Adopt Resolution No. WD-1452 authorizing the General Manager to execute all necessary documents associated with the applications for the State of California Department of Water Resources Fiscal Year 2021 Urban and Multibenefit Drought Relief Program for four new well projects.

Executive Summary

The State of California Department of Water Resources (DWR) Fiscal Year 2021 Urban and Multibenefit Drought Relief Grant Program establishes a framework to provide interim and immediate drought relief to urban communities and for multibenefit projects. With Urban and Multibenefit Drought Relief grants, DWR provides funding on a competitive basis to implement projects that will address the impacts of drought on water supply; human health and safety; and fish and wildlife resources.

The Fiscal Year 2021 funding opportunity provides for awards at a minimum of \$2,000,000 with no match requirement. The funding opportunity was announced in October 2021 and applications were due on January 14, 2022. A resolution from the Board of Water Commissioners is required as part of the grant agreement and can be submitted after the application due date.

LBWD staff and LBWD's contracted grant consultant, Engineering Solutions Services, reviewed DWR's guidelines and proposal solicitation package and recommended that LBWD submit several grant applications for new well projects to maximize our groundwater supply. The table below outline the project name, estimated start and completion dates, and estimated cost.

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Recommendation

Fiscal Impact: If selected, a minimum of \$2,000,000 in state funds with no matching requirement will be available per application, per the agreement. Total cost for new wells and well rehabilitation projects is an estimated \$42,715,000 from FY 22 to FY 25. These figures are included in the FY 22 budget and financial projections through FY 25.
