# **Outreach Update**



December 2021:

- 30 recorded contacts
- 87 visits to locations throughout the City
- 20 contacts accepted services such as hygiene, emergency shelter, or case management
- 12 contacts through Tidelands and Weekend Outreach
- 57 requests for outreach



## Participant Engagement Outcomes

- 246 individuals accessed the MSC for the first time
- 417 individuals in active case management
- 47 individuals at Project Roomkey (on average)
- 108 individuals at Project Homekey(on average)
- 43 individuals at Winter/Cold Weather Shelter (on average)
- 66 individuals at Atlantic Bridge Housing Community (on average)
- 83 households stabilized in a motel



# **Operations Update**



## Staffing:

- Health Educator II: Katy Link (started 12/20)
- Community Program Technician II: Stephanie Sosa (Started 1/3)
- 11 positions currently in background check
- Currently in Interview stage: Health Educator II (Libraries), Homeless Services Program Officer, Outreach Assistant Coordinator, LBRA Coordinator (Programs)
- Currently in Recruitment: Public Health Nurse, Admin Analyst II, Counselor II



### **Shelter and PRK/PHK:**

During December shelters in Long Beach were consistently at capacity. With colder weather, rain and shelters on quarantine within the region, it has led to a situation where getting a bed on the day of can be challenging

Continued high utilization of motel vouchers to try to meet sheltering needs of those that are most vulnerable

30+ people that are on the PRK/PHK waiting list for as rooms open up. Prioritization from the list is based upon medical vulnerability. We have seen an availability of 2-3 rooms per week

Architect has been retained to start design and feasibility process for modular shelters at the MSC

\$5.1 million awarded by the state in PHK funding to convert the 1725 Long Beach Blvd. (Best Western) to permanent housing



## **Operations Update**

#### **Outreach and Community Engagement Capacity**

As the HSB is in the process of expanding outreach staffing as well as implementing mobile MSC operations we have begun ordering additional vehicles.

- 1 RV has been ordered for mobile MSC and 1 additional will be ordered in 2022
- 1 customized vehicle for REACH has been ordered (receive in 2022)
- 2 additional outreach vehicles, including a truck and passenger van (receive in early 2022)




## 2022 Long Beach Homeless Count

- The Volunteer Registration Link for the 2022 Long Beach Count is now live: <u>tinyurl.com/2022LBHomelessCount</u>
- Homeless Count will be conducted from the Grand Event Center
- We are looking for 250 Volunteers a waitlist will be available
- Other Identified Needs:
  - Recruitment of Volunteers
  - Donations small gift cards or funds to purchase gift cards
- Closely watching the Omicron numbers and may make adjustments based upon the numbers at the time of the count



## **Emergency Housing Vouchers**

- Over 500 people have been matched to vouchers at this point
- 205 vouchers issued to date, with 181 that are active and searching
- 24 lease ups as of 12/29/2021
- 26 people enrolled in ICMS services with 17 more planned next week





## **Pandemic Response Updates**

- We are seeing increased transmission across all populations including those experiencing homelessness
- Currently ABC is undergoing quarantine protocols. No new intakes until two rounds of testing with no additional positives. Earliest it would be off quarantine is January 10<sup>th</sup>
- Additional staff testing within our access center, as well as continued availability of rapid testing for participants that are exhibiting symptoms
- LA County continues to provide isolation and quarantine for those who have tested positive or are exhibiting symptoms of COVID
- Coordinating with LA County DHS to provide additional vaccine support to people experiencing homelessness including availability of boosters at both congregate and non-congregate sites



As of December 31, 2021, the Mayor's Fund to End Homelessness has a balance of \$124,121, with \$114,933 available after previous awards.

In December, the Mayor's Fund received \$1,680 in donations.

In December, the Mayor's Fund reimbursed His Little Feet and Long Beach Community Table for approved activities.
