

Long Beach Gross Regional Product

2021 Gross Regional Product (\$ millions)



- Long Beach's Gross Regional Product is \$30.2 billion per year
- Manufacturing makes the largest contribution to Long Beach's GRP
 - But about \$4.2 billion of that is in Petroleum Refining
- Leisure & Hospitality accounts for
 - 4% of Long Beach GRP
 - 7% of Long Beach Employment






Long Beach Gross Regional Product excluding Oil






COVID Impacts on Employment in Long Beach



 Leisure & Hospitality employment has declined by 39%




Unemployment Rate (Jan 2020 – Dec 2021)

- **235,000** Long Beach residents participate in the labor force
 - Compared to 243,000 in January 2020
- 15,000 Long Beach working residents are unemployed
 - Compared to 12,000 unemployed in January 2020

Initial Unemployment Insurance Claims (Jan 2020 – Nov 2021)




 Initial unemployment insurance claims have fallen to about twice their pre-pandemic levels


