Nonprofits are required by law to limit our lobbying activities or we lose our tax-exempt status. When nonprofit organizations engage in advocacy we are doing so on behalf of the individuals we serve, most of whom are underrepresented. We are here to serve the public interest. I am in favor of transparency and the nonprofit sector has checks & balances in place to facilitate this. We report on our finances annually to the state and federal governments. These reports are public record. To require additional reporting beyond the reporting we already provide to government entities, donors and funders would place an undue burden on our staff, taking time away from activities that support our mission.
