

RESOLUTION NO. RES-22-0191

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE
CITY OF LONG BEACH TO EXECUTE A CONTRACT, AND
ANY NECESSARY DOCUMENTS, INCLUDING ANY
NECESSARY SUBSEQUENT AMENDMENTS, WITH THE
UCLA CENTER FOR HEALTH POLICY RESERCH, OF LOS
ANGELES, CALIFORNIA TO CONDUCT THE CALIFORNIA
HEALTH INTERVIEW SURVEY CITY OF LONG BEACH
OVERSAMPLE PROJECT, IN A TOTAL AMOUNT NOT TO
EXCEED \$200,000, FOR A PERIOD OF TWO YEARS WITH
THE OPTION TO RENEW FOR THREE ADDITIONAL ONE-
YEAR PERIODS, AT THE DISCRETION OF THE CITY
MANAGER

WHEREAS, the City desires to enter into a contract with UCLA Center for
Health Policy Research ("UCLA CHPR") for delivery of the California Health Interview
Survey City of Long Beach Oversample Project ("CHIS") for the Department of Health and
Human Services Department ("Health Department"); and

WHEREAS, the City serves a diverse population and must understand the
specific needs of each community to create effective and culturally appropriate strategies
to address ongoing issues. Currently there is a lack of data for underrepresented
communities, including, but not limited to, the Cambodian and Filipino populations; and

WHEREAS, the Health Department continues to strive to improve data
collection and to achieve a greater understanding of each community; and

WHEREAS, CHIS is the largest state health survey in the nation. For nearly
20 years, the CHIS has provided representative data on all 58 counties in California along
with a detailed picture of the health and health care needs of California's large and diverse

1 populations. CHIS data have been trusted and used in several publications by local health
2 jurisdictions such as San Diego County and the Health Department. UCLA CHPR is the
3 only organization that can provide the kind of detailed data on underrepresented
4 communities that the Health Departments needs for CHIS.

5 WHEREAS, using UCLA CHPR for data collection is also necessary to merge
6 the data seamlessly and conduct an integrated weighting of the combined dataset, since
7 all of the confidential data that is needed to conduct weighting is restricted for use by only
8 the subcontractor that collected the data; and

9 WHEREAS, using a different contractor than the UCLA CHPR would
10 significantly impact the Health Department's ability to achieve its research objectives as
11 the data would be insufficient for the CHIS's purpose; and

12 WHEREAS, by contracting with the UCLA CHPR, the CHIS oversample
13 study will engage these underrepresented communities to collect data about their
14 experiences in health (e.g., diabetes) and society (e.g., gun violence); and

15 WHEREAS, as a result, no useful purpose would be served by advertising
16 for bids and to do so would constitute an idle and useless act and an unnecessary
17 expenditure of public funds;

18 NOW, THEREFORE, the City Council of the City of Long Beach resolves as
19 follows:

20 Section 1. The City Manager or designee is hereby authorized to enter
21 into a contract with UCLA Center for Health Policy Research of Los Angeles, California to
22 conduct the California Health Interview Survey of the City of Long Beach Oversample
23 Project, in a total amount not to exceed Two Hundred Thousand (\$200,000), for a period
24 of two years, with the option to renew for three additional one-year periods, at the discretion
25 of the City Manager.

26 Section 2. This resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption
27 by the City Council, and the City Clerk shall certify the vote adopting this resolution.
