- Linkage to mainstream programs
- Ensure that people who face barriers to housing due to systemic racism, sexual or gender discrimination, or family status have equitable outcomes

# Mission and Vision of the Long Beach CoC


## Mission Statement

## Vision Statement


- Every resident of Long Beach will be able to access safe, decent and affordable housing, food, and medical services.
