## RESOLUTION NO. C-24600

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LONG BEACH CREATING AND ESTABLISHING THE HOMELESS SERVICES ADVISORY COMMITTEE

WHEREAS, the City Council desires to establish a Homeless Services Advisory Committee to review policies, programs and activities connected with services for homeless persons in Long Beach and to submit recommendations to the Mayor and City Council relating to such matters;

NOW, THEREFORE, the City Council of the City of Long Beach resolves as follows:

Section 1. Creation and Purpose. The Homeless Services Advisory Committee is hereby created and established for the purpose of reviewing existing or potential programs and services for homeless persons in the City of Long Beach and making policy recommendations to the Mayor and City Council regarding such matters.

Sec. 2. Members. The Committee shall be comprised of 11 members appointed by the Mayor with the confirmation of the City Council who shall be selected as follows:

- (a) Each Councilmember shall recommend one nominee to the Mayor; and
- (b) Two at-large members shall be selected by the Mayor.

If a member desires to resign from membership, said

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member shall immediately give written notification of his or her resignation to the chairperson and the Mayor. Any member of the Committee may be removed by the Mayor with the consent and approval of the City Council. If any member is absent from three consecutive meetings, whether regular or special, without consent expressed by a majority vote of the Committee in the official minutes of each meeting where an absence occurs, the member shall be deemed to have resigned from the ommittee, and the membership of said person shall be automatically terminated and his or her position on the Committee shall immediately become vacant.

In the event a vacancy occurs, the secretary to the Committee shall inform the Mayor's office, and the vacancy shall be filled in the same method and manner that the original member was selected and appointed.

Members shall serve without any compensation from the City.

Sec. 3. Organizational Matters and Meetings. Except as expressly provided in this resolution, the provisions of Chapter 2.18 of the Long Beach Municipal Code shall apply to the Committee and the performance of its duties. The Mayor shall select the first Committee chairperson and vice chairperson and shall call and schedule the initial meeting of the Committee in the month of December 1988. At such initial meeting the members shall select a regular meeting place and provide for the scheduling of future meetings. Whenever possible, all meetings of the Committee shall be held at a City-owned facility. The Mayor shall be notified of the meeting place selected by the Committee

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and the Committee's schedule of meetings. All meetings shall be open to the public and called and conducted in accordance with the Ralph M. Brown Act.

A majority of all the members of the Committee shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business. The affirmative vote of a majority of the members present at any meeting shall be required to adopt any motion.

Meetings shall be conducted in accordance with Robert's Rules of Order. The Committee may promulgate such rules consistent with Robert's Rules of Order which it deems necessary for the conduct of its business. All rules adopted by the Committee shall bear the signature of the presiding officer and shall be promptly filed in the City Clerk's office and copies shall be sent to the Mayor and the City Manager.

The City Clerk or her designee shall serve as the secretary to the Committee. Minutes of each meeting shall be kept and filed in the City Clerk's office, and copies of the minutes shall be sent to the Mayor and City Manager.

Sec. 4. Authority. The Committee shall serve and act only in the capacity of a collective advisory body to the City Council and neither the Committee nor any individual member thereof shall have any administrative or operational duties, functions or responsibilities. Nothing contained in any provision of this resolution shall be construed or deemed as investing in or conferring upon the Committee or any member thereof any supervisory power or authority over the actions, duties or responsibilities of the City or any of its officers, agents or employees or the operations of any of the City's

departments.

Sec. 5. This resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption by the City Council, and the City Clerk shall certify the vote adopting this resolution.
