Authorize the General Manager to execute an agreement with Dudek, to provide construction management services for the Spinnaker Bay Drive Water Main Replacement Project – Phase 1 (MC-5199), in the amount not to exceed \$391,075.

Executive Summary

This project is for the installation of approximately 3,800 linear feet of polyvinyl chloride (PVC) pipe, including installation of valves and fittings, water service connections, fire hydrants, connections to existing water mains, surface restoration, and traffic control.

On April 5, 2022, staff solicited proposals to provide construction management services for the Spinnaker Bay Drive Water Main Replacement Project – Phase 1 (MC-5199). Five (5) proposals were received, evaluated, and analyzed. Staff recommends Dudek based on their experience on similar projects, project understanding, resource availability, and reasonableness of their fees. The not-to-exceed amount for their services is \$391,075 and the duration of the agreement is through project completion.

Recommendation

Authorize the General Manager to execute an agreement with Dudek to provide construction management services for the Spinnaker Bay Drive Water Main Replacement Project – Phase 1 (MC-5199), in the amount not to exceed \$391,075.

Fiscal Impact: The cost to the Water Fund will be incurred during FY 22 and FY 23 with the annual amounts unknown at this time, but the total amount will not exceed the contract total of \$391,075. These costs are included in the Water Fund FY 22 CIP budget and financial projections for FY 23.
