At a minimum, the City Council should modify the Fee Ordinance to expressly include conservation activities (e.g., restoration and enhancement of publicly owned wetlands and uplands) as covered activities unless there is a legal reason for the omission of conservation/restoration activities. We urge the City Council direct Staff to re-evaluate scientific evidence to cover a larger area of impact and increased fee. We ask that the adoption of the Fee Ordinance be delayed.
