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#### MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING 36279

3 This Memorandum of Understanding ("Agreement") is made and entered into as of 4 June 01, 2022, for reference purposes only, pursuant to a minute order adopted by the 5 City Council of the City of Long Beach at its meeting on May 24, 2022, by and between 6 the CITY OF LONG BEACH, a municipal corporation ("City"), and THE LONG BEACH 7 YACHT CLUB, a California corporation, ("LBYC", and together with City, the "Parties", or 8 individually, a "Party").

#### RECITALS

WHEREAS, the Mission of Long Beach Yacht Club is to promote yachting and competitive sportsmanship on a world-class level. Since 1929, LBYC has grown not only in membership, but also in reputation in the vachting community. A large contributor to such growth is the LBYC's longstanding commitment to developing sailors and recreational boaters. LBYC's commitment to developing youth, or Junior Sailors, is evident by steadily increasing participation in its summer programs and regattas, and 16 local community outreach programs; and

17 WHEREAS, with permission of the City, LBYC has used City property at the 18 northwest end of Basin Four in Alamitos Bay Marina to operate its LBYC Junior Sailing 19 program; and

20 WHEREAS, LBYC's Junior Sailing program has grown to the point where 21 LBYC finds it necessary to improve its Junior Sailing facilities to make instruction and 22 participation more efficient, safe, and effective – by moving the majority of single-handed and double-handed boats to a floating dock located in front of the LBYC clubhouse, while 23 24 the higher performance program sailboats and coaching vessels will remain stored at the 25 dock and boat storage area at the northwest end of Basin Four. Adding Sabot storage to 26 the front of the club will enable LBYC to further centralize the Junior Sailing program and 27 related events. An existing paddle board rack can be improved and moved during the 28 process. After significant research, including input from the City, LBYC Board of

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Directors approved such a plan, along with required funding. Such plan is attached
 hereto as Attachment A; and

WHEREAS, the City is the proprietor and manager of Long Beach Marinas pursuant to rules and regulations set forth in the provisions of Section 16.08.970 of the Long Beach Municipal Code, which directs the City to implement, make specific, and otherwise carry out the policy of maintaining the Long Beach Marinas in a sanitary, sightly, and orderly condition and of preserving the public health, safety, peace, welfare, and convenience in the use thereof; and

WHEREAS, the berthing of vessels, installation of docks, and any other improvements set forth in this MOU are within the City's above-stated directive to "implement, make specific, and otherwise carry out the policy of maintaining the Long Beach Marinas in a sanitary, sightly, and orderly condition and of preserving the public health, safety, peace, welfare, and convenience in the use thereof."; and

WHEREAS, the purpose of this MOU is to set forth where and how LBYC will: install, use and maintain new floating dock located in front of LBYC clubhouse; improve and maintain current floating dock located at northwest end of Basin Four in Alamitos Bay Marina; add additional Sabot storage in front of LBYC clubhouse; and store floating dock when not in use.

#### AGREEMENT

20 NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual obligations of the 21 Parties to each other, the Parties agree as follows:

<u>LBYC's Responsibilities</u>. Floating Dock in Front of The Long Beach Yacht Club
6201 E. Appian Way Long Beach, CA 90803; 33.44.5 N, 118.07.18 W: In water dock
enhancement will consist solely of one (1) single row floating dock and one (1) multipurpose launch area (see Attachment B).

a. Single row/multipurpose floating dock will be temporary; deployed
from June 1 through Labor Day of each calendar year.

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b. During non-deployment period floating dock and components must

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1 be removed from the water and stored off site and inconspicuously. 2 C. Floating dock must fasten with cleats. 3 d. City to provide cleats on main dock as needed, LBYC bears all other 4 cost of installation and maintenance. 5 e. LBYC will provide fender material between floating dock and main 6 dock to protect both. 7 f. LBYC to provide ramping from main dock to floating dock. 8 Floating Dock Replacement at Basin 4 Long Dock . 2. In water dock 9 replacement will consist solely of one (1) single row floating dock (see Attachment C). 10 a. Floating dock shall be the same length as existing dock (60 ft.), with 11 one additional cube of dock to width per Attachment C. 12 b. Existing mounting bracket locations shall be used. Brackets shall be 13 replaced as necessary upon installation. 14 LBYC bears cost of installation and maintenance. C. 15 d. LBYC to provide ramping between main dock and floating dock. 16 <u>3.</u> Sabot Storage and Paddleboard Storage Racks on Floats. Must be built to 17 exact specifications as existing racks by Bellingham Marine or alternative contractor, as 18 approved by City. LBYC shall submit plans, designs and specifications for all materials 19 to be used prior to any initiation of project mobilization. 20 **Other General Responsibilities of LBYC:** 4. 21 a. LBYC shall be responsible for all purchase, installation, removal, and 22 storage of floating dock that is the subject of this MOU. 23 b. Any temporary structures remaining in place on Long Beach Marinas property after Labor Day of each calendar year will be removed, stored, and discarded by 24 25 Marine Bureau staff at the sole expense of LBYC. 26 C. LBYC to obtain City required insurance and provide proof to City 27 thereof prior to beginning any project contemplated under this MOU. 28 d. Dock enhancement and installation plans and design/specifications 3

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1 for all materials utilized shall be approved by City prior to project mobilization. Such 2 plans area attached hereto as Attachment D.

3 e. No other dock or area enhancements may be installed without prior 4 written approval from the City.

5 f. Community Benefit: Long Beach Yacht Club shall, each summer, 6 advertise and hold a public open house for Long Beach area youth aged 7 to 16. At this event, to be scheduled on a Saturday between June 1 and Labor Day of each year, 7 8 LBYC will open their youth sailing program to the public to promote sailing and introduce 9 attendees from the greater Long Beach area to watersports offered at LBYC.

#### **City's Responsibilities:** 10 5.

To permit the installation, deployment, use, maintenance and a. 12 dismantling/removal of the aforementioned floating docks in accordance with the terms above.

14 b. To install cleats on Marina property as needed for this project, 15 subject to approval of Marina supervisor.

Schedule. Installation schedule is provided hereto as Attachment D. <u>6.</u>

17 Term. This MOU shall be in full force and effect upon signature of all Parties 7. 18 following their respective authorization processes. The term of this MOU shall expire on 19 December 31, 2032, unless terminated as set forth in Section 8.

20 Termination. Either Party shall provide 90 days advanced written notice of 8. 21 termination of this MOU for any reason. LBYC shall be responsible for removal of any 22 and all floating docks contemplated by this MOU before the end of the aforementioned 23 termination period (within 90 days of notice of termination, or longer period if specified), and shall retain ownership after such termination. 24

25 **Indemnity**. LBYC shall defend, indemnify and hold harmless City from all claims, <u>9.</u> 26 demands, damages, causes of action, losses, liability, costs or expenses, including 27 reasonable attorney's fees, of any kind or nature whatsoever (collectively referred to in 28 this Section as "claims") which City may incur for injury to or death of persons or damage

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to or loss of property due to the alleged acts or omissions of LBYC, LBYC's employees,
 or agents, or any breach of this Agreement by LBYC.

3 <u>**10.**</u> Force Majeure. If either Party shall be delayed or prevented from the 4 performance of any act required hereunder by reason of acts of God, restrictive 5 governmental laws or regulations or other cause, without fault and beyond the 6 reasonable control of the Party obligated, performance of such-act shall be excused for 7 the period of the delay; and the period for the performance of any such act shall be 8 extended for a period equivalent to the period of such delay.

9 <u>11. Amendments</u>. This Agreement shall not be amended, nor any provision or
10 breach hereof waived, except in writing signed by the parties which expressly refers to
11 this Agreement.

**<u>12.</u>** <u>**Governing Law**</u>. This Agreement shall be governed by and construed pursuant to the laws of the State of California.

**14 <u>13.</u> <u>Entire Agreement</u>. This Agreement constitutes the entire understanding between
the Parties and supersedes all other agreements, oral or written, with respect to the
subject matter contained herein.** 

17 <u>14.</u> <u>Costs</u>. If there is any legal proceeding between the Parties to enforce or interpret
18 this Agreement or to protect or establish any rights or remedies hereunder, the prevailing
19 party shall be entitled to its costs and expenses, including reasonable attorneys' fees and
20 court costs.

21 In connection with performance of this Agreement and 15. Nondiscrimination. 22 subject to applicable rules and regulations, the Parties shall not discriminate against any 23 employee or applicant for employment because of race, religion, national origin, color, 24 age, gender, sexual orientation, AIDS, AIDS related condition, handicap, disability or 25 Vietnam Era veteran status. The Parties shall ensure that applicants are employed, and 26 that employees are treated during their employment, without regard to these bases. 27 Such actions shall include, but not be limited to, the following: Employment, upgrading, 28 demotion or transfer, recruitment or recruitment advertising, layoff or termination, rates of

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pay or other forms of compensation, and selection for training, including apprenticeship. 1 2 **Notices.** Any notice or approval required hereunder by any Party shall be in 16. 3 writing and personally delivered or deposited in the U.S. Postal Service, first class, 4 postage prepaid, addressed to each Party at the respective addresses stated below. 5 Notice of change of address shall be given in the same manner as stated herein for other 6 notices. Notice shall be deemed given three (3) business days after said writing is 7 deposited in the mail or on the date personal delivery is made, whichever first occurs. 8 City of Long Beach 411 W. This Agreement is intended by the Parties to benefit 21 themselves only and is not in any way intended or designed to or entered for the purpose 22 of creating any benefit or right for any person or entity of any kind that is not a Party to 23 this Agreement. 24 19. **Successors**. This Agreement shall inure to the benefit of, and be binding upon, 25 the Parties and their respective successors and permitted assignees. 26 20. **Counterparts.** This Agreement may be executed in several counterparts, and all

27 so executed shall constitute one agreement, binding on the Parties, notwithstanding that

28 all Parties are not signatory to the original or the same counterpart.

7 threatened lawsuit is not without merit.










### FLOATING DOCK DIMENSIONS

<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> pieces at 45 degrees will lock in place for one piece float




- 1. Temporary Can be used from June 1 through Labor Day and then must be removed.

- 4. Must have ramping from Main Dock to Floating Dock
- 5. Must take safety precautions with cleats after fastening (covers/paint color, etc.)


