


Facial Recognition Technology (FRT) is biased

- FRT standards of accuracy skew white and male
- Garbage In, Garbage Out: FRT in policing relies on police data and police use of tech which skews Black and Brown
- Result: increased misidentification and police use on Black and brown individuals

Tech & data from LACRIS is flawed

- DataWorks Plus built LACRIS and Detroit's FR platform, same algorithms
- Detroit police chief admitted that the FR platform is wrong in 96% of cases
- Detroit PD's use of FRT led to two wrongful arrests of Black men






LACRIS policy is harmful

- Booking personnel are not required to inform individuals of LACRIS
- Expungement is the arrestee's responsibility
- The LA County Sheriff's Department has a two-way data sharing agreement with ICE
- Note: other FRT companies used by LBPD in past have alarming practices e.g. Clearview AI



FRT paired with other LBPD surveillance tech expands criminalization

- FRT integration with police video surveillance digitalizes mass incarceration
- LBPD and LACRIS policy permits integration of FRT with other tech such as cameras, social media, drone, cell-site simulator, or ALPR vehicle surveillance



Automated License Plate Readers


- LBPD scanned over 44 million license plates from 2018 to 2019.
- Only 0.09% of those plates matched a car on a "hot list" which over-represent Black and Brown people
- No process for removal of personal data
- Allows invasive tracking of daily life
- LBPD shared data with ICE from February through November 2020 and may still share data with ICE partners including ICE HSI, CBP, and a DHS fusion center
