RECOMMENDATION:

Review and approve the 2023 Office of Climate Action and Sustainability Work Plan. (Citywide)

DISCUSSION

The Sustainable City Commission Ordinance (Ordinance) was adopted by a unanimous vote of the City Council on May 15, 2007. The Ordinance established the Sustainable City Commission (Commission), requiring that, "Each year the Commission shall prepare a work program outlining the focus for the Commission for review and approval by the City Council."

The attached 2023 Office of Climate Action and Sustainability Work Plan (Work Plan) was unanimously approved by the Commission on April 27, 2023, and in accordance with the Ordinance, is being submitted for City Council review and approval. The Work Plan includes multiple actions to be taken during the 2023 calendar year.

This year's Work Plan references the Office of Climate Action and Sustainability, as the Office of Sustainability has been incorporated in this new office approved by the City Council in the Fiscal Year 2023 budget. The Work Plan also incorporates actions from the Long Beach Climate Action Plan (LB CAP), as the Office of Climate Action and Sustainability's scope now includes implementation of the LB CAP. The vision of the LB CAP is to create a more sustainable, resilient, and equitable city by addressing climate change in a way that remedies existing environmental health disparities while also improving health, quality of life, and economic vitality throughout Long Beach. In addition to being consistent with the LB CAP, the Work Plan provides a holistic approach to sustainability and will be used to guide the Office of Climate Action and Sustainability in its work.

This matter was reviewed by Deputy City Attorney Erin Weesner-McKinley on May 22, 2023 and by Revenue Management Officer Geraldine Alejo on May 25, 2023.

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SUSTAINABILITY

The Work Plan is intended to guide the Commission and City staff in implementing the LB CAP, creating green projects, programs and policies, and making recommendations to the City Council over the next year.

TIMING CONSIDERATIONS

City Council action is requested on June 13, 2023, to enable the Commission to move forward with new business at their bimonthly meetings, with the next being held on June 22, 2023.

FISCAL IMPACT

This Work Plan includes items and actions intended to guide the Office of Climate Action and Sustainability. These items and actions are funded by a combination of funding streams including grant funding, AB 32 Cap and Trade funding to support projects aimed at reducing greenhouse gas emissions, Measure US oil production tax revenues, and an interdepartmental Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) for services. Sufficient budget to support the Work Plan is currently appropriated. This recommendation has no staffing impact beyond the normal budgeted scope of duties and is consistent with existing City Council priorities. There is no local job impact associated with this recommendation.

City Leadership and Funding

The City Council adopted the Long Beach Climate Action Plan (LB CAP) in August 2022, which includes climate action goals aimed at reducing greenhouse gas emissions and climate change adaptation goals that focus on the negative impact climate change has on infrastructure, services, and the well-being of the community. The following are the first steps to begin implementing LB CAP.

- Establish new Office of Climate Action and Sustainability
 - Fill new/existing vacancies and comprehensively merge team responsibilities to perform the work associated with LB CAP implementation
- Develop Interdepartmental LB CAP Governance Structure
 - Create citywide working groups responsible for and accountable to fulfill implementation actions in the LB CAP
- Update Commission By-Laws
 - Align Commission purpose and meeting content to support LB CAP implementation
- Target Grant Funding
 - Identify external funding opportunities to support LB CAP implementation
- Incorporate LB CAP in City Legislative Agenda
 - Develop and implement state and federal legislative agendas to help implement and develop LB CAP strategies
- Establish Staff Communications and Training
 - Establish and execute an internal citywide communications and training framework to increase awareness of and support for climate action and the LB CAP and the importance of cross-departmental collaboration to achieve successful implementation

o Explore support for expanding air quality monitoring

 Continue parkway tree plantings upon request and fruit tree plantings in front yards under the CAL FIRE Urban Forestry grant.

Willow Springs Park Support and Native Plant Nursery

 Support park activation and maintenance with community programs and continue to develop the Native Plant Nursery, support local pollinator populations, develop public art opportunities, and provide Native Plant workshops.

Watershed and Urban Forestry Initiatives
