Marine Bureau staff received complaints from the residences near Overlook Park that guests were allowing their dogs on the turf panel in the cluster of Palm Trees near their homes. Roberto took initiative and began removal of the turf/soil, identified a plant palette consisting of the following: Garlics, Agaves, Day Lilies, Dianella Tasmanicas, and a Hibiscus, amended the soil, planted the new plants, and modified the irrigation to a drip system to allow for better water conservation, integrating functional and cosmetic improvements to the turf panel with the refresh.
