<sup>1</sup> The unrestricted admin fee operating reserve at 12/31/22 is \$27,276,060. There is net income for the current year in the amount of \$95,906, which is comprised of an increase in HCV HAP funding of \$815,407, administrative fee net income of \$1,184,241, EHV HUD loss of \$(2,024,608), and FSS For feltures of \$120,866. Administrative fee net income is calculated by subtracting administrative expenses from the total administrative feesearned by HUD. The new Emergency Housing Voucher program (EHV) has accrued \$558,515 in admin/ HAP fund balance, which can only be used for the purposes of this program. The new FSS For feltures program has accrued \$190,388 in restricted funds that can only be used to assist FSS participants. The net HCVHAP restricted fund balance at 12/31/22 is \$1,384,760. It is HUD's policy that the Housing Authority may use the restricted HAP reserves to pay for any excess HAP expenses over and above the amount of HAP subsidy received from HUD. In addition, there is \$(429,932) in decreased HUD HAP funding that is netted with the HAP RNP the Housing Authority maintains to arrive at the amount of funds available. The total HAP HUD funds currently available for use is \$994,828 which is the total of the restricted fund balance and program reserve. Additional HAP funds should be requested from HUD from the program reserve when there is a deficit in the HAP restricted fund balance.
