclusive customer service.
- 3. Implement a culture of 'YES' to providing City services and a pathway of timely solutions for businesses that are moving to, starting, and growing in the City.
- 4. Strengthen Business Improvement Districts (BIDs) by helping them identify sustainable funding streams to maintain their service levels, access training opportunities to build capacity, and clearly documenting collective impact.
- 5. Incentivize local businesses to apply for contracts with the City by strengthening preferential procurement opportunities and technical assistance for local businesses.

Recommendations

- 6. Develop and implement plans for access to high-speed internet, hardware, and digital literacy training to facilitate business development and growth.
- 7. Augment access to capital by attracting capital investors, lenders, and innovative new funding methods to address the need for capital at all stages of growth in the business life cycle.
- 8. Create systems to inform and train businesses on contracting opportunities in the region; specifically, 2028 Olympics and other mega events.
- 9. Grow public-private partnerships to attract and retain innovative technology startups in industry growth areas. Include partnership with California State University Long Beach, Long Beach Accelerator, and capital investors.
- 10. Establish a vision and strategies for business attraction and retention while engaging the community and key stakeholders in business and economic growth in the City.



Focus Area Recommendations

Recommendations

- 6. Create an inclusive economic environment that advances women and minority owned businesses through technical assistance, contracting opportunities, and pathways to business resources.
- 7. Lead and activate strategies to address the loss of office workforce, increase in telecommuting, and online purchase with transformational solutions for use of excess office and retail spaces.
- 8. Augment local economic recovery efforts that address the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic on small businesses.
- 9. Study and track economic impact of climate change and environment on community and businesses.
- Allocate a portion of City fees and taxes collected from businesses for economic development activities, small business technical assistance, and business resources.
