Section 1. The Long Beach Municipal Code is amended by amending Table 32-1 related to Alcoholic Beverage Sales to read as follows:

Section 2. The Long Beach Municipal Code is amended by amending Table 32-1 Footnotes to read as follows:

Footnotes:

- (1) The following alcoholic beverage sales may be exempted from the conditional use permit requirement:
- a. Restaurants with alcoholic beverage service only with meals. This generally means any use with a fixed bar is not exempt. A service bar is not considered a fixed bar. A sushi bar, where alcoholic beverages are served at the same bar where meals are served, is considered serving alcoholic beverages only with meal service. A cocktail lounge without a bar, but with primarily service of only hors d'oeuvres and alcoholic beverages is not exempt. Any restaurant with more than thirty percent (30%) of gross sales consisting of alcoholic beverages shall lose its exemption and be required to obtain a conditional use permit to continue to sell alcohol.
 - b. Florist with accessory sale of alcoholic beverages.
 - c. Existing legal, nonconforming uses.

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Section 3. The Long Beach Municipal Code is amended by amending Table 32-1A pertaining to Alcohol Sales Uses, Taverns, and Entertainment Services to read as follows:

The Long Beach Municipal Code is amended by amending Section 4. Table 32-1A Footnote (b) to read as follows:

Footnotes

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- The following alcoholic beverage sales shall be exempted from the (b)conditional use permit requirement:
- 1. Restaurants with alcoholic beverage service only with meal. This generally means any use with a fixed bar is not exempt. A service bar is not considered a fixed bar. A sushi bar, where alcoholic beverages are served at the same bar where meals are served, is considered serving alcoholic beverages only with meal service. A cocktail lounge without a bar, but with primarily service of only hors d'oeuvres and alcoholic beverages is not exempt. Any restaurant with more than 30 percent of gross sales consisting of alcoholic beverage sales shall lose its exemption and be required to obtain a conditional use permit to continue to sell alcohol.
 - 2. Florist with accessory sale of alcoholic beverages.
 - 3. Existing legal, nonconforming uses.

Section 5. The City Clerk shall certify to the passage of this ordinance by the City Council and cause it to be posted in three (3) conspicuous places in the City of Long Beach, and it shall take effect on the thirty-first (31st) day after it is approved by the Mayor.
