


Annual Festival of Flight to Honor Long Beach Aviation History This Saturday





Experience a dose of Long Beach aviation history this Saturday, November 4 when thousands of attendees are expected to enjoy the annual Festival of Flight at Long Beach Airport (LGB) between 10:00AM and 4:00PM.









"Long Beach Airport's Festival of Flight is a wonderful way to show the community how important aviation has been to our City's history," Mayor Robert Garcia said in a statement. "It is a great opportunity for the public to learn about what a significant role our airport plays in the region's economy, and a fun event for the whole family, so I encourage everyone to join me there."

Highlights of the festival will include an opening ceremony by the California State Military Reserve from Joint Forces Training Base Los Alamitos color guard, the Condor Squadron of WWII-era warbirds conducting a formation flyover during the opening of the festival and static displays featuring a C-17 from March Air Force Base, Virgin Orbit's "Cosmic Girl" 747 (/business/2000011267-virgin-orbit-s-cosmic-girl-satellite-air-launch-platform-touches-down-in-long-beach) and a Gulfstream G650 jet, as well as live music, according to the release.





Two Firms Return Long Beach Airport **RFP**

Ross Aviation and Gulfstream Aerospace Corp. responded by a Nov. 1 deadline to a Long Beach Airport request for proposals on the development of 31 acres near the facility.

Denver-based Ross bought the AirFlite fixed-base operations at the airport last November. AirFlite was a unit of Toyota Motor Sales, which sold the FBO as part of moving its North American headquarters from Torrance to Texas, a process it completed this year.

A fixed-base operator provides fuel, hangar space, and aircraft parking, rental and maintenance, among other services, to owners of small planes and general aviation charter carriers.

Ross' Long Beach operations have about 130,000 square feet of hangar space, and a four-story terminal with lounges for pilots, crews, clients, conference rooms and passenger areas.

Principal Jeff Ross is also a managing partner of CapEx LP, a \$60 million debt and equity fund in Denver.

Savannah-Ga.-based Gulfstream is part of West Falls Church, based-General Dynamics, a defense contractor with about \$31 billion in revenue and \$3 billion in net income.

Gulfstream designs, builds, sells and services business jets; its Long Beach facilities include 325,000 square feet of aircraft completion and service area, maintenance facilities, offices, and work space. It has about 850 employees there, and 13,000 companywide.


The city of Long Beach, which owns the airport, said a response by only a few bidders was somewhat expected because of the restrictions on the project, which is devoted to aeronautical uses without generic real estate components.

Long Beach Airport To Take Off With Flight Festival

They're taking off at the Long Beach Airport this Saturday with the fourth annual Festival of Flight.

The free, public event runs from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. Saturday, Nov. 4, at 4100 Donald Douglas Dr. Features include food trucks, static aircraft and vehicle displays, Roxanne's Lounge on Wheels' beer garden, and entertainment.

Airport tenants, pilot shops, fixed-based operators and flying schools also will be on hand.



"We're hoping for a great party... Last year, we had more than 5,000 people and this year we're expecting more," airport spokeswoman Stephanie Montuya-Morisky said. "It's a great time to get the family and your kids out there... It's a great family day."

She added bands, including MOVE, Scotty Mac Band and others, will perform live. About 30 airplanes and five food trucks also will be available, she said. Airplanes include a C-17, 747 and a Gulfstream. Additionally, military reservists will conduct a drill with a C-130, she said.

Although it's a special event, Montuya-Morisky said security will be very strict and people shouldn't bring their own alcohol, coolers or pets, unless they are service animals. Random searches also will be conducted, she said.

Attendees can enter from the west end at East Wardlow Road and Globemaster Way. Free parking is available.

Free Holiday Express Shuttle Between Long Beach Airport and Blue Line to Launch Saturday

Long Beach Transit (LBT) and the City of Long Beach announced this week the start of a pilot program to provide free transportation between the Long Beach Airport (LGB) and the Metro Blue Line via an LBT-operated express bus shuttle called the Blue Line 2 Airline.

"We are committed to moving Long Beach forward and since joining the Board of Directors of L.A. Metro, we have been exploring new strategies for connecting our transportation infrastructures," Mayor Robert Garcia said in a statement. "This direct LBT bus connection between the Blue Line and the airport is another step forward in providing transportation alternatives."

The shuttle will connect the Metro Blue Line Wardlow Station with LGB's historic terminal starting Saturday, offering direct airport service every half hour from 5:45AM to 8:15PM daily through Sunday, January 7.

"A direct LBT bus connection between the Blue Line and the airport will speed travel times, reduce congestion and enhance our customer experience," LBT Chief Executive Officer Kenneth McDonald stated. "Launching the Blue Line 2 Airline service during the busy holiday travel season will help reduce the number of car trips taken in and around the airport."

LGB is a city-owned facility that handles nearly 3.5 million commercial airline passengers a year, according to the release.

"Long Beach Airport provides easy access to 15 nonstop destinations in the United States," Long Beach Airport Director Jess L. Romo said in a statement. "The Blue Line 2 Airline shuttle service is an alternative ground transportation choice for local passengers traveling to and from the airport and creates more connection to the rest of the network."



The Wardlow Station can be reached by taking the Blue Line light-rail line from Downtown Long Beach or Downtown Los Angeles. The Blue Line 2 Airline shuttle is made possible through a subsidy from the City of Long Beach to LBT for transit operations.

Long Beach will offer free shuttle service between the Long Beach Airport and the Wardlow Blue Line Station over the holiday season, officials announced on Wednesday.

The pilot program begins on Saturday and will last through Jan. 7, with daily rides running every 30 minutes between the hours of 5:45 a.m. and 8:15 p.m. The Blue Line 2 Airline shuttle is being funded through subsidy from the city of Long Beach to Long Beach Transit for operational needs

In a statement released Wednesday, Mayor Robert Garcia said the city has been exploring transportation options since he joined the Board of Directors for Los Angeles County Metro, which manages the county's public transportation network, including bus routes and light rail lines.

Free shuttle service to LGB offered during holiday season

provide a free direct shuttle between LGB and the Metro Blue Line's Wardlow Station. At a press conference Wednesday morning at the train stop, officials said they foresee the so-called "Blue Line 2 Airline" service alleviating traffic congestion in the area during the busy shopping and travel season.

"Residents or visitors will be able to come right here to the Wardlow station– the Blue Line station– and take a free shuttle every 30 minutes from here to the Long Beach Airport," said Long Beach Mayor Robert Garcia. "This is a service that we haven't had in the past or hasn't been a direct connection like this one from the Blue Line to the airport, and so we're really excited about this."

Seventh District Councilmember Roberto Uranga, who was also present at the event, said the Wardlow station sits right in the middle of his district and that the airport is positioned at one of its borders.

"So, this is a great opportunity for the 7th-district residents and the businesses that are here to take advantage of an opportunity that is going to be good for them when they want to travel out of town or when they're coming into town [...]," Uranga said. "One of the proudest moments that I have is actually being here to launch this program."

The shuttle will stop at the Wardlow station on Pacific Place and at LGB on the outer curb in front of the main terminal. It will operate from Saturday, Nov. 18 until Sunday, Jan. 7, from 5am to 8pm. It will depart Wardlow station at 20 and 50 minutes past the hour and will depart the airport at 15 and 45 minutes past the hour.

City Leaders Celebrate Renovations to Airport Parking Structure Meant to Improve Traffic Flow

Long Beach city officials gathered at Long Beach Airport Wednesday morning to celebrate the renovations made to a parking structure meant to improve pedestrian and vehicle traffic flow.

"This project is a part of a larger vision of ensuring that the Long Beach Airport remains a world-class airport for ease and efficiency for residents and visitors alike," said Mayor Robert Garcia in a statement.

Parking Structure A had been closed since January 7 to allow for the months-long improvements that took place. The structure is located near the Historic Terminal.



The upgrades include a new dual-cab elevator tower with glass windows overlooking the Historic Terminal and LGB airfield, a new outdoor metal stairwell, a new dual-lane passenger vehicle exit, implementation of airport wayfinding signs, interior and exterior painting and landscaping to the surrounding area, energy efficient LED lighting, restriping and 80 Clean Air Vehicle parking spaces as required by state law.

More than 1,000 parking spaces will be provided in the parking structure.

The total cost of construction was \$5 million.



Self-parking is available in Parking Structures A and B at \$2 per hour, with a maximum \$19 per day in Parking Structure A and \$17 in Parking Structure B. For general parking information contact AMB Parking Services at (562) 377-6116.

With the busy holiday travel season underway, Long Beach has reopened one of its main parking garages after months of renovations.

The approximately \$5 million improvements to Parking Structure A include the addition of 1,000 new spaces and a streamlined pedestrian and vehicular traffic flow, as well as a new dual-cab elevator, an outdoor stairwell, a new dual-lane passenger vehicle exit, among other fixes.

"This project is a part of a larger vision of ensuring that the Long Beach Airport remains a world-class airport for ease and efficiency for residents and visitors alike," Mayor Robert Garcia in a statement released Wednesday.

Officials estimate 50,000 travelers will make their way through the local airport this holiday weekend.

The airport's twitter account shared a few images from a ribbon cutting ceremony on the rooftop Wednesday morning that included a red carpet ensconced by bright yellow and green balloon palm trees and a special appearance by "Tom the turkey," who was purportedly offering travel tips in time for the Thanksgiving holiday.

The reopening follows an announcement last week about free shuttle service between the Wardlow Blue Line Station and Long Beach Airport through Jan.7.

The pilot program began on Saturday, with daily rides running every 30 minutes between the hours of 5:45 a.m. and 8:15 p.m. The Blue Line 2 Airline shuttle is being funded through subsidy from the city of Long Beach to Long Beach Transit for operational needs.

A free, nonstop shuttle ride to the Long Beach Airport is possible this holiday season.

That's because Long Beach Transit (LBT) and city officials announced Wednesday, Nov. 15, a pilot program started Saturday, Nov. 18, running from the Metro Blue Line Wardlow Station to the airport. The service continues through Sunday, Jan. 7.



Called the Blue Line 2 Airline, two shuttles will run between the station and the airport. They will depart every 30 minutes at 15 and 45 minutes past the hour, beginning at 5:45 a.m. and ending at 8:15 p.m. daily. The airport stop is in front of the main terminal's outer curb.

"This is a great opportunity for residents and businesses when they need to travel in and out of town... One of my proudest moments is to be here for this," Seventh District Councilman Roberto Uranga said at Wednesday's press conference. "Holiday travel is right around the corner. I really hope people take advantage of this service."

Uranga said the new service is offered in his district, as Wardlow Station is at 3420 N. Pacific Place. The station is accessible by taking the Blue Line light rail line from downtown Long Beach or downtown Los Angeles.

The city subsidized LBT for transit operations with L.A. County Proposition A money, part of which is for the new service, and is not part of the city's fiscal year 2018 budget, transit public information officer Paul Gonzales said.

"We are committed to moving Long Beach forward and since joining the Board of Directors of L.A. Metro, we have been exploring new strategies for connecting our transportation infrastructures," Mayor Robert Garcia said in a release. "This direct LBT bus connection between the Blue Line and the airport is another step forward in providing transportation alternatives."

Garcia said more than \$1 million has been invested recently into Blue Line upgrades. Security also has improved, Garcia said.

"Ridership is slowly beginning to increase," Garcia said.

The Blue Line and airport connection is expected to speed travel times, reduce congestion and enhance customers' experiences, according to LBT chief executive officer Kenneth McDonald.

LBT has 26 million annual riders in Long Beach, Lakewood and Signal Hill, as well as portions of other neighboring cities, according to a release.

Long Beach Airport has almost 3.5 million commercial airline passengers annually, according to a release.

"Long Beach Airport provides easy access to 15 nonstop destinations in the United States," airport director Jess L. Romo said in a release. "The Blue Line 2 Airline shuttle service is an alternative ground transportation choice for local passengers traveling to and from the airport and creates more connection to the rest of the network."

Long Beach Airport (LGB) hosted a ribbon-cutting ceremony on Wednesday, Nov. 22 to celebrate completed renovations to Parking Structure A. The improvements to the parking structure are intended to provide flexibility for those traveling during the holiday season.

"This project is a part of a larger vision of ensuring that the Long Beach Airport remains a world-class airport for ease and efficiency for residents and visitors alike," said Long Beach Mayor Robert Garcia. Parking Structure A closed Jan. 7 in preparation for the renovations. The improvements to the structure seek to improve pedestrian and vehicular traffic flow. They consist of:

- New dual-cab elevator tower with glass windows overlooking the Historic Terminal and LGB airfield.
- New outdoor metal stairwell adjacent to the elevator tower.
- New dual-lane passenger vehicle exit.
- Implementation of airport wayfinding sign programs.
- Significant aesthetic improvements, including interior and exterior painting and landscaping areas surrounding the structure.
- The replacement of over 240 high-pressured sodium (HPS) fixtures with new energy efficient LED lighting.
- Restriping throughout the parking structure.
- The addition of 80 clean-air vehicle parking spaces, as required per California Green Building Standards Code.

"Long Beach is beaming with pride today," said Stacy Mungo, 5th district councilmember. "The improvements to the parking structure not only offer accessibility and safety for travelers, but truly complement our award-winning facility."

The parking structure provides more than 1,000 parking spaces within walking distance of the terminal. The parking structure renovation project was awarded to R.J. Daum Construction Company. The total cost of construction was \$5 million.

"Long Beach Airport strives to provide a first-class experience for all," said LGB Director Jess Romo. "The renovations to Parking Structure A will enhance the travel experience by providing greater accessibility just steps away from the terminal."

Self-parking is available in Parking Structures A and B at the rate of \$2 per hour, with a maximum of \$19 per day in Parking Structure A and \$17 in Parking Structure B. For general parking information, contact ABM Parking Services at (562) 377-6116.

Long Beach Airport Traffic Up Sharply in October

Passenger traffic at Long Beach Airport was up 25 percent in October from the same month last year, according to airport officials.

Nearly 165,000 passengers boarded airplanes at the airport - a 25 percent jump – and was led by a 32,000 increase in passenger count, or 33 percent, in boardings for JetBlue Airways.

Passenger boardings are also up for the first 10 months of this year, with 1.56 million travelers providing a 35 percent increase from the same 10-month period last year. That total has also surpassed the total for all of 2016 of 1.43 million passengers.

The increases are the result of decisions the city of Long Beach made last year to allow nine more daily flights from the airport, bringing the total to 50. Southwest Airlines received four of those daily flights, JetBlue three and Delta Airlines two. The airlines immediately put those new flight allotments to use.

JetBlue posted the biggest numerical increase in passengers of 315,000 (up 34 percent), followed by Southwest Airlines, which was up 105,000, or 150 percent. In addition to Southwest being granted more slots by airport officials, the airline in March acquired two flight slots from American Airlines.

Air cargo traffic was also up in October - 8 percent - over the year. For the first 10 months of 2017, air cargo tonnage dropped 7 percent.



- Have a friend or family member drop you off right in front of the terminal. Drivers picking up passengers are encouraged to use the free Cell Phone Waiting Lot, located at 3402 N. Lakewood Boulevard.
- Rideshare at LGB. Lyft, Opoli, See Jane Go and Uber can pick up and drop off passengers at the median curb in front of the Historic Terminal.
- Valet parking is available for \$24 per day just north of the terminal and includes a free car wash.
- · Long Beach Yellow Cab offers taxi service at the taxi stand located just outside the terminal.
- The Airport Ground Transportation Center, directly across from the terminal building, offers easy access to Avis, Budget, Enterprise, Hertz, and National/Alamo car rental services.
- Long Beach Transit has a convenient stop at the airport on Barbara London Drive. Long Beach Transit Bus Routes 102, 104, and 111 serve LGB.
- A variety of shuttles, vans, and limousine options are also available on site.

Holiday Travel Tips

- Arrive at the airport at least two hours prior to departure to ensure adequate time to pass through security, and enjoy awardwinning dining options in the concourse.
- Verify flight schedules and baggage rules with airlines ahead of time. Click here (https://www.tsa.gov/travel/security-screening/whatcanibring) to determine what you can bring in your carry-on and checked baggage before arriving at the airport.
- · Use the center median in front of the terminal to access ridesharing services such as Lyft, Opoli, See Jane Go, and Uber.
- Adult passengers 18 and over must show valid identification at the airport checkpoint to travel.

Long Beach Airport (KLGB) General Aviation Runway Will Close For Repairs

Runway 25L at the Long Beach Airport will be closed starting Jan. 8 for major reconstruction, expected to take six months.

General aviation (private) aircraft will land and takeoff at Runway 25R, the secondary runway, and occasionally on the main runway, 12-30.

Runway 25L should reopen by the end of July 2018, airport officials said. When it is usable again, 25R will close for a month to install blast pads, used to stabilize the ground from jet blasts.






