3 AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE  
4 CITY OF LONG BEACH AMENDING THE LONG BEACH  
5 MUNICIPAL CODE BY ADDING CHAPTER 5.87 TO  
6 IMPLEMENT THE STATE COMPASSIONATE USE ACT  
7 AND STATE MEDICAL MARIJUANA PROGRAM ACT.  
8

9 WHEREAS, California voters approved the Compassionate Use Act  
10 ("CUA") in 1996 to exempt seriously ill patients and their primary caregivers from  
11 criminal liability for possession and cultivation of marijuana for medical purposes; and

12 WHEREAS, the Medical Marijuana Program Act of 2003 ("MMPA")  
13 provides for the association of primary caregivers and qualified patients to cultivate  
14 marijuana for specified medical purposes and also authorizes local governing bodies to  
15 adopt and enforce laws consistent with its provisions; and

16 WHEREAS, there have been recent reports from the Long Beach Police  
17 Department and the media of increasing numbers of medical marijuana dispensaries  
18 operating in the City of Long Beach; and

19 WHEREAS, medical marijuana that has not been collectively or  
20 personally grown may constitute a unique health hazard to the public because, unlike  
21 all other ingestibles, marijuana is not regulated, inspected, or analyzed for  
22 contamination by state or federal government and may contain harmful chemicals that  
23 could further endanger the health of persons already seriously ill; and

24 WHEREAS, the City of Long Beach has a compelling interest in protecting  
25 the public health, safety and welfare of its residents and businesses, in preserving the  
26 peace and quiet of the neighborhoods in which medical marijuana collectives operate,  
27 and in providing compassionate access to medical marijuana to its seriously ill  
28 residents;

1 NOW, THEREFORE, the City Council of the City of Long Beach ordains  
2 as follows:

3  
4 Section 1. Chapter 5.87 is added to the Long Beach Municipal Code to  
5 read as follows:

6 Chapter 5.87

7 MEDICAL MARIJUANA COLLECTIVE

8  
9 5.87.010 Purpose and intent.

10 A. It is the purpose and intent of this Chapter to regulate the  
11 collective cultivation of medical marijuana in order to ensure the health,  
12 safety and welfare of the residents of the City of Long Beach. The  
13 regulations in this Chapter, in compliance with the State Compassionate  
14 Use Act and the State Medical Marijuana Program Act ("State Law"), do  
15 not interfere with a patient's right to use medical marijuana as authorized  
16 under State Law, nor do they criminalize the possession or cultivation of  
17 Medical Marijuana by specifically defined classifications of persons, as  
18 authorized under State Law. Under State Law, only qualified patients,  
19 persons with identification cards, and primary caregivers may legally  
20 cultivate medical marijuana collectively. Medical marijuana collectives  
21 shall comply with all provisions of the Long Beach City Municipal Code  
22 ("LBMC"), State Law, and all other applicable local and state laws.

23 Nothing in this Chapter purports to permit activities that are otherwise  
24 illegal under federal, state, or local law.

25  
26 5.87.015 Definitions.

27 Unless the particular provision or the context otherwise requires,  
28 the definitions and provisions contained in this Section shall govern the



1 construction, meaning, and application of words and phrases as used in  
2 this Chapter:

3 A. "Medical Marijuana Collective Permit" as used in this  
4 Chapter is defined to mean the permit issued by the Director of Financial  
5 Management following a public hearing to allow a Medical Marijuana  
6 Collective operation.

7 B. "Attending Physician" shall have the same definition as given  
8 such term in California Health and Safety Code Section 11362.7, as may  
9 be amended, and which defines "Attending Physician" as an individual  
10 who possesses a license in good standing to practice medicine or  
11 osteopathy issued by the Medical Board of California or the Osteopathic  
12 Medical Board of California and who has taken responsibility for an aspect  
13 of the medical care, treatment, diagnosis, counseling, or referral of a  
14 patient and who has conducted a medical examination of that patient  
15 before recording in the patient's medical record the physician's  
16 assessment of whether the patient has a serious medical condition and  
17 whether the medical use of marijuana is appropriate.

18 C. "Chief of Police" as used in this Chapter is defined to mean  
19 the Chief of the Long Beach Police Department or her/his designee.

20 D. "Concentrated Cannabis" shall have the same definition as  
21 given such term in California Health and Safety Code Section 11006.5, as  
22 may be amended, and which defines "Concentrated Cannabis" as the  
23 separated resin, whether crude or purified, obtained from marijuana.

24 E. "Director of Financial Management" as used in this Chapter  
25 is defined to mean the Director of Financial Management for the City of  
26 Long Beach or her/his designee.

27 F. "Edible Medical Marijuana" as used in this Chapter is  
28 defined to mean any article used for food, drink, confectionery, condiment



1 or chewing gum by human beings whether such article is simple, mixed or  
2 compound, which contains physician recommended quantities of Medical  
3 Marijuana, and is produced on-site at a Collective permitted pursuant to  
4 this Chapter within the City of Long Beach.

5 G. "Identification Card" shall have the same definition as given  
6 such term in California Health and Safety Code Section 11362.7, as may  
7 be amended, and which defines "Identification Card" as a document  
8 issued by the State Department of Health Services which identifies a  
9 person authorized to engage in the medical use of marijuana, and  
10 identifies the person's designated primary caregiver, if any.

11 H. "Management Member" means a Medical Marijuana  
12 Collective member with responsibility for the establishment, organization,  
13 registration, supervision, or oversight of the operation of a Collective,  
14 including but not limited to members who perform the functions of  
15 president, vice president, director, operating officer, financial officer,  
16 secretary, treasurer, or manager of the Collective.

17 I. "Marijuana" shall have the same definition as given such  
18 term in California Health and Safety Code Section 11018, as may be  
19 amended, and which defines "Marijuana" as all parts of the plant  
20 Cannabis sativa L., whether growing or not; the seeds thereof; the resin  
21 extracted from any part of the plant; and every compound, manufacture,  
22 salt, derivative, mixture, or preparation of the plant, its seeds or resin. It  
23 does not include the mature stalks of the plant, fiber produced from the  
24 stalks, oil or cake made from the seeds of the plant, any other compound,  
25 manufacture, salt, derivative, mixture, or preparation of the mature stalks  
26 (except the resin extracted therefrom), fiber, oil, or cake, or the sterilized  
27 seed of the plant which is incapable of germination.  
28



1 J. "Medical Marijuana" means Marijuana used for medical  
2 purposes in accordance with California Health and Safety Code Sections  
3 11362.5, *et seq.*

4 K. "Medical Marijuana Collective" ("Collective") means an  
5 incorporated or unincorporated association, composed of four (4) or more  
6 Qualified Patients and their designated Primary Caregivers who associate  
7 at a particular location or Property to collectively or cooperatively cultivate  
8 Marijuana for medical purposes ~~or and~~ distribute said Medical Marijuana  
9 to Collective members and Management Members, in accordance with  
10 California Health and Safety Code Sections 11362.5, *et seq.* For  
11 purposes of this Chapter, the term Medical Marijuana "cooperative" shall  
12 have the same meaning as Medical Marijuana Collective.

13 L. "Primary Caregiver" shall have the same definition as given  
14 such term in California Health and Safety Code Sections 11362.5 and  
15 11362.7 (as set forth in Appendix A of this Chapter), as may be amended,  
16 and which define "Primary Caregiver" as an individual, designated by a  
17 Qualified Patient, who has consistently assumed responsibility for the  
18 housing, health, or safety of that Qualified Patient.

19 M. "Property" as used in this Chapter means the location ~~or~~  
20 locations at which the Medical Marijuana Collective members and  
21 Management Members associate to collectively or cooperatively cultivate  
22 ~~or and~~ distribute Medical Marijuana exclusively for the Collective  
23 members and Management Members.

24 N. "Qualified Patient" means a person who is entitled to the  
25 protections of Health and Safety Code Section 11362.5 for patients who  
26 obtain and use marijuana for medical purposes upon the recommendation  
27 of an Attending Physician, whether or not that person applied for and  
28 received a valid Identification Card issued pursuant to State Law.



1 O. "Reasonable Compensation" means compensation  
2 commensurate with reasonable wages and benefits paid to employees of  
3 IRS-qualified non-profit organizations who have similar job descriptions  
4 and duties, required level of education and experience, prior individual  
5 earnings history, and number of hours worked. The payment of a bonus  
6 shall not be considered "Reasonable Compensation."

7 P. "State Law" means the state regulations set forth in the  
8 Compassionate Use Act and the Medical Marijuana Program Act, codified  
9 in California Health and Safety Code Sections 11362.5, *et seq.*

10  
11 5.87.020 Medical Marijuana Collective – Permit required.

12 No Medical Marijuana Collective, Management Member or member  
13 shall carry on, maintain or conduct any Medical Marijuana Collective  
14 related operations in the City without first obtaining a Medical Marijuana  
15 Collective Permit from the Department of Financial Management.

16  
17 5.87.030 Medical Marijuana Collective – Permit application process.

18 Any Medical Marijuana Collective desiring a Permit required by this  
19 Chapter shall, prior to initiating operations, complete and file an  
20 application on a form supplied by the Department of Financial  
21 Management, and shall submit with the completed application payment of  
22 a nonrefundable processing and notification fee, as established by the City  
23 Council by resolution. The Medical Marijuana Collective Permit application  
24 is established to provide a review process for each proposed Medical  
25 Marijuana Collective operation within the City.

26 A. Filing. The Medical Marijuana Collective shall provide the  
27 following information:

28 1. The address of the Property or Properties where the



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1 proposed Medical Marijuana Collective will operate.

2 2. A site plan describing the Property with fully  
3 dimensioned interior and exterior floor plans including electrical,  
4 mechanical, plumbing, and disabled access compliance pursuant to Title  
5 24 of the State of California Code of Regulations and the federally  
6 mandated Americans with Disabilities Act.

7 3. Exterior photographs of the entrance(s), exit(s), street  
8 frontage(s), parking, front, rear and side(s) of the proposed Property.

9 4. Photographs depicting the entire interior of the proposed  
10 Property.

11 5. If the Property is being rented or leased or is being  
12 purchased under contract, a copy of such lease or contract.

13 6. If the Property is being rented or leased, written proof  
14 that the Property owner, and landlord if applicable, were given notice that  
15 the Property will be used as a Medical Marijuana Collective, and that the  
16 Property owner, and landlord if applicable, agree(s) to said operations.

17 7. The name, address, telephone number, title and  
18 function(s) of each Management Member.

19 8. For each Management Member, a fully legible copy  
20 of one (1) valid government issued form of photo identification, such as a  
21 State Driver's License or Identification Card.

22 9. Written confirmation as to whether the Medical  
23 Marijuana Collective previously operated in this or any other county, city  
24 or state under a similar license/permit, and whether the Collective  
25 applicant ever had such a license/permit revoked or suspended and the  
26 reason(s) therefore.

27 10. If the Medical Marijuana Collective is a corporation, a  
28 certified copy of the Collective's Secretary of State Articles of

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1 Incorporation, Certificate(s) of Amendment, Statement(s) of Information  
2 and a copy of the Collective's By laws.

3 11. If the Medical Marijuana Collective is an unincorporated  
4 association, a copy of the Articles of Association.

5 12. The name and address of the applicant's current Agent for  
6 Service of Process.

7 13. A copy of the Medical Marijuana Collective operating  
8 conditions, listed in Section 5.87.040, containing a statement dated and  
9 signed by each Management Member, under penalty of perjury, that they  
10 read, understand and shall ensure compliance with the aforementioned  
11 operating conditions.

12 14. A copy of the Prohibited Activity, listed in Section 5.87.090,  
13 containing a statement dated and signed by each Management Member, under  
14 penalty of perjury, that they read, understand and shall ensure that neither the  
15 Collective nor its members and Management Members shall engage in the  
16 aforementioned prohibited activity.

17 15. A statement dated and signed by each Management  
18 Member, under penalty of perjury, that the Management Member has  
19 personal knowledge of the information contained in the application, that the  
20 information contained therein is true and correct, and that the application  
21 has been completed under the supervision of the Management Member(s);

22 16. Whether Edible Medical Marijuana will be prepared at the  
23 proposed Property.

24 17. The property address where any Medical Marijuana will be  
25 cultivated by the Collective within the boundaries of the City of Long Beach.

26 B. The Director of Financial Management shall ensure that the  
27 application is complete as follows:

28 1. Within ten (10) business days of receipt of a Medical



1 Marijuana Collective Permit application, except where circumstances  
2 beyond the control of the City justifiably delay such response, the Director  
3 of Financial Management shall determine whether the application is  
4 complete.

5 2. If it is determined the application is incomplete, the  
6 applicant shall be notified in writing within ten (10) business days of the  
7 date the application is determined to be incomplete, except where  
8 circumstances beyond the control of the City justifiably delay such  
9 response, that the application is not complete and the reasons therefore,  
10 including any additional information necessary to render the application  
11 complete.

12 3. The Collective shall have thirty (30) calendar days  
13 from the date of notice set forth above in Subsection 5.87.030(B),  
14 Subsection (2) to complete the application. Failure to do so within the  
15 thirty (30) day period shall render the application null and void.

16 4. Within ten (10) business days following the receipt of  
17 an amended application or supplemental information, except where  
18 circumstances beyond the control of the City justifiably delay such  
19 response, the Director of Financial Management shall again determine  
20 whether the application is complete in accordance with the procedures set  
21 forth above. Evaluation and notification shall occur as provided above  
22 until such time as the application is found to be complete or in the  
23 alternative null and void.

24 5. Once the application is found to be complete, the  
25 applicant shall be notified within ten (10) business days, except where  
26 circumstances beyond the control of the City justifiably delay such  
27 response, of that fact.

28 6. All notices required by this Chapter shall be deemed



1 issued upon the date they are either deposited in the United States mail  
2 or the date upon which personal service of such notice is provided.

3 C. On receipt of the completed Medical Marijuana Collective  
4 Permit application, the Director of Financial Management shall refer the  
5 application to all concerned City departments, including, but not limited to,  
6 Police, Fire, Health, Development Services and Code Enforcement for  
7 investigation. Such departments shall file a report providing  
8 recommendations regarding the approval or denial of the permit with the  
9 Director of Financial Management within sixty (60) calendar days after the  
10 completed application is filed, except where circumstances beyond the  
11 control of the City justifiably delay such response.

12 D. The Director of Financial Management shall cause a hearing  
13 to be conducted not later than sixty (60) days from the date the completed  
14 Permit application was submitted, except where circumstances beyond  
15 the control of the City justifiably delay said timeframe, and shall cause the  
16 owners of property located within seven-hundred-and-fifty-feet (750') of  
17 the proposed Property to be sent advance notice of the date, time, and  
18 place of the hearing. The applicant shall be given at least ten (10)  
19 business days written notice of such hearing.

20 E. The Director of Financial Management shall render her/his  
21 decision not later than fifteen (15) days after the hearing is closed. The  
22 report shall be in writing and shall include findings of fact, including but not  
23 limited to each operating condition set forth in Section 5.87.040, a  
24 summary of the relevant evidence, a statement of the issues, a resolution  
25 of the credibility of witnesses where there is conflicting testimony and a  
26 recommended decision. A copy of the report shall be served on all parties.

27 F. The decision of the Director of Financial Management may  
28 be appealed to the City Council within ten (10) calendar days from the



1 date the written notice of Permit decision was mailed. The request for  
2 appeal shall be in writing, shall set forth the specific ground(s) on which it  
3 is based and shall be submitted to the Director of Financial Management  
4 along with an appeal deposit in an amount determined by the City Council  
5 by resolution.

6 G. The City Council shall conduct a hearing on the appeal or refer the  
7 matter to a hearing officer, pursuant to Chapter 2.93 of this Code, within thirty  
8 (30) business days from the date the completed request for appeal was received  
9 by the Director of Financial Management, except where good cause exists to  
10 extend this period. The appellant shall be given at least ten (10) business days  
11 written notice of such hearing. The hearing and rules of evidence shall be  
12 conducted pursuant to Chapter 2.93 of this Code. The determination of the City  
13 Council on the appeal shall be final.

14  
15 5.87.040 Medical Marijuana Collective Permit approval and operating  
16 conditions.

17 The Director of Financial Management shall approve and issue a  
18 Medical Marijuana Collective Permit if the application and evidence  
19 submitted in the hearing, conducted pursuant to Section 5.87.030,  
20 Subdivisions (D) and (E) as set forth above, sufficiently demonstrate that:

21 A. The Property is not located in an area zoned in the City for  
22 exclusive residential use. Medical Marijuana Collectives are not permitted  
23 to operate in exclusive residential zones as established pursuant to Title  
24 21 of this Code.

25  
26 B. The Medical Marijuana Collective is not located within a one  
27 thousand five hundred foot (1,500') radius of a public or private high  
28 school or within a five hundred foot (500') radius of a public or private



1 kindergarten, elementary, middle or junior high school. The distances  
2 specified in this subdivision shall be determined by the horizontal distance  
3 measured in a straight line from the property line of the school to the  
4 closest property line of the lot on which the Medical Marijuana Collective  
5 is located, without regard to intervening structures.

6 C. The Medical Marijuana Collective is not located within a one  
7 thousand foot (1,000') radius of any other Medical Marijuana Collective.  
8 The distance specified in this subdivision shall be determined by the  
9 horizontal distance measured in a straight line from the property line of  
10 any other Medical Marijuana Collective, to the closest property line of the  
11 lot on which the permitted Medical Marijuana Collective is located, without  
12 regard to intervening structures.

13 D. Exterior building and parking area lighting at the Property  
14 are in compliance with all applicable provisions of this Code.

15 E. Any exterior or interior signs visible from the exterior of the  
16 Property shall be unlighted.

17 F. Windows and roof hatches at the Property shall be secured  
18 so as to prevent unauthorized entry, and are equipped with latches that  
19 may be released quickly from the inside to allow exit in the event of  
20 emergency and are in compliance with all applicable building code  
21 provisions.

22 G. The Property provides sufficient sound absorbing insulation  
23 so that noise generated inside the premises is not audible anywhere on  
24 the adjacent property or public rights-of-way, or within any other building  
25 or other separate unit within the same building as the Medical Marijuana  
26 Collective.

27 H. The Property provides a sufficient odor absorbing ventilation  
28 and exhaust system so that odor generated inside the Property is not



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1 detected outside the Property, anywhere on adjacent property or public  
2 rights-of-way, or within any other unit located within the same building as  
3 the Medical Marijuana Collective.

4 I. The Property is monitored at all times by closed-circuit  
5 television for security purposes. The camera and recording system must  
6 be of adequate quality, color rendition and resolution to allow the ready  
7 identification of an individual on or adjacent to the Property. The  
8 recordings shall be maintained at the Property for a period of not less than  
9 thirty (30) days.

10 J. The Property has a centrally-monitored fire and burglar  
11 alarm system.

12 K. A sign is posted in a conspicuous location inside the  
13 Property advising:

14 1. "The diversion of marijuana for non-medical purposes  
15 is a violation of State law.

16 2. The use of marijuana may impair a person's ability to  
17 drive a motor vehicle or operate heavy machinery.

18 3. Loitering at the location of a Medical Marijuana  
19 Collective for an illegal purpose is prohibited by California Penal Code  
20 Section 647(h).

21 4. This Medical Marijuana Collective is permitted in  
22 accordance with the laws of the City of Long Beach.

23 5. The sale of marijuana and the diversion of marijuana  
24 for non-medical purposes are violations of State Law."

25 L. Each applicant ~~electing to manufacture manufacturing~~ Edible  
26 Medical Marijuana shall manufacture the Edible ~~products Medical~~  
27 ~~Marijuana products at the Property~~ for the sole consumption by Qualified  
28



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1 Patient members and Qualified Patient Management Members of the  
2 Collective, in compliance with all applicable state and local laws.

3 M. The Medical Marijuana Collective meets all applicable state  
4 and local laws to ensure that the operations of the Collective are  
5 consistent with the protection of the health, safety and welfare of the  
6 community, Qualified Patients and their Primary Caregivers, and will not  
7 adversely affect surrounding uses.

8 N. No Collective shall operate for profit. Cash and in-kind  
9 contributions, reimbursements, and reasonable compensation provided by  
10 Management Members and members towards the Collective's actual  
11 expenses of the growth, cultivation, and provision of Medical Marijuana  
12 shall be allowed provided that they are in strict compliance with State Law.  
13 All such cash and in-kind amounts and items shall be fully documented in  
14 accordance with Section 5.87.060 of this Chapter.

15 O. If the cultivation of Marijuana by the Medical Marijuana  
16 Collective is to take place within the City of Long Beach at a location other  
17 than the location where the medical marijuana is distributed, then the  
18 location of cultivation shall likewise fully comply with the provisions of  
19 Section 5.87.040 and all of its subsections.

20 P. Every Medical Marijuana Collective shall maintain, on-site at  
21 the Property, cultivation records, signed under penalty of perjury by each  
22 Management Member, identifying the location within the City of Long  
23 Beach at which the Medical Marijuana was cultivated, and the total  
24 number of said plants cultivated at each location;

25 Q. Representative samples of Medical Marijuana distributed by  
26 the Collective shall be analyzed by an independent laboratory to ensure it  
27 is free of harmful pesticides and other contaminants regulated by local,  
28 state or federal regulatory or statutory standards;



1                   R. Any Medical Marijuana from which the representative  
2 sample tested positive for a harmful pesticide or other contaminant at a  
3 level which exceeds the local, state, or federal regulatory or statutory  
4 standards shall be destroyed forthwith; and

5                   S. Any Medical Marijuana provided to Collective members shall  
6 be properly labeled in strict compliance with state and local laws.

7  
8 5.87.050 Medical Marijuana Collective Permit – Non transferable.

9                   A Medical Marijuana Collective Permit issued pursuant to this  
10 Chapter shall become null and void upon the cessation of the Collective  
11 and/or the relocation of the Collective to a different Property

12                   A. The following shall be deemed a change in location:

13                         1. Any relocation or expansion that includes a separate  
14 piece of property or parcel of land from the initially permitted Property.

15                         2. Any expansion of the initially permitted Property which  
16 represents a greater than fifty percent (50%) increase in the square  
17 footage of space devoted to public access or occupancy.

18                   B. The lawful conduct of activity regulated by this Chapter by a  
19 permittee shall be limited to those activities expressly indicated on the  
20 Medical Marijuana Collective Permit application.

21                   C. The holder of a Medical Marijuana Collective Permit shall  
22 not allow others to use or rent the permitted Property. An exception shall  
23 be made for persons who are not Collective members or Management  
24 Members and who possess a valid City issued business license which  
25 authorizes the "place to place" sale of soil and nutrients to the Collective  
26 members or Management Members for the collective cultivation of  
27 Medical Marijuana by members and/or Management Members of the  
28 Collective.



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5.87.060 Maintenance of records.

A. A Medical Marijuana Collective shall maintain the following accurate and truthful records on the Property:

1. The full name, address, and telephone number(s) of the owner, landlord and/or lessee of the Property.

2. The full name, address, and telephone number(s) and a fully legible copy of a government issued form of identification of each Collective member engaged in the management of the Collective and a description of the exact nature of the participation in the management of the Collective. Acceptable forms of government issued identification include, but are not limited to: Drivers licenses or photo identity cards issued by state Department of Motor Vehicles (or equivalent) that meets REAL ID benchmarks, a passport issued by the United States or by a foreign government, U.S. Military ID cards (active duty or retired military and their dependents), or a Permanent Resident Card.

3. The full name, address, and telephone number(s) of each Collective member and Management Member who participates in the Collective cultivation of Medical Marijuana.

4. The full name, date of birth, residential address, and telephone number(s) of each Collective member and Management Member; the date each member and Management Member joined the Collective; the exact nature of each member's and Management Member's participation in the Collective; and the status of each member and Management Member as a Qualified Patient or Primary Caregiver.

5. A written accounting of all cash and in-kind contributions, reimbursements, and reasonable compensation provided by



1 the Collective Management Members and members to the Collective, and  
2 all expenditures and costs incurred by the Collective.

3 6. An inventory record documenting the dates and  
4 amounts of Medical Marijuana cultivated at the Property, and the daily  
5 amounts of Marijuana stored on the Property.

6 7. Proof of a valid Medical Marijuana Collective Permit  
7 issued by the Department of Financial Management in conformance with  
8 this Chapter.

9 8. A list of Prohibited Activity, set forth in Section 5.87.090,  
10 containing a statement dated and signed by each Collective member and  
11 Management Member, under penalty of perjury, that they read, understand and  
12 shall not engage in the aforementioned prohibited activity.

13 B. These records shall be maintained by the Medical Marijuana  
14 Collective for a period of five (5) years and shall be made available by the  
15 Collective to the City upon request, subject to the authority set forth in  
16 Section 5.87.070.

17  
18 5.87.070 Inspection authority.

19 City representatives may enter and inspect the Property of every  
20 Medical Marijuana Collective between the hours of ten o'clock (10:00)  
21 A.M. and eight o'clock (8:00) P.M., or at any reasonable time to ensure  
22 compliance and enforcement of the provisions of this Chapter, except that  
23 the inspection and copying of private medical records shall be made  
24 available to the Police Department only pursuant to a properly executed  
25 search warrant, subpoena, or court order. It is unlawful for any Property  
26 owner, landlord, lessee, Medical Marijuana Collective member or  
27 Management Member or any other person having any responsibility over  
28 the operation of the Medical Marijuana Collective to refuse to allow,



1 impede, obstruct or interfere with an inspection.

2  
3 5.87.080 Existing Medical Marijuana operations.

4 Any existing Medical Marijuana Collective, dispensary, operator,  
5 establishment, or provider that does not comply with the requirements of  
6 this Chapter must immediately cease operation until such time, if any,  
7 when it complies fully with the requirements of this Chapter. No Medical  
8 Marijuana Collective, dispensary, operator, establishment, or provider that  
9 existed prior to the enactment of this Chapter shall be deemed to be a  
10 legally established use or a legal non-conforming use under the provisions  
11 of this Chapter or the Code.

12  
13 5.87.090 Prohibited activity.

14 A. It is unlawful for any person to cause, permit or engage in  
15 the cultivation, possession, distribution, exchange or giving away of  
16 Marijuana for medical or non medical purposes except as provided in this  
17 Chapter, and pursuant to any and all other applicable local and state law.

18 B. It is unlawful for any person to cause, permit or engage in  
19 any activity related to Medical Marijuana except as provided in this  
20 Chapter and in Health and Safety Code Sections 11362.5 *et seq.*, and  
21 pursuant to any and all other applicable local and state law.

22 C. It is unlawful for any person to knowingly make any false,  
23 misleading or inaccurate statement or representation in any form, record,  
24 filing or documentation required to be maintained, filed or provided to the  
25 City under this Chapter.

26 D. No Medical Marijuana Collective, Management Member or  
27 member shall cause or permit the sale, distribution or exchange of  
28 Medical Marijuana ~~cultivated at the Property~~ or of any Edible Medical



1 Marijuana product ~~manufactured at the Property~~ to any non Collective  
2 Management Member or member.

3 E. No Medical Marijuana Collective, Management Member or  
4 member shall allow or permit the commercial sale of any product, good or  
5 service, including but not limited to drug paraphernalia identified in Health  
6 and Safety Code Section 11364, on or at the Medical Marijuana  
7 Collective, in the parking area of the Property. An exception shall be  
8 made for persons who are not Collective members or Management  
9 Members and who possess a valid City issued business license which  
10 authorizes the "place to place" sale of soil and nutrients to the Collective,  
11 Management Members or members for the collective cultivation of  
12 Medical Marijuana by Management Members and members of the  
13 Collective.

14 F. No cultivation of Medical Marijuana at the Property shall be  
15 visible with the naked eye from any public or other private property, nor  
16 shall cultivated Medical Marijuana or dried Medical Marijuana be visible  
17 from the building exterior. No cultivation shall occur at the Property  
18 unless the area devoted to the cultivation is secured from public access  
19 by means of a locked gate and any other security measures necessary to  
20 prevent unauthorized entry.

21 G. No manufacture of Concentrated Cannabis in violation of  
22 California Health and Safety Code Section 11379.6 is allowed.

23 H. No Medical Marijuana Collective shall be open to or provide  
24 Medical Marijuana to its members or Management Members between the  
25 hours of eight o'clock (8:00) P.M. and ten o'clock (10:00) A.M.

26 ~~I. No sale of Medical Marijuana in any form including Edible  
27 Medical Marijuana products, shall be permitted.~~

28 ~~J.I.~~ No person under the age of eighteen (18) shall be allowed



1 at the Property, unless that minor is a Qualified Patient and is  
2 accompanied by his or her licensed Attending Physician, parent(s) or  
3 documented legal guardian.

4 ~~K. No Medical Marijuana Collective shall possess Marijuana~~  
5 ~~that was not cultivated by its Management Members or members either at~~  
6 ~~the Property or at its predecessor location fully permitted in accordance~~  
7 ~~with this Chapter.~~

8 J.L. No Medical Marijuana Collective, Management Member or  
9 member shall cause or permit the sale, dispensing, or consumption of  
10 alcoholic beverages on the Property or in the parking area of the Property.

11 K.M. No dried Medical Marijuana shall be stored at the Property  
12 in structures that are not completely enclosed, in an unlocked vault or  
13 safe, in any other unsecured storage structure, or in a safe or vault that is  
14 not bolted to the floor of the Property.

15 L.N. Medical Marijuana may not be inhaled, smoked, eaten,  
16 ingested, or otherwise consumed on the Property, in the parking areas of  
17 the Property, or in those areas restricted under the provisions of California  
18 Health and Safety Code Section 11362.79, which include:

- 19 1. Any place where smoking is prohibited by law;
- 20 2. Within one thousand feet (1,000') of the grounds of a  
21 school, recreation center, or youth center;
- 22 3. While on a school bus;
- 23 4. While in a motor vehicle that is being operated; or
- 24 5. While operating a boat.

25 M.O. Medical Marijuana Collective membership and Management  
26 Membership, established pursuant to this Chapter, shall be limited to one  
27 Collective fully permitted in accordance with this Chapter.

1            NP. No person who has been convicted within the previous ten  
2 (10) years of a felony or a crime of moral turpitude, or who is currently on  
3 parole or probation for the sale or distribution of a controlled substance,  
4 shall be engaged directly or indirectly in the management of the Medical  
5 Marijuana Collective nor, further, shall manage or handle the receipts and  
6 expenses of the Collective.

7  
8 5.87.100 Violation and enforcement.

9            A. Any person violating any provision of this Chapter or  
10 knowingly or intentionally misrepresenting any material fact in procuring  
11 the permit herein provided for, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor  
12 punishable by a fine of not more than one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) or  
13 by imprisonment for not more than twelve (12) months, or by both such  
14 fine and imprisonment.

15            B. Any person who engages in any Medical Marijuana  
16 Collective operations after a Medical Marijuana Collective Permit  
17 application has been denied, or a Medical Marijuana Collective Permit has  
18 been suspended or revoked, and before a new permit is issued, shall be  
19 guilty of a misdemeanor.

20            C. As a nuisance *per se*, any violation of this Chapter shall be  
21 subject to injunctive relief, revocation of the certificate of occupancy for  
22 the property, disgorgement and payment to the City of any and all monies  
23 unlawfully obtained, costs of abatement, costs of investigation, attorney  
24 fees, and any other relief or remedy available at law or equity. The City  
25 may also pursue any and all remedies and actions available and  
26 applicable under local and state law for any violations committed by the  
27 Medical Marijuana Collective, its Management Members, members or any  
28 person related or associated with the Collective.



1           D. Any violation of the terms and conditions of the Medical  
2 Marijuana Collective permit, of this Chapter, or of applicable local or state  
3 regulations and laws shall be grounds for permit suspension or  
4 revocation.

5  
6 5.87.110 Appeal process.

7           A. If a City department determines that the permittee failed to  
8 comply with any provision of this Chapter, or with any other provision or  
9 requirement of law, the Director of Financial Management shall revoke or  
10 suspend the Medical Marijuana Collective Permit in accordance with the  
11 provisions set forth in Section 5.06.020, Subsection A, of this Code.

12           B. The Director of Financial Management shall notify the  
13 permittee of the permit revocation or suspension by dated written notice.  
14 Said notice shall advise the permittee of the right to appeal the decision to  
15 the City Council. The request for appeal shall be in writing, shall set forth  
16 the specific ground(s) on which it is based and shall be submitted to the  
17 Director of Financial Management within ten (10) calendar days from the  
18 date the notice was mailed along with an appeal deposit in an amount  
19 determined by the City Council by resolution.

20           C. The City Council shall conduct a hearing on the appeal or  
21 refer the matter to a hearing officer, pursuant to Chapter 2.93 of this  
22 Code, within thirty (30) business days from the date the completed  
23 request for appeal was received by the Director of Financial Management,  
24 except where good cause exists to extend this period. The appellant shall  
25 be given at least ten (10) business days written notice of such hearing.  
26 The hearing and rules of evidence shall be conducted pursuant to  
27 Chapter 2.93 of this Code. The determination of the City Council on the  
28 appeal shall be final.



1 D. Whenever a Medical Marijuana Collective Permit has been  
2 revoked or suspended, no other such permit application shall be  
3 considered for a period of one (1) year from either the date notice of the  
4 revocation or suspension was mailed, or the date of the final decision of  
5 the City Council, whichever is later.

6  
7 5.87.120 Operative date.

8 This ordinance will be come effective one-hundred-and-twenty  
9 (120) days following its passage and adoption. The Department of  
10 Financial Management will accept completed Medical Marijuana Collective  
11 permit applications one-hundred-and-twenty (120) days prior to the  
12 effective date of this ordinance.

13  
14 5.87.130 Severability.

15 If any provision of this Chapter, or the application thereof to any  
16 person or circumstance, is held invalid, that invalidity shall not affect any  
17 other provision or application of this Chapter that can be given effect  
18 without the invalid provision or application; and to this end, the provisions  
19 or applications of this Chapter are severable.

20  
21 5.87.140 Review of Regulations.

22 On or before the first anniversary of the effective date of this  
23 Chapter, the City Council shall review the effectiveness of these  
24 regulations, and shall enact modifications, if necessary.

25  
26  
27 Section 2. The City Clerk shall certify to the passage of this Ordinance  
28 by the City Council and cause it to be posted in three conspicuous places in the City of



1 Long Beach, and it shall take effect on the thirty-first (31<sup>st</sup>) day after it is approved by  
2 the Mayor.
