1 The unrestricted admin fee operating reserve at 9/30/21 is \$21,236,528. There is net income for the current year in the amount of \$8,465,661, which is comprised of an increase in HCV HAP funding of \$713,245, administrative fee net income of \$5,155,271, and EHV HUD revenue of \$2,597,145. Administrative fee net income is calculated by subtracting administrative expenses from the total administrative fees earned by HUD. The \$5,155,271 in administrative fee net income includes CARES Act HUD funding recognized in FY21 of \$3,212,734. The remaining \$1,942,537 of admin net income is from HCV HUD Admin Fees. The new Emergency Housing Voucher program (EHV) has accrued \$2,597,145 in admin net income, which can only be used for the purposes of this program. The net HAP restricted fund balance at 9/30/21 is \$713,245. It is HUD's policy that the Housing Authority may use the restricted HAP reserves to pay for any excess HAP expenses over and above the amount of HAP subsidy received from HUD. In addition, there is \$3,765,330 in excess HUD funding that is ow ed to the Housing Authority by HUD and is currently being held by HUD in a program reserve. The total HAP HUD funds currently available for use is \$4,478,575 which is the total of the restricted fund balance and program reserve.
