On page 373 it says that it is the responsibility of government to the manage noise of government permitted events.

On page 374, in figure 2, it says that for multi-residential buildings: noise up to 70 decibels is conditionally acceptable noise up to 75 decibels is normally acceptable and noise over 75 decibels is clearly unacceptable.

Given that, under LBM 8.80.280, the city is regularly permitting music festivals to expose people in their homes to unhealthy levels of noise many times higher than 75 decibels for long periods of time, to be in compliance with California Guidelines, the draft Noise Element needs to have enforceable standards to protect people in their homes from city-permitted entertainment events.

Agenda Item: The draft Noise Element and the proposed Noise District map of October 2022

Subject: Excessive, amplified sounds from outdoor Music Festivals threatening our health and well-being in

our homes

**Dear Planning Commissioners:** 

We, the 111 undersigned, live in the many large multi-residential high-rise buildings facing the Rainbow Lagoon, the Marina Green, the Convention Center Parking Lot, Alamitos Beach and in adjacent areas along Ocean Blvd. These areas are *one acoustical area*.

These areas are venues for large, city-permitted outdoor music festivals. The music festivals <u>expose us in our homes to sounds up to 90 or more decibels, up to 12 hours a day, 3 days in a row, multiple times a month from late spring to early fall, as shown in the attached decibel readings in 2018 and 2019 before large gatherings were halted, and two of the events in 2022 after large gatherings were allowed again.</u>

As stated on page 34 of the October 2022 draft Noise Element, <u>prolonged noise exposure in excess of 75 dBA affects blood pressure and functions of the heart and the nervous system</u> and extended periods of noise exposure above 90 dBA would result in permanent cell damage. Additionally, CDC and OSHA say that too much exposure to excessive noise can lead to stress, anxiety, high blood pressure, gastrointestinal problems, chronic fatigue, and hearing problems.

We need a healthy noise environment in which to live our lives. Many of us work long hours during the week, on weekends, or work night shifts and cannot get the rest we need to maintain our physical and mental health when the prolonged, excessive amplified sounds invade our homes. Many of us are older people, less able to tolerate excessive noise than younger people, and are especially threatened when the excessive amplified sounds from these festivals invade our homes. Others of us work from home and cannot do business on the telephone when the amplified sounds invade our homes. When any of us are sick or bed-ridden, the prolonged, excessive amplified sounds invading our homes add to our suffering. The amplified bass sounds are especially disturbing to all of us.

Many of these high-rise buildings we live in were built before the passage of LBMC 8.80.280, the ordinance that allows the city to exempt occasional outdoor entertainment events from city noise ordinances. If we ask the police or health department for protection from the excessive noise, they say they can't do anything because the city permits it. This forces us to leave our homes if we can to protect ourselves or, if we can't leave, to suffer through the events.

The City classifies these events as "occasional". Each individual event is occasional in that—like cars on a freeway—it occurs no more than once a year. However, —like a freeway—the contiguous areas of Alamitos Beach, the Convention Center Parking Lot, the Marina Green, and the Rainbow Lagoon are *stationary* and the noise that the city permits on them is a frequent threat to our health and well-being.

The October 2022 draft of the Noise Element fails to provide effective policies with enforceable standards that will protect us in our homes from city-permitted frequent, prolonged, excessive amplified sounds from outdoor music festivals. Generalities such as "a balanced approach" do not provide concrete policies that protect us. Advanced notice of events does not protect us.

An example of an enforceable standard would be to state that people living near an outdoor entertainment venue are entitled to the same standard of protection in their homes from excessive noise originating from city-permitted entertainment as they are from excessive noise that is not permitted.

We <u>object to the October 2022 proposed Noise District map</u>. It does not acknowledge the existence of the many multi-residential high-rise buildings on Ocean Blvd. The residences from 388 East Ocean to 850 East Ocean which are adjacent to the Rainbow Lagoon, the Marina Green, the Convention Center Parking Lot, and Alamitos Beach and together <u>constitute the highest density residential area in Long Beach</u>. If this existing land use is ignored in city documents, our need for protection from city-permitted excessive outdoor noise invading our homes can also be ignored.

### We respectfully request that the Planning Commission:

- 1. Not approve any Noise Element draft until it includes effective policies with enforceable standards to protect us from city-permitted frequent, prolonged, excessive noise that is hazardous to our health and well-being.
- 2. Not approve any proposed Noise District map until it recognizes the existence of high-density, multi-residential buildings on Ocean Blvd.
- 3. Work with the Mayor and City Council to clarify, change, or amend LBMC 8.80.280 so that the noise from outdoor entertainment events—no matter the sound level at the stage—not threaten our health and well-being when it reaches our homes.

These steps would help bring the city into compliance with California Noise Law 46000 which says, "All Californians are entitled to a peaceful and quiet environment without the intrusion of noise which may be hazardous to their health or welfare".

Thank you in advance for working to protect us from prolonged, excessive, amplified city-permitted entertainment noise invading our homes and threatening our health and welfare.

### **Dear Planning Commissioners:**

As a reminder, below is a copy of a message sent to city officials on January 29 and copied to you from 107 people on Ocean Blvd asking for protection in their homes from excessive noise from the Cali Vibes concert.

As shown in the attachment, despite this request, people in several buildings were exposed in their homes 3 days in a row, up to 10 hours a day to excessive noise from the concert. People living in the International Towers at 700 East Ocean felt the building vibrating.

As in past concerts, multiple complaints to the city (and in this event to the Cali Vibes community relations person) during the concert had no effect in relieving residents. That is why we are requesting enforceable standards in the Noise Element to protect us in our homes.

Dear Mayor Richardson, City Council Members, City Manager Modica, Health and Human Services Director Colopy, Special Events Manager Day, and Community Relations Carroll:

We, the 107 undersigned Long Beach residents, are asking you to act to ensure that by the time the noise from the Cali Vibes Concert this February 17 - 19 reaches our homes in the condominiums and apartments in the high-rise buildings on Ocean Blvd that it will be within the city's existing noise limits.

The purpose of noise limits is to protect people's health. The Center for Disease Control and OSHA warn that **EXCESSIVE NOISE EFFECTS THE CARDIOVASCULAR, NERVOUS, AND DIGESTIVE SYSTEMS**. Long Beach's own draft Noise Element states **that prolonged exposure to noise in excess of 75 decibels affects blood pressure and functions of the heart and the nervous system**.

The noise from the Cali Vibes Concert last year was relentless. It went on up to 10 hours a day for 4 days. Many of us were forced to leave our homes to protect ourselves from the noise.

As can be seen in the upper right-hand corner of the attached decibel readings last year when the noise from the Cal Vibes Concert reached nearby homes, the noise averaged 88.3 decibels with the windows open, 79.6 decibels with double pane windows closed, and had a peak of 99.3 decibels whether the windows were open or closed.

On a decibel scale this means when the windows were closed, the average noise from the concert inside homes was 2 times louder than a vacuum cleaner with a peak <u>8 times louder than a vacuum cleaner</u>. Imagine trying to talk, watch T.V., or rest when a vacuum cleaner is running next to you, much less when the noise is 8 times louder than a vacuum cleaner.

Concert noise can be managed. It needs to be managed in real time (not just by an unmonitored telephone answering machine) to protect everyone, not just concert goers.

Be aware that decibel measurements taken at ground level where trees and other things mitigate sound do not reflect our experience in our homes. For many of us, especially those of us who live above the ground floor, the sound reaches our homes unmitigated.

Prolonged, excessive noise is harmful. <u>Please act to ensure that the noise from the Cali Vibes Concert this</u> <u>February is within the city's existing noise limits by the time it reaches our homes.</u>










