# **Staffing Updates**

- Elizabeth Lee starts 2/6/23 Public Health Nurse
- Currently in background: 2 Counselor IIs, Health Educator II
- Currently in recruitment or interviewing: Public Health Nurse, Homeless Administrative Coordinator, HMIS Coordinator, Counselor II, Health Educator II, Administrative Analyst, Community Program Tech III
- Coming Soon: Mobile Therapist, Substance Abuse Counselor, Outreach Coordinator, Cal AIM administrative and service coordinator positions, General Maintenance Supervisor II, Mental Health Clinician for REACH
- The City is assessing ways in which to bring on additional staffing quickly whether through reassignments or utilization of temp staffing. Additionally, efforts are being made to speed up all areas of the hiring process for positions related to homelessness response



- Homeless Count was conducted on January 26th. There were nearly 300 people that participated in the Count across all of the roles. The specialized count was completed by Wednesday afternoon. All census tracks were completed.
- The City has received \$4 million in capital improvement funds from the state of California coming through Senator Lena Gonzalez's office. Funding will be used around facility upgrades at the MSC and ensuring that services can further be expanded.
- The Mobile Access Centers are operating 3 days a week in the downtown area. Tuesday 1 – 4 pm, Wednesday and Thursday 9 am – noon. MACs will be expanding to 5 days a week within the next several months



- The rapid rehousing and prevention RFP with Measure H and ESG funds, will be undergoing reviews to have recommendations for award within the next month
- The City will be announcing a 2<sup>nd</sup> winter shelter location within next week and will also be announcing additional details around additional safe parking as well as an RV waste disposal program
- The HSB has been meeting with agencies who have expressed interest in taking over the CoC supportive housing project – CH Healthy Homes



- Longitudinal Service Analysis (LSA) data was submitted to HUD earlier this month.
- Homeless Housing Assistance and Prevention (HHAP) program round 4 funding allocations have been announced:
  - LB CoC: \$4,381,317.74
  - LB Big City: \$8,807,125.51
  - Total: \$13,188,443.25



### **Emergency Housing Vouchers**

- Long Beach has been allocated 582 Emergency Housing Vouchers
- Additional supports and resources are being made to support with leasing up and fully utilizing all vouchers received
