#### **Mission Statement**

 Increase opportunities for the City's diverse workforce in alignment with business needs to strengthen the local economy, economic development opportunities, training, education, and public/private partnerships.

# **Objectives**

- 1. Increase year over year per capita income in the City
- 2. Upskill workers to meet the demand of middle and high skill jobs
- 3. Establish and expand City public/private partnerships for a comprehensive and inclusive childcare system
- Increase the number of jobs and placement opportunities in City identified growth sectors
- 5. Retain and attract workers through innovative solutions in housing, racial and gender equity

#### Recommendations

- 1. Promote and increase resources to assist small businesses in retaining and hiring employees
- 2. Convene business leaders for ongoing connections to education, workforce programs
- 3. Lead in identifying current and future needs of skilled workers thru publication of available LMI
- Be the City with a comprehensive childcare to hired pilot that moves to a national model
- 5. Be the City with a homeless to hired pilot that moves to a national model
- 6. Advance women impacted by the pandemic and reengage them in job opportunities, advancement, and entrepreneurial ventures



#### Recommendations

- 7. Lead and develop City services for remote workers and attract and advise businesses on the changing needs of the 'remote' workforce
- 8. Research new models that increase income opportunities for the flexible workforce
- 9. Provide entrepreneur training at all levels of education and for lifelong learning
- 10. Implement strategies to retain California State University, Long Beach and Long Beach City College graduates as residents and employees in the City
- 11. Utilize and develop new technologies to upskill workers and track advancement
- 12. Develop a campaign to encourage people to Live and Work in Long Beach

#### Recommendations

- 13. Connect workers to mentors and resources that create pathways to careers, trades, and leadership
- 14. Accelerate workforce diversity and inclusion through Community Benefit and Local Hire agreements
- 15. Explore policies that mitigate further urban displacement and establish a housing assistance fund for College Promise Students and low to moderate income working residents
